**Former Member of City Fire Department Promoted in Railway Artillery.**

First Lieutenant Leonard D. F. Staffieri, 802 East Fifth Street, stationed at Fort Hancock, N. J., with the 52nd U. S. Coast Artillery Railway, was promoted to the rank of captain, his wife was informed today here.

Capt. Staffieri was employed by the city as a Victory Fire Company hoseman previous to his Army induction by Battery C, 213th Coast Artillery Anti-Aircraft, U. S. National Guard, in September, 1940.

He served on the Mexican border with the U. S. 12th Cavalry, Troop E, near the end of the First World War and with Battery C, Pennsylvania National Guard, until his transfer to the 52nd Coast Artillery on April 16, 1942.

His service as private, corporal, sergeant, first sergeant, 2nd lieutenant and first lieutenant was all given while he was a member of Battery C, 213th C. A. A-A., P. N. G.

A member of the Catholic Society of St. Peter, The Apostle, the Lehigh Hook and Ladder Fire Company Relief Association and the Italian Beneficial Society, Capt. Staffieri and his wife have two children, both daughters, Marietta, 13, and Pauline, 10, at home.
