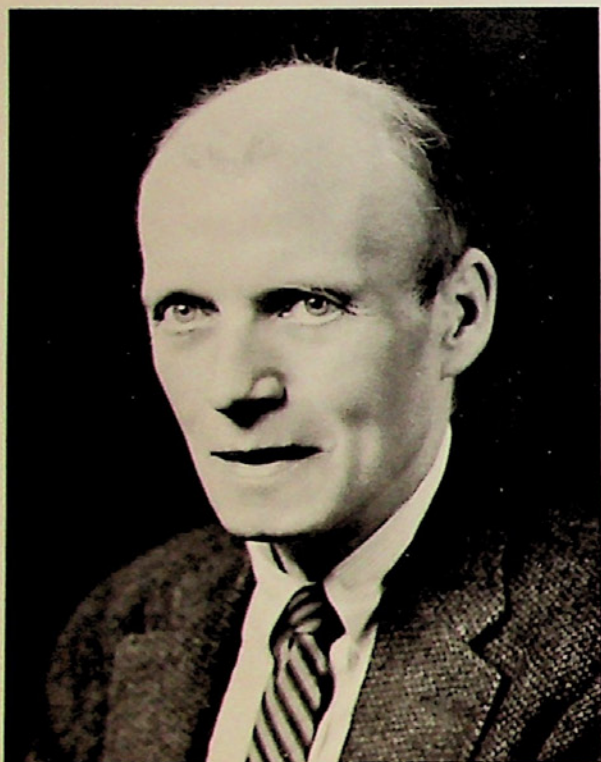


MISS MARY CROW

Student Association is the only organization at Liberty to which the entire student body belongs; two groups advised by Mr. Harvey Cope co-ordinate its activities. The first group is the Executive Cabinet, consisting of the Student Association officers and the individual class presidents. The other branch is the Student Council whose members represent each homeroom and are responsible for issuing club charters, studying school problems, and passing resolutions.

This year senior privileges was one of the main topics of discussion. After many debates and drawbacks, two proposals were accepted. One allowed seniors who qualify with a 3.5 average to attend the honor study hall during their free periods; the other permitted them to use the general library without the previously required permission slips.

Officers of the Student Association exchanged visits with those of William Allen and Easton in an attempt to promote better relationships among schools.

Highlighting the year was the P.S.P.A. Conference in Bethlehem held under the auspices of *Liberty Life*. At the convention banquet the famous cartoonist, Al Capp, creator of "Li'l Abner," gave a few hints on the development of comic strip characters.

Fund-raising drives were major activities of this self-supporting organization. To augment their finances, the staff held dances, sold mums for the Turkey Day Game and sponsored "Varieties of '63." With the proceeds from this presentation, several members were able to attend press conferences at Columbia University in New York, and Temple University in Philadelphia.

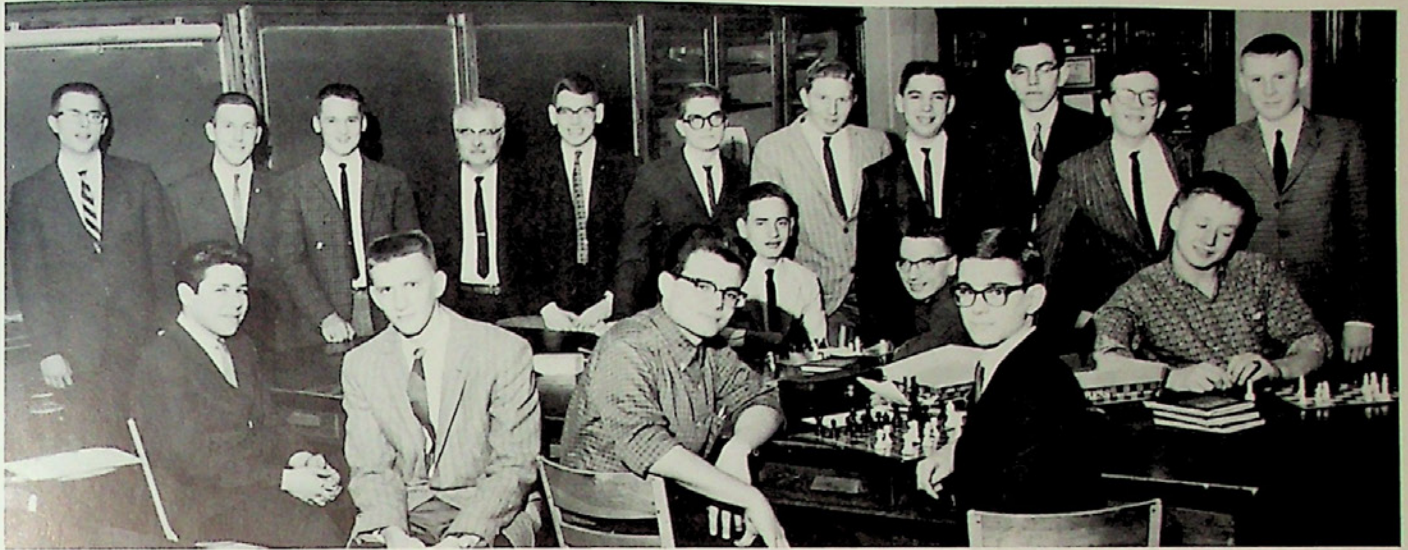
volumes, and helped with book circulation.

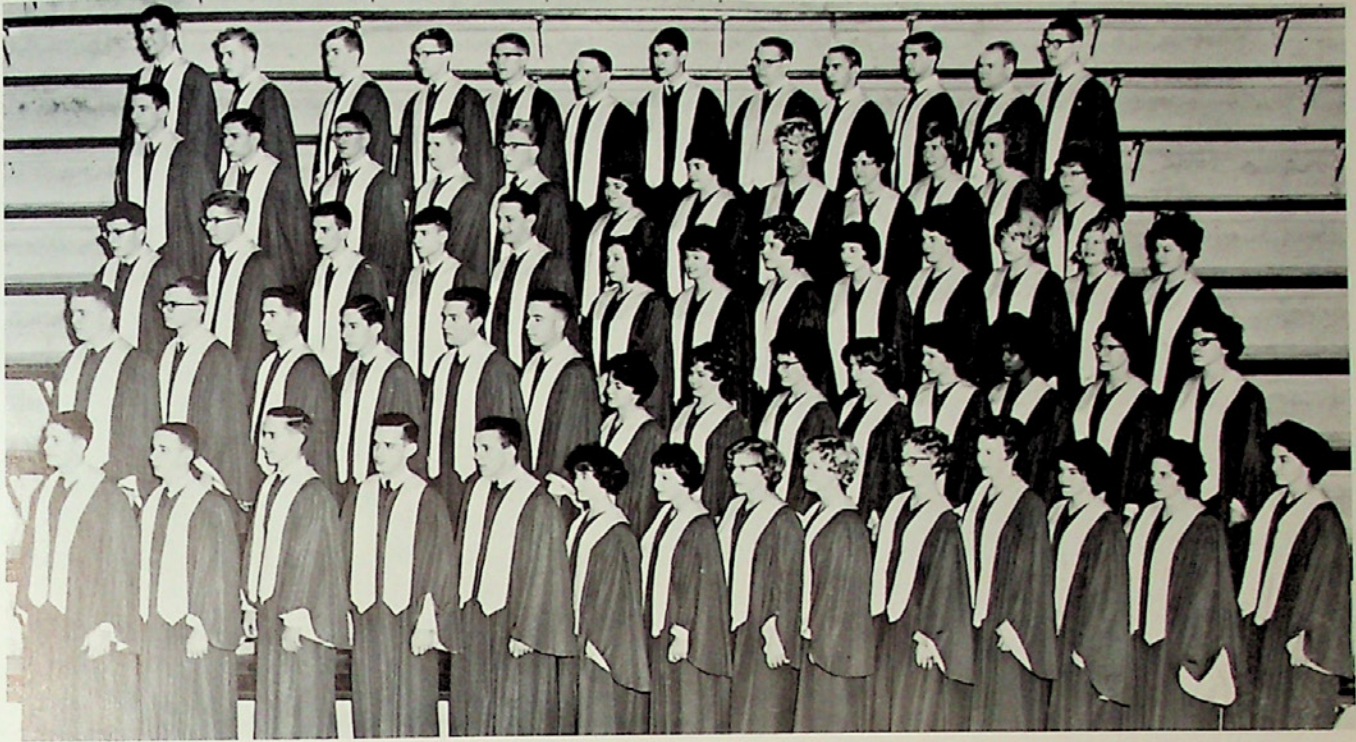

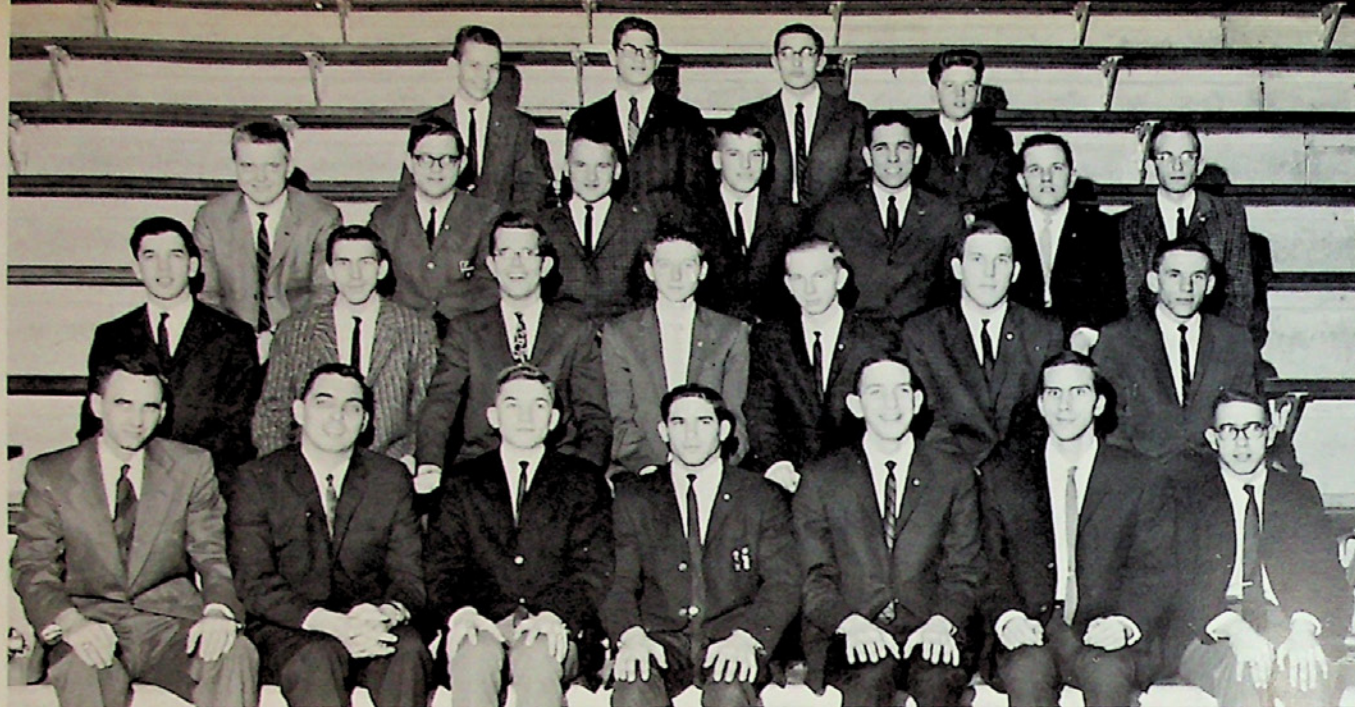

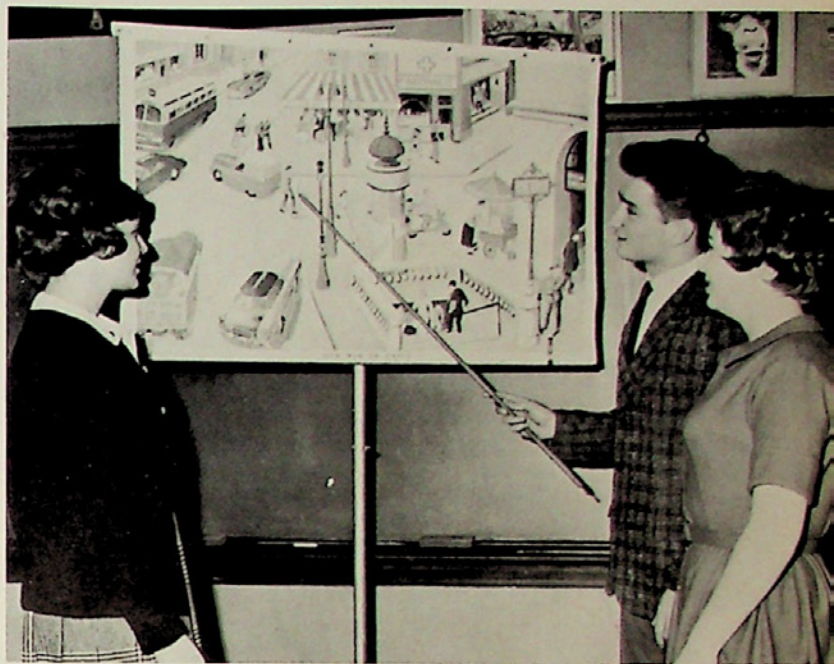


# FRENCH CLUB

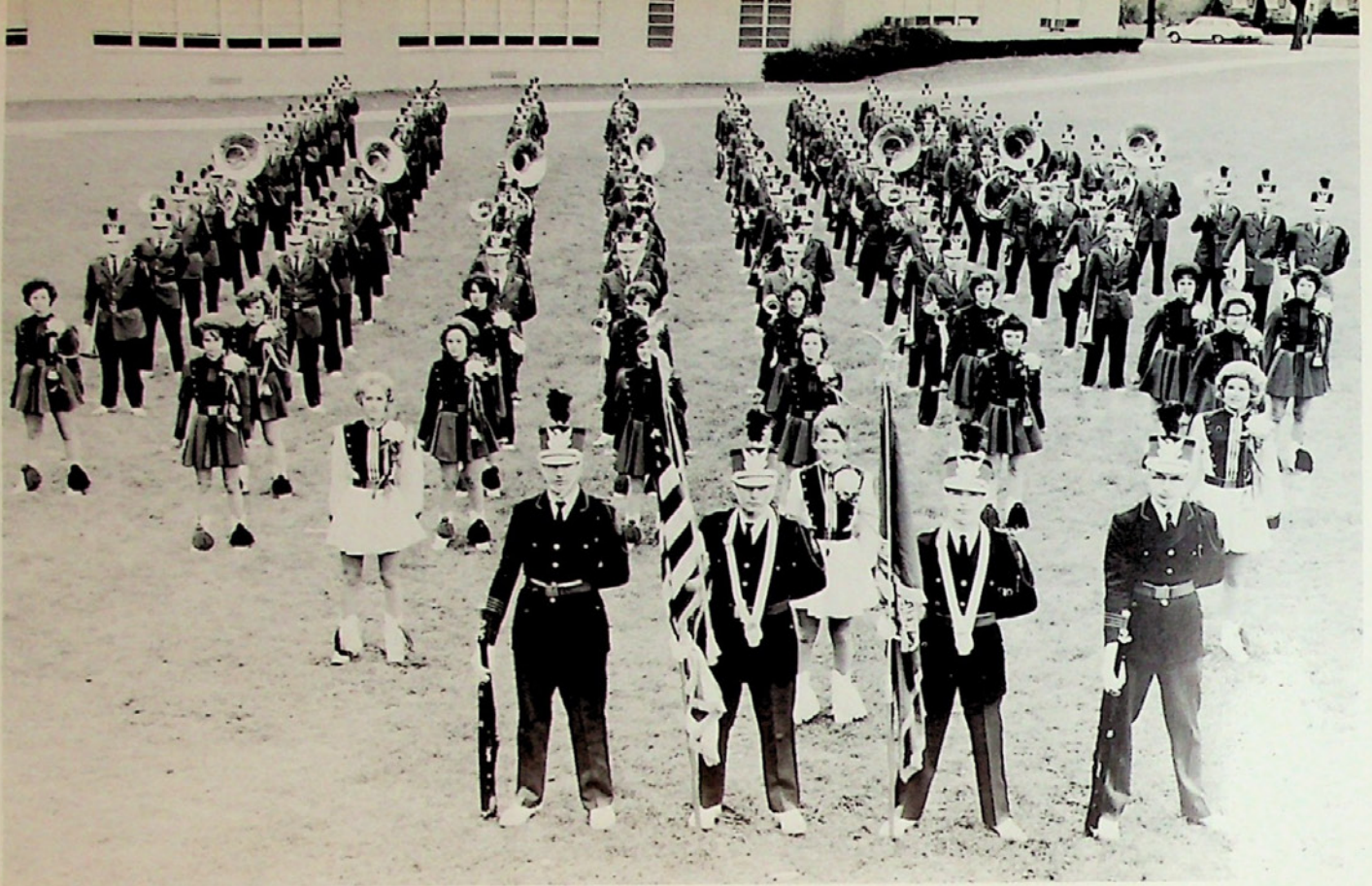

## DEBATING CLUB

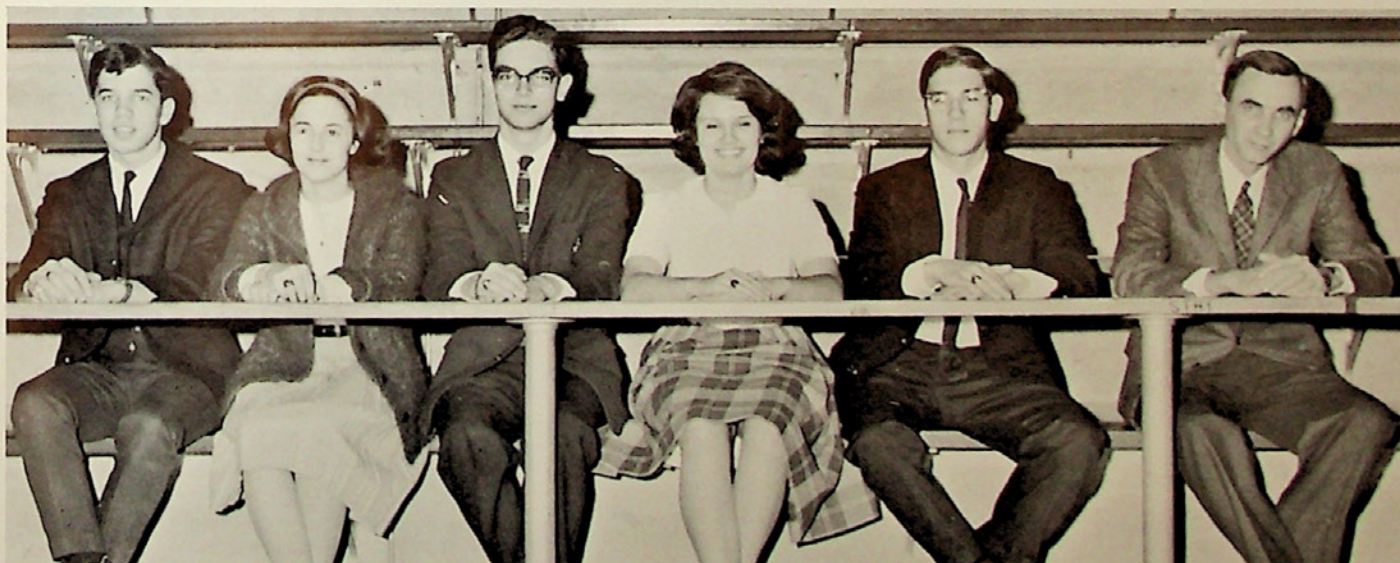

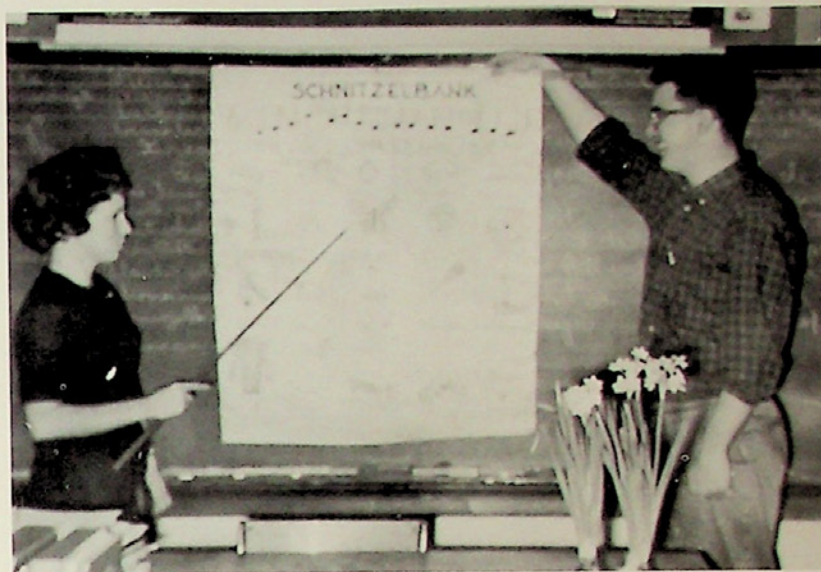

Making a fine showing in the earlier part of the year, the team won four of the first five games. Three

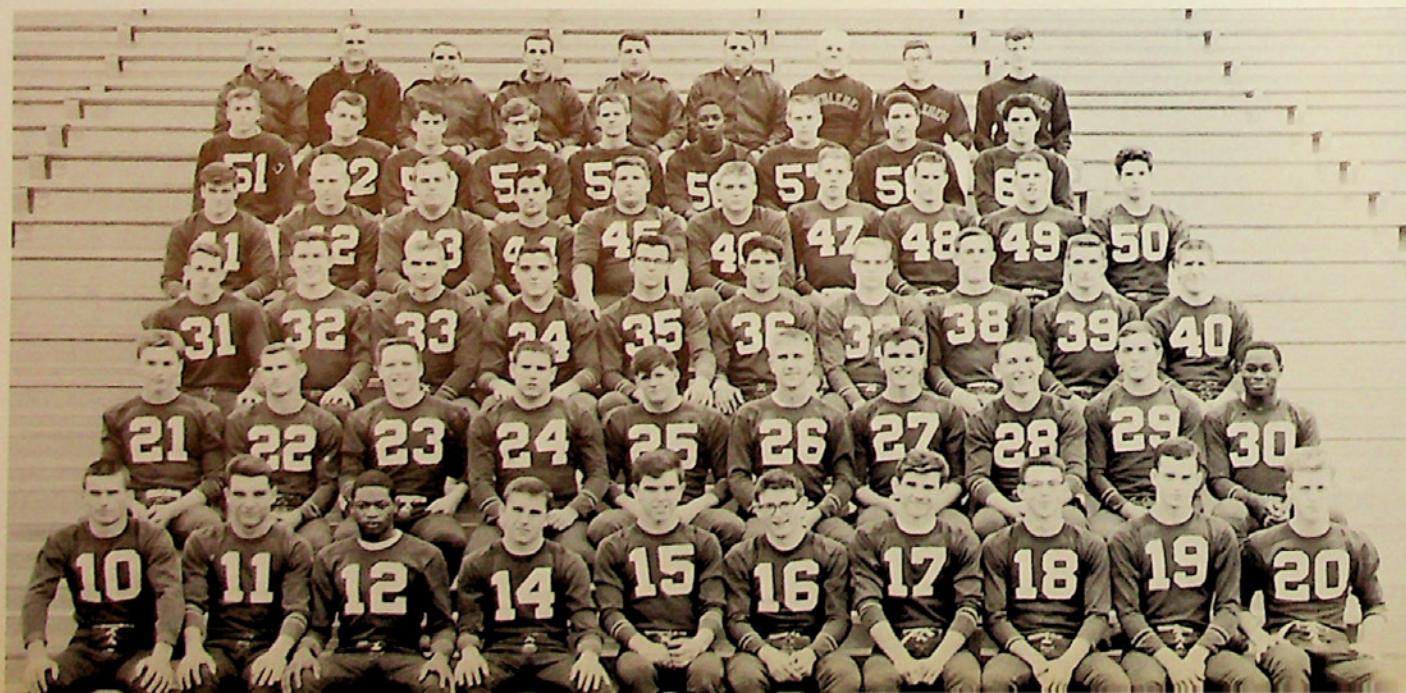
of these victories were shut-outs, with the defensive unit displaying its strength.

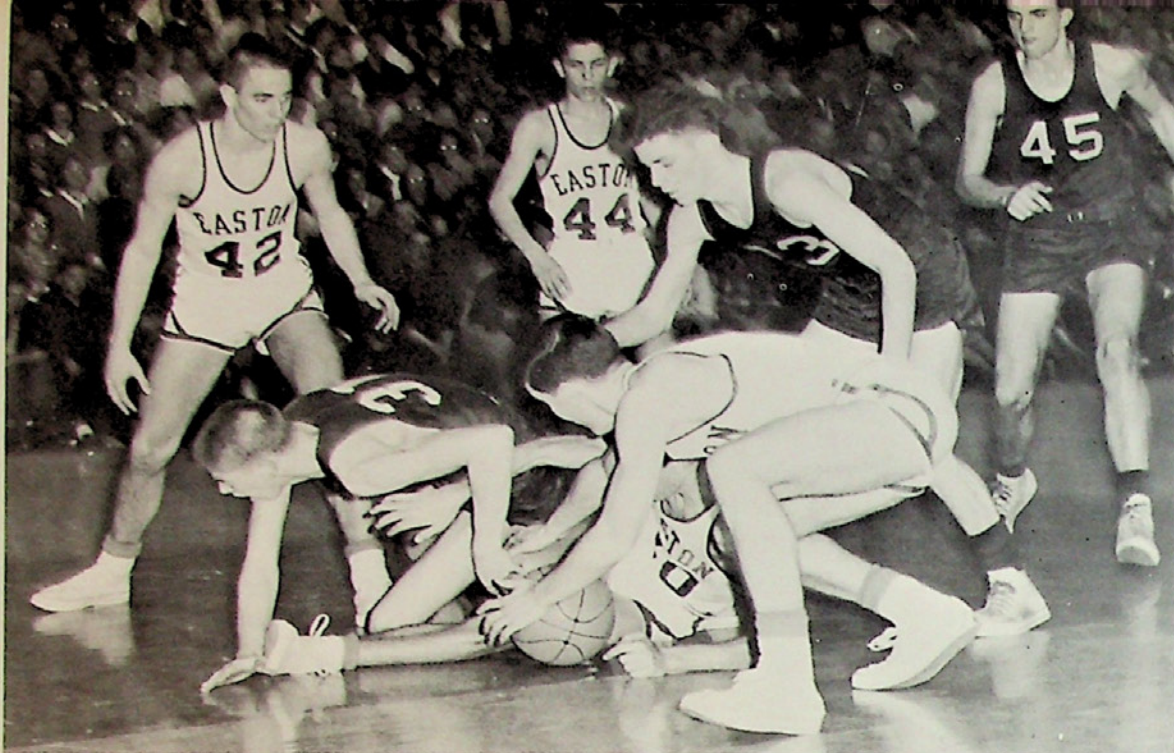

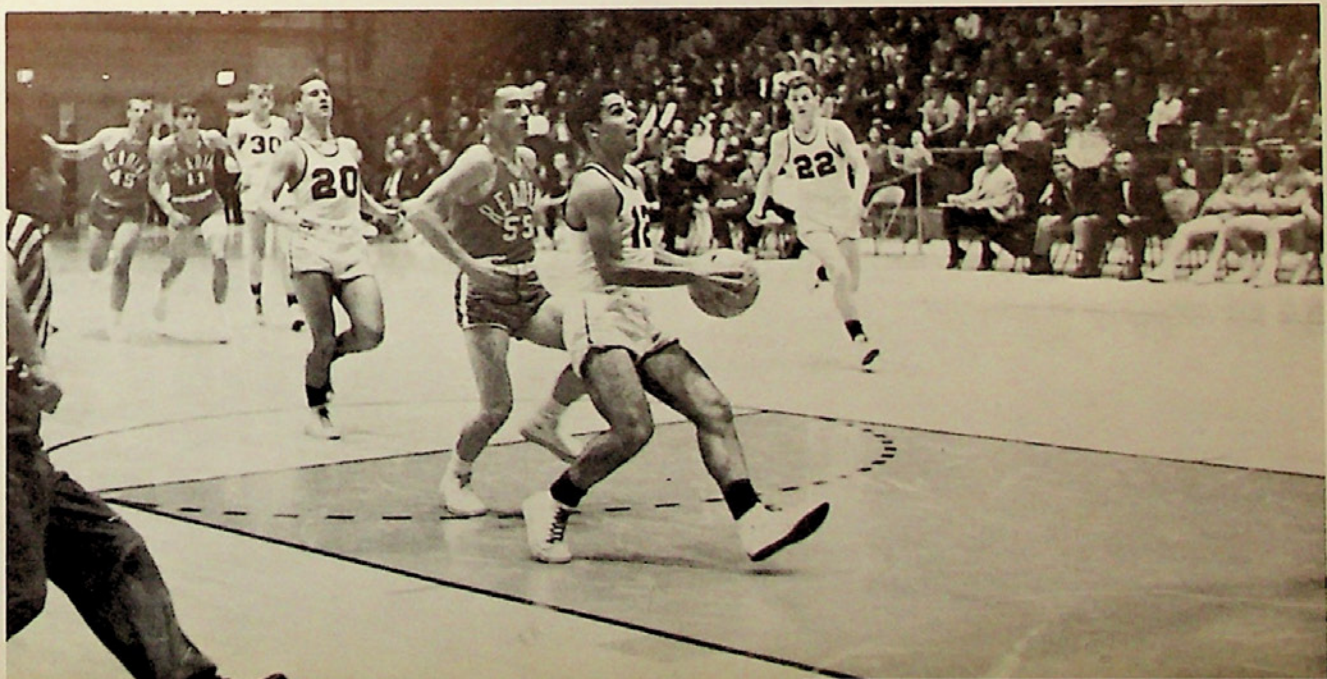

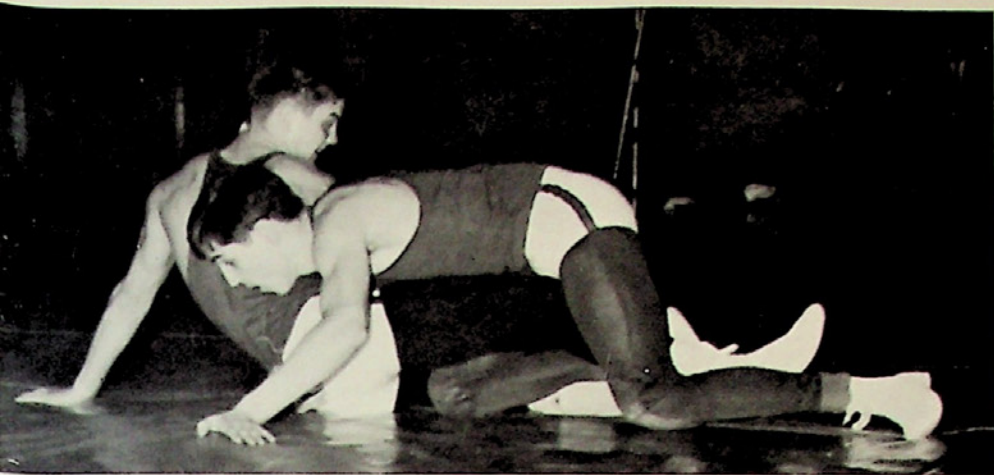

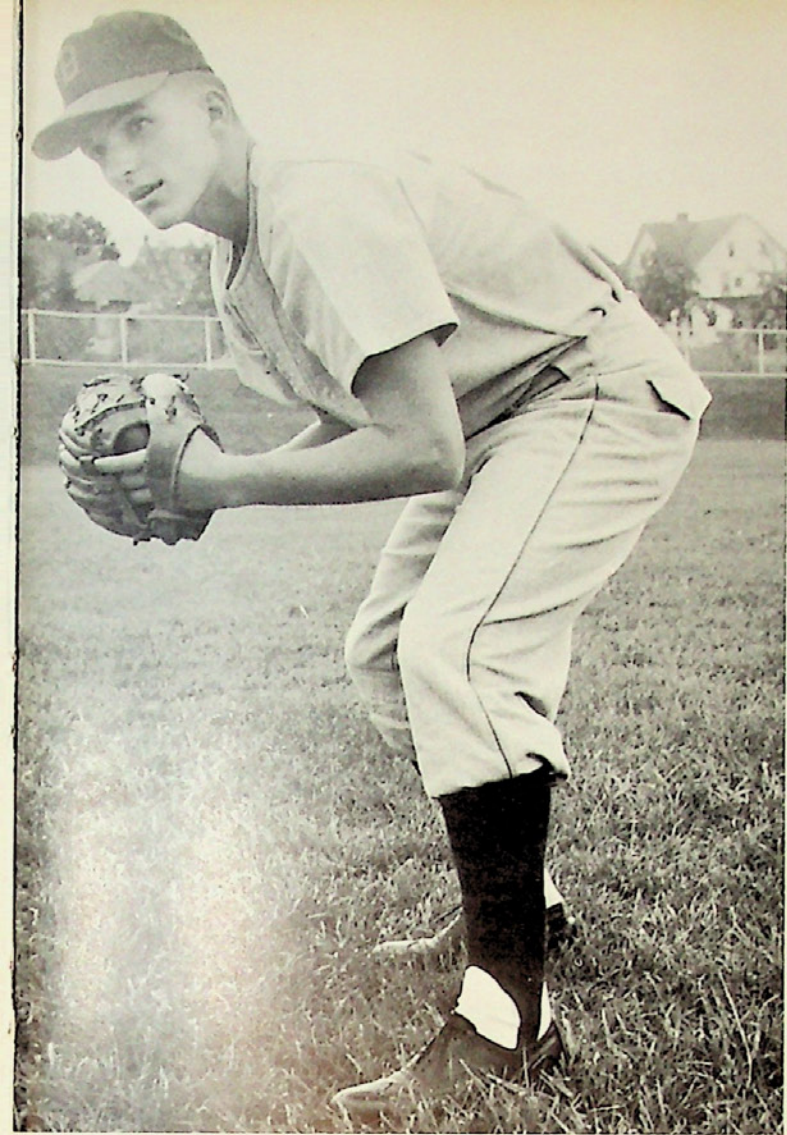
Catholic, 11-0 and 13-1, Easton 18-0, and William Allen, 15-5—exceeded the total number of runs scored by their opponents during the entire year.

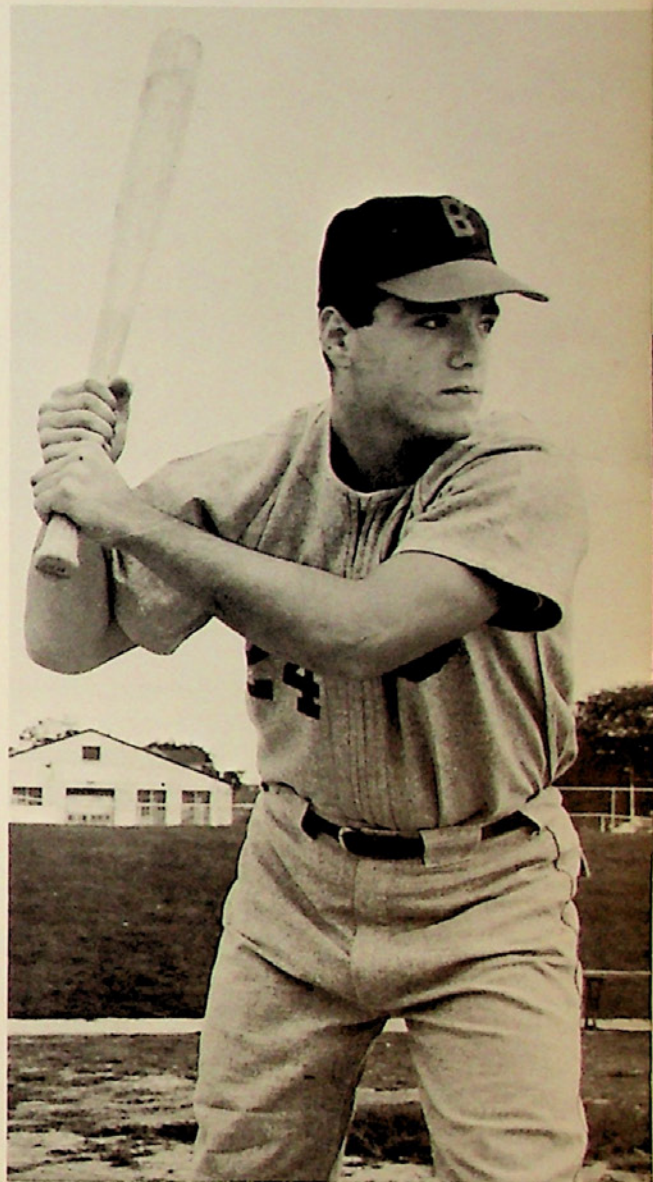

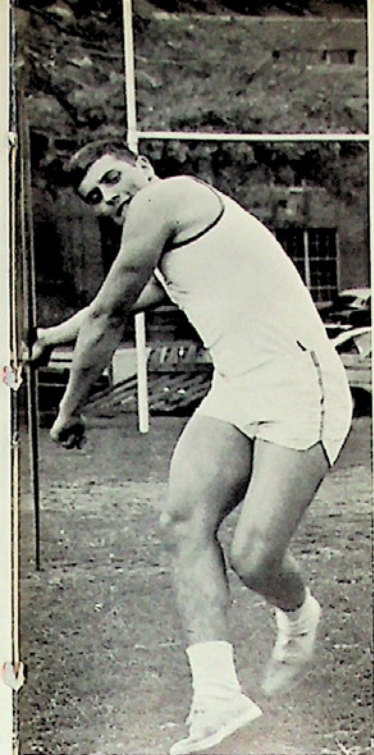
captured second place in District XI competition.

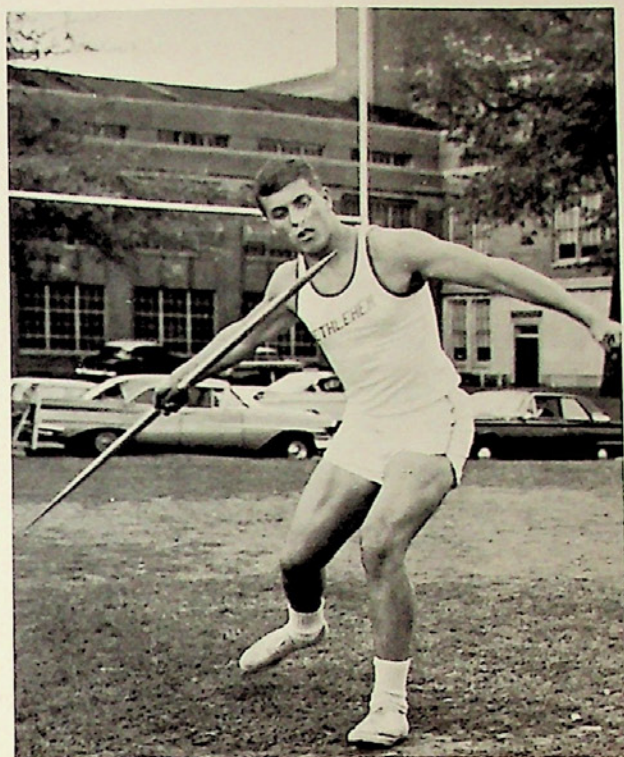

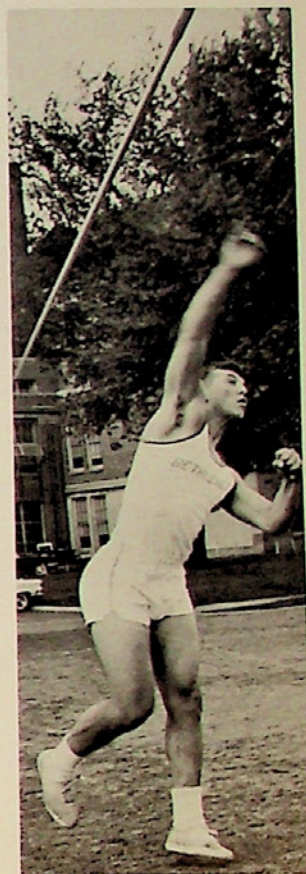

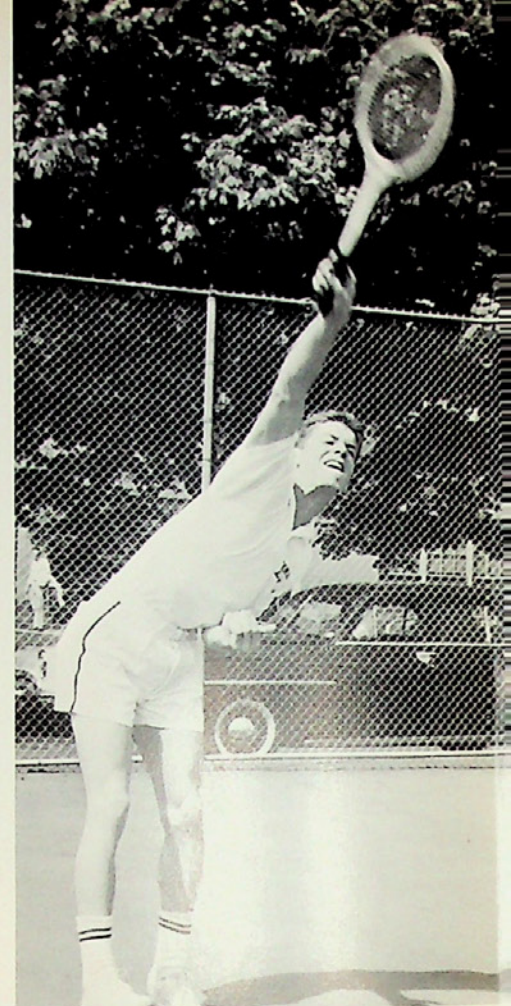
## EXTENDS STREAK TO 27

## THREE MERMEN GAIN DISTRICT HONORS

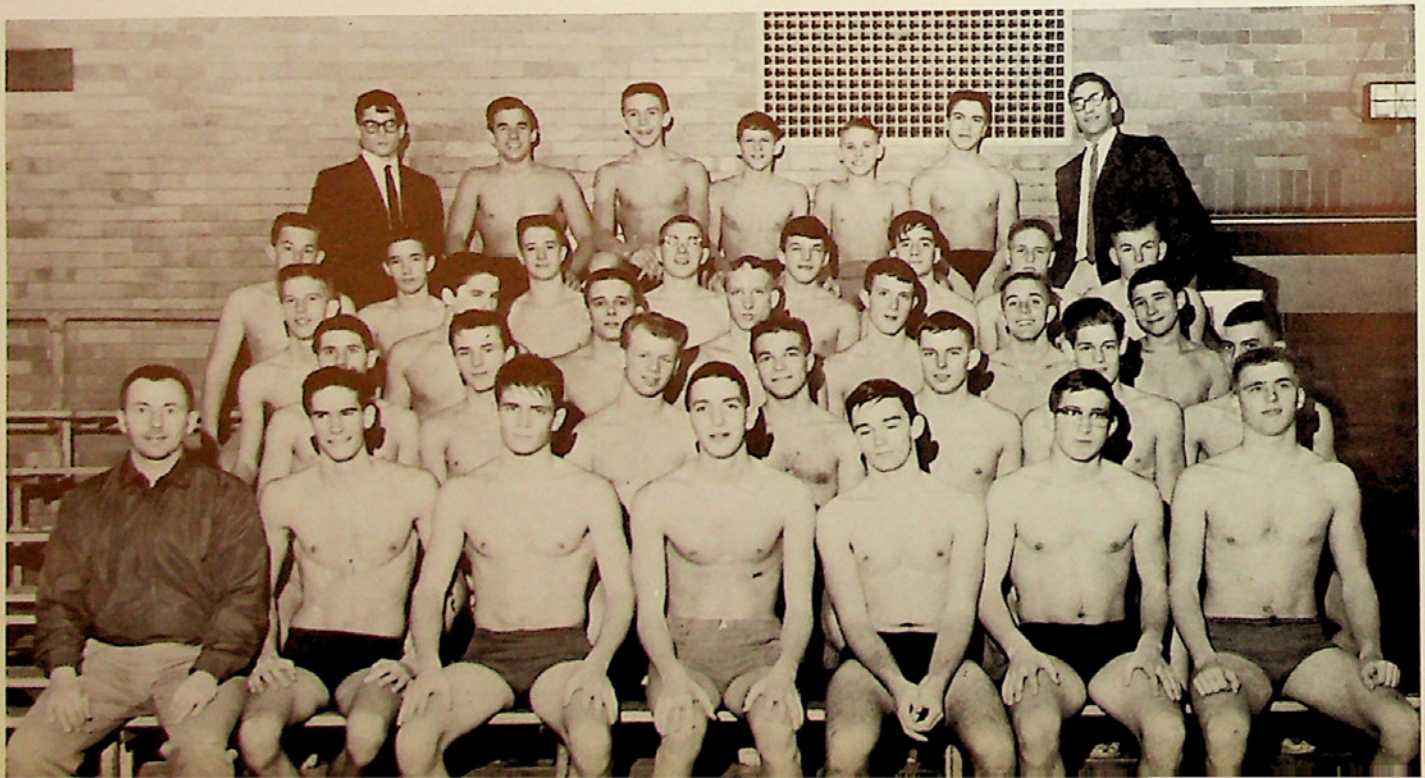

vealed many promising underclassmen.

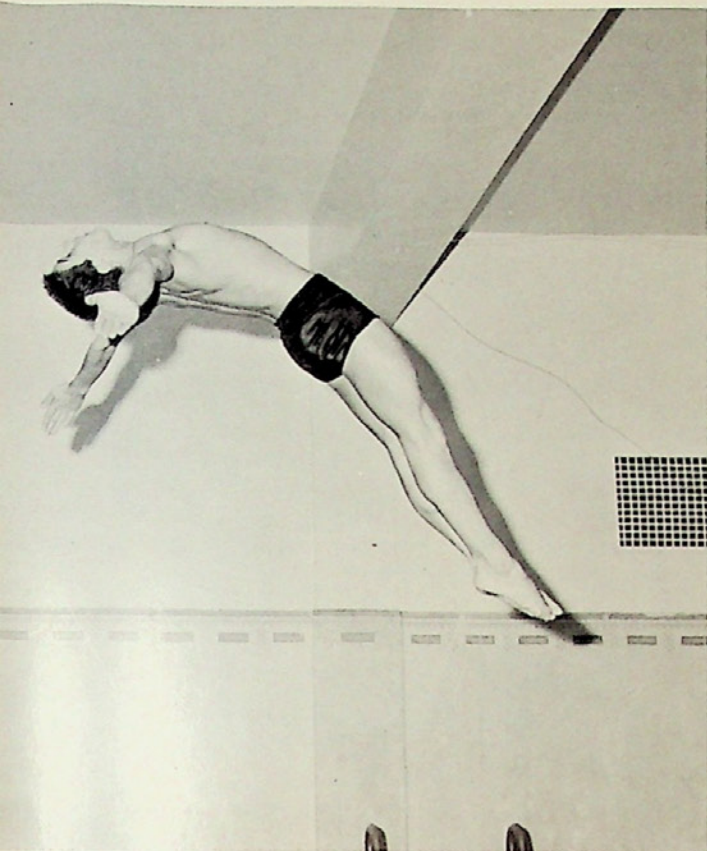

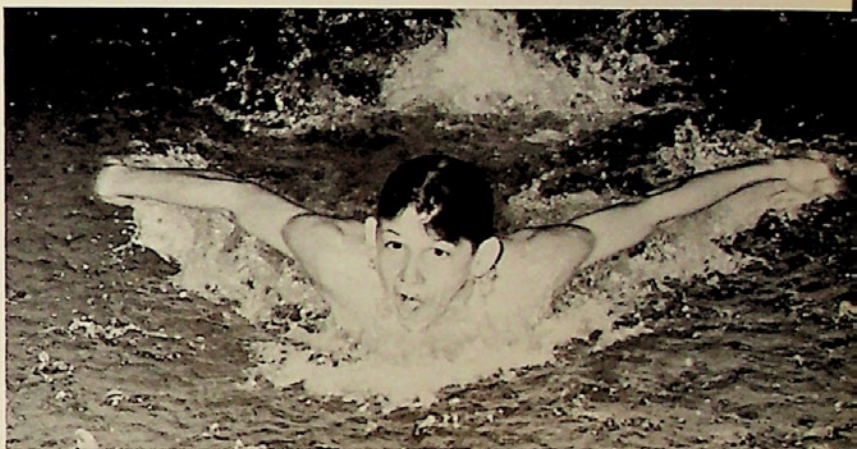


Perfect form is exhibited in the execution of a back dive.

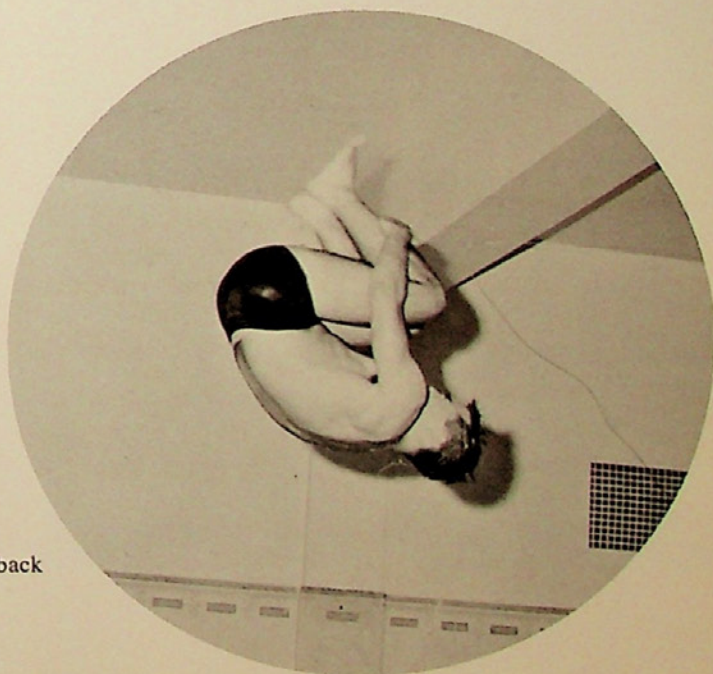

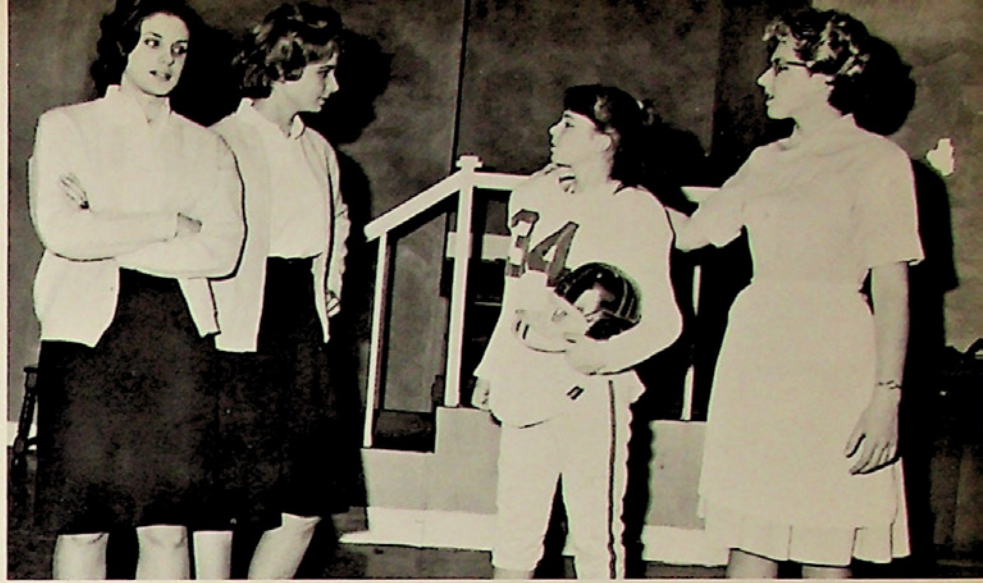
