

Miller, Edward T.

Fountain Hill APR 3 1943
Soldier Dead,
Message Says

"Plane on which Staff Sergeant Edward T. Miller was aboard, has been located. All aboard were instantly killed on March 29."

That was the contents of a War Department telegram received today by Mr. and Mrs. William Miller, 628 Lechauweki ave., Fountain Hill. At the instance of the family, Undertaker Francis Connell made arrangements to have the remains sent to his late home.

At the time of the fatal crash, it was learned that the plane was on a trial flight from Geiger Field, Washington.

Besides his parents, William and Amelia (Streckler) Miller, he is survived by one brother, William, and a sister, Ursula, at home.

A graduate of Bethlehem Catholic High School, Class of '33, he was a member of St. Ursula parish and was affiliated with the Holy Name Society. Prior to his induction early in July of last year, he was an employe of the Bethlehem Steel Company.
