**Paul M. Reagan,

Paul M. Reagan, 21, son of Mr. and Mrs. William A. Reagan, of Nazareth R. D. 3, was recently appointed a flight officer and won his wings as a pilot at Blytheville Army Air Field, Ark. After a short leave at home he reported to Panama City, Fla., where he is studying four-motored bomber flying.

Flight Officer Reagan is a 1942 graduate from Nazareth High School where he majored in art and science. He enlisted in the Air Force on Feb. 3, 1943, at Miami, Fla. From Miami he was sent to St. Xavier University, Ohio, for pre-flight instruction. He received subsequent training at Nashville, Tenn.; Maxwell Field, Ala.; Lafayette, La., and Walnut Ridge, Ark., before he completed his training at Blytheville.

His art ability was put to use several times during his career as a cadet. At St. Xavier he was art editor of his company paper and at Nashville Classification Center he painted a 5'x7' mural in the officers' headquarters.
