**Pvt. Byron R. Kelley
Leaves for C-B-I
After Furlough Here**

Private Byron R. Kelley left this week for the China-Burma-India Theater from Camp Shanks, N. Y., after spending a week of orientation at the Army Service Forces Personnel Replacement Depot of Fort Jackson, S. C.

Before reporting to Fort Jackson, he spent his two weeks' final leave visiting his parents, Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Kelley, at Stockbridge, Mass., and at their home, 1721 Sycamore Street, this city.

Pvt. Kelley is enroute to Calcutta, India, where he and his group will join Major Melvyn Douglas of the Special Services. Here he will take up his new duties as entertainment director for the China-Burma-India Theater.

Since he served in India as a volunteer ambulance driver with the American Field Service prior to joining the Special Services division of the Army in January of this year, this will be Pvt. Kelley's second assignment in that theater of operations.
