Two Globe-Times Men Promoted In Army

Advanced from private to private first class and transferred from Atlantic City to Jefferson Barracks, Missouri, both within the space of a short time, is the information relatives and friends here have recently received from Emory J. Nemes, of Madison Avenue, this city.

Pfc. Nemes, who earlier this year left his position in the composing room of the Globe-Times to become a member of the armed forces, was stationed in Atlantic City from the time of his induction until his present transfer. A member of the U. S. Air Corps, Nemes received his basic training at the shore army headquarters.

At Jefferson Barracks he is a member of the 70th Training Group, Headquarters Squadron, and expects soon to see active duty overseas.

He is a graduate of Liberty High School and Bethlehem Business College.

Cpl. Thomas Frederickson, of Bath, formerly employed in the advertising department of the Globe-Times, is currently stationed "somewhere in Australia," according to a letter to his former place of employment, this week, which also revealed for the first time the young soldier's advancement from private first class to corporal.

Cpl. Frederickson, a member of the First Cavalry Division, was stationed at Camp Lee, Va., following his induction, and was subsequently transferred to Fort Bliss, Texas, for advanced training.
