One of the famous "Flying Tigers," who fought so gallantly against unbelievable odds, will be back in the home of his parents at Moorestown ere night come, provided his transcontinental schedule holds.

He is Billy Weiner, one of the bombardiers who pummeled the Japs in the skies above the Burma Road, son of Mr. and Mrs. Ray Weiner, proprietors of the Moorestown Hotel. Billy, former cheerleader at Liberty High School, wired his parents from the Pacific Coast Wednesday of his arrival in this country and he telephoned to them Thursday from Utah.

Every time the phone Mr. and Mrs. Weiner thought it was their son calling from Harrisburg, the next place from which he had promised to call them.

Billy has been away for thirteen months and there is a royal welcome awaiting him. He expects to be stationed in the United States for sometime, serving as an instructor.
