Cpl. Martin Csillag Earns Bronze Star For Heroic Action

WITH THE 7TH ARMY IN GERMANY.—Corporal Martin P. Csillag, of Bethlehem, has recently been awarded the Bronze Star Medal for heroic action in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States on April 21, 1945. He is the husband of Mrs. Grace Csillag, 1624½ Columbia Street, Bethlehem, and has been in the Army since Nov. 21, 1942. He came overseas in October, 1944, and is currently serving with the 257th Engineer Combat Battalion.

Cpl. Csillag finished his grammar school in Bethlehem in 1933. Before entering the service, he was connected with the Bethlehem Steel Company as millwright. He participated in the campaigns of the Rhineland and southern Europe.

Besides the Bronze Star Medal, Cpl. Csillag has been awarded the Good Conduct Medal and two bronze service battle participation stars. He is serving as assistant unit foreman for Company "A," 257th Engineer Combat Battalion.
