Chas. Korpics Succumbs to War Wounds

Pfc. Charles Korpics, son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Korpics, 508 Cherokee Street, died from wounds received in action in Germany, according to a War Department telegram received by his parents today.

Pfc. Korpics received the Purple Heart for wounds received in France June 6. He was again reported as being seriously wounded in a telegram received by his parents October 29.

The young soldier was inducted November 16, 1943, received his training at Camp Bland, Fla., and Fort Meade, Md., before shipping overseas in May, 1944. He was employed by the Bethlehem Steel Company prior to his induction and had attended Holy Ghost School. Three brothers serving overseas survive him.
