FOUNTAIN HILL SAILOR IS REPORTED INJURED

**Seaman Edward Boehm Return-
ed to United States—In Ports-
mouth, Va., Hospital.**

Seaman Second Class Edward Boehm, U. S. Navy, was injured in line of duty, according to word received here from him by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Oliver Boehm, 1249 Russell Avenue, Fountain Hill. He has been returned to the United States and is now receiving treatment in the U. S. Naval Hospital at Portsmouth, Va.

The manner of injury is not stated but he informed his parents that he was injured about the forehead and body. His parents left for Portsmouth immediately upon receipt of the letter.

Another son of Mr. and Mrs. Boehm, Private First Class James Boehm, U. S. Army, Infantry, has been in service for the past 18 months, is believed to be in Northern Africa, though no word has been received from him. When last heard from eight weeks ago, he was in England.

Edward was graduated from Fountain Hill High School, class of 1941. He was a member of the basketball team and editor of the year-book "Memoirs."

He enlisted in the navy six months ago and received his training at Norfolk, Va., previous to the foreign trip. An earlier letter received from him told of his arriving in North Africa and being engaged for eight days in unloading men and equipment.

Both brothers are members of the Fountain Hill Squadron, No. 406, Sons of Legion, attached to Fountain Hill Post No. 406.
