Pfc. Paul Rosko Missing After Action At Front

Pfc. Paul Rosko, son of Mrs. Katherine Rosko, near Nazareth, and husband of Mrs. Grace Bittenbender Rosko, Hecktown, was reported missing "somewhere in France", according to a telegram from the War Department received Thursday.

Pfc. Rosko, an infantryman, was previously reported as having been wounded in France on November 15 and returning to action on November 16. According to the latest telegram, he was reported missing somewhere in France on December 2.

Pfc. Rosko entered the Army on December 10, 1943, and received his training at Fort Eustis, Va., Fort Leonard Wood, Mo., San Luis Obispo, Cal., and Fort Meade, Md., from which place he was sent overseas in September of this year. He had been home in June on a furlough. The last letter received by his wife was dated November 9.

Prior to entering the service, Pfc. Rosko was employed by the Bethlehem Steel Company. He has two brothers in service, Adam Rosko, a paratrooper somewhere in France, and Andrew Rosko, U. S. Navy, somewhere in the South Pacific area.
