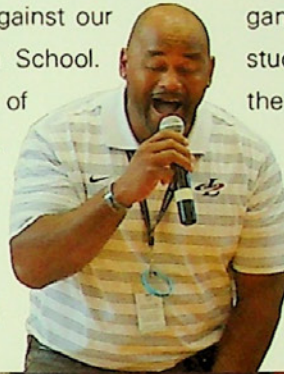
# Spreading SCHOOL SPIRIT

The drummers, majorettes, dance team, step team, and cheerleaders all join together for a huge group performance in front of the entire school for the Spirit Week Pep Rally.



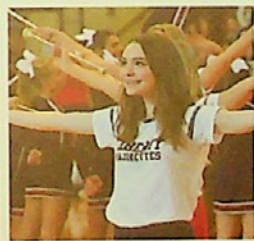

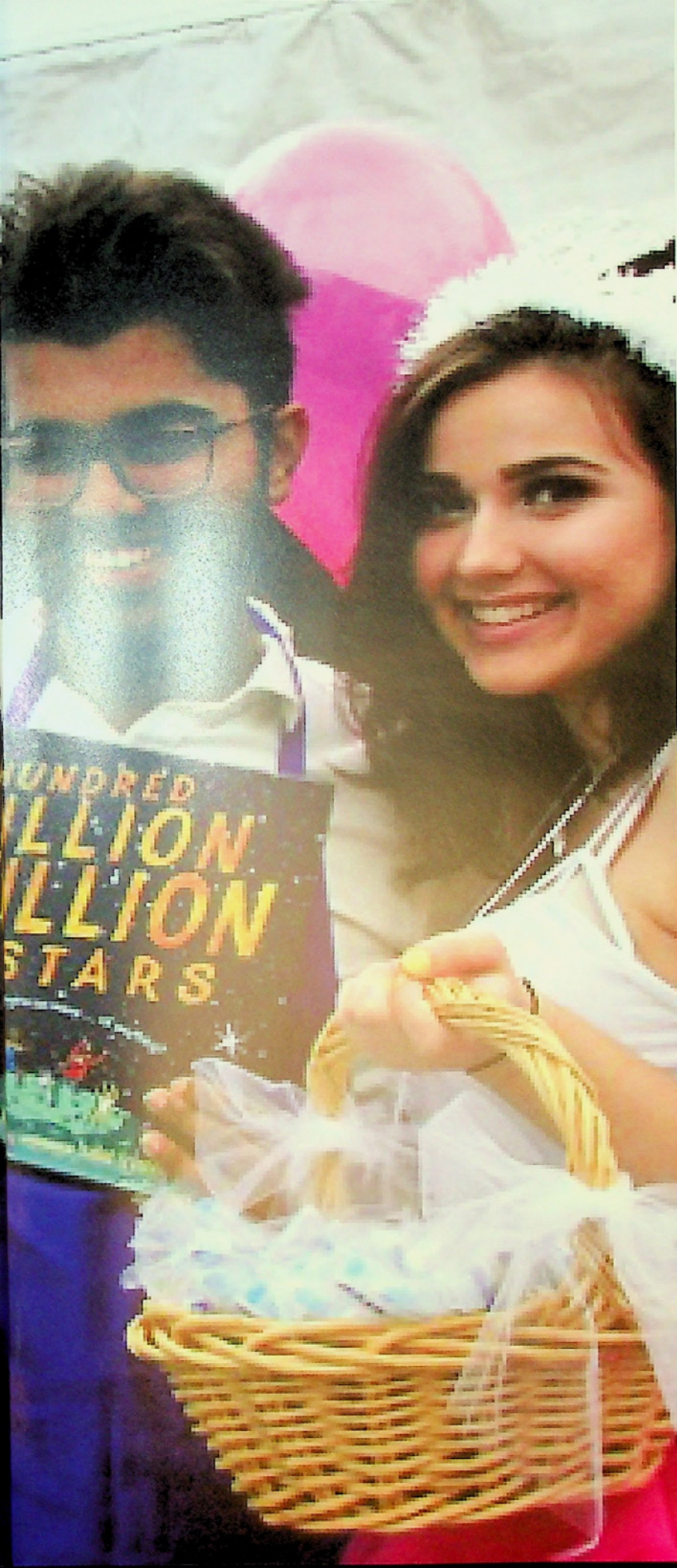


### **Wreaths Across America**

Every year, with the help of the track team and the students who volunteer, Liberty hosts the Special Olympics, for students of all ages from schools all over the Northampton County, in our stadium. # Standing out AGAINST Violence

Enough is enough . . . it seems that gun violence has taken one to many lives. At the planned walkout, Maren Drake shares her message with her fellow classmates, to help end gun violence in schools.

"On February 14, 2018, a former student, armed with an AR-15 assault rifle, began shooting into classrooms at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, Florida, ultimately killing 17 people, and injuring 16 more. The deadliest school shooting since Sandy Hook in 2012, these horrific events have sparked a national movement for change, led by the students of Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School. We, the students of Liberty High School, along with students from over 2000 other schools across the United States are currently outside of their classrooms, honoring the lives of those that were lost on February 14th, and standing with the Marjory Stoneman Douglas survivors as a part of the March For Our Lives Movement, advocating for reform to ensure that nothing like this happens anywhere, ever again.

However, we don't just stand for school safety today. Along with safety, we stand for reform in all respects. The gunman on February 14th was an orphan and an expelled student from Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School. Some of his former classmates described him as a "loner" and an "outcast". Both are words that must be eliminated entirely from today's society. No one, no matter age, gender, race, or sexuality, should ever have to feel lesser than any other individual.

We as a community must stand for inclusion, unity, and empowerment. If we are truly to make change, we must start in our own community. That means inviting people to sit with you at lunch, switching up who you work with on a project, encouraging people to get involved, and just welcoming them in. These are calls to action that we have all heard before, but rarely acknowledge and act upon.

Now more than ever we must stand united, as we are today. Abandoning all barriers, and focusing on the fact that we are one community. Libstrong and BASDproud. Students should not go to school fearing that this day might be their last. Change is coming and it starts with us, the kids who are the future of this country. Our voices will be heard as we stand united, and refuse to allow any more death to plague our nation."



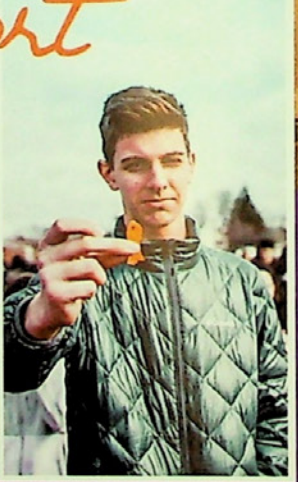
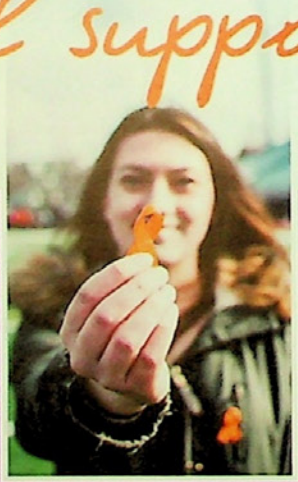

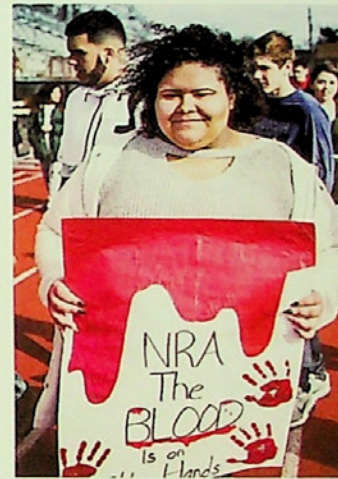
### MILEIDY CLASS

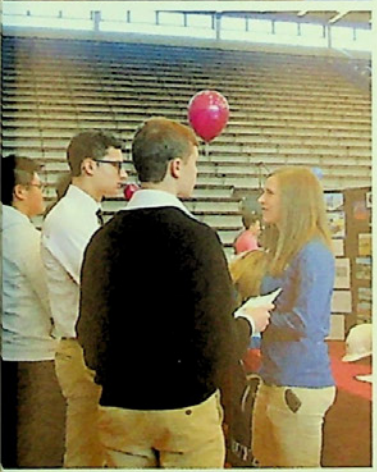


### **Presenting Yourself**

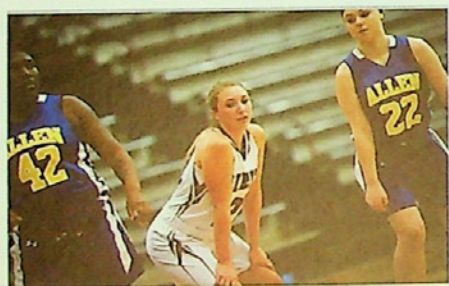

I was diagnosed with cancer at the age of 7. I stayed at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia for several months for treatment. I first had a surgery to remove the tumor, then 5 days later, I started my three rounds of chemotherapy to clear the rest of the diseased cells. It was a very difficult time for me and my family. I was young and unaware of what was going on, but I know I was very afraid and constantly felt sick. I know my parents and sisters were terrified too, and I know they hated seeing me like that. The only good that came from the experience was the way it brought my family and peers together. In between my rounds of chemo, everyone was so kind to me, and they started holding fundraisers to benefit the cause. My senior year, my class took a field trip to Washington, D.C. and I was able to visit the African American Museum. This was the most influential moment in my life. There were so many inspirational stories there and made me realize that if I want to follow in their footsteps of creating change, I have some really big shoes to fill!"

What started out as just some back pain, Anaya's life was turned upside down when she heard the "C" word ... cancer. An initial x-ray showed a mass in her chest and was sent immediately for a PET scan. This type of scan injects radioactive material into your body that makes any cancer cells glow. It was in this test where she showed evidence of tumors in her chest, underarms, and neck. She was referred to St. Christopher's Hospital in Philadelphia where after a biopsy, she was officially diagnosed with stage 3 Hodgkins Lymphoma on January 2, 2018. "At first, there were a lot of emotions going through my mind as well as people in my family. My dad's husband just recently passed away from cancer and it seemed like everything was hitting all at the same time. However, my faith is strong and I kept telling myself that everything happens for a reason and something good will come out of this." Knowing that she was going to have to go through Chemotherapy, Anaya's doctor recommended putting her eggs for reproduction purposes before starting the heavy cancer drugs often produce infertility. By February 9, she began her first round of chemotherapy, she basically had several days of intense therapy every 2 weeks for 3 months. All of her treatments were done in Philadelphia, where she and her family needed to spend much of the time. "What kept me going was my positive attitude and the support from my friends and the Liberty community. Because of this experience, I now figured out what I want to do with my life. I want to work in Pediatric Oncology so I can help other kids get through their experience with cancer; I want to be able to tell them, if I can do this ... so can you."

I took computer at Vo-tech and that is what I want to do for something when I graduate in June."

The 2017-2018 Cauldron, Volume 93, was printed by Herff Jones Yearbooks in Kansas City, Kansas. Under the guidance of advisor Lisa Gilliard, and our company representative, Nancy Tunis, the Cauldron staff was able to produce an original concept book in full color consisting of 236 pages. 600 copies of the Liberty Cauldron were sold this year. The cost of the books ranged from \$85.00 to over \$110 based on options ordered such as name plates, dust jackets, and a 16 page World Yearbook insert designed and printed by Herff Jones. All senior and underclassmen portraits were taken by Christmas City Studio, located in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania. Christmas City Studio also provided the yearbook staff with group and action pictures of Liberty athletics and special events. Club

and organization group photos were taken by Lisa Gilliard. This yearbook was created using Adobe InDesign and Photoshop CS6 with a lab of iMac computers. Fonts used in this book include Herff Jones fonts AHJ Urbano, AHJ Fallon Hand, AHJ Litho Antique as well as Super Clarendon and Abadi. The book is a Smyth sewn round and back silkscreen book with silver foil used to enhance the "L" in our theme and concept of "The L Way." Special thank you to the administration and the district for allowing yearbook to be not only extra-curricular, but allowing us to have a course where students can learn about print design and yearbook journalism. ## HEALING AFTER HURRICANES



### TEXAS AND FLORIDA WERE AMONG THE U.S. STATES HAMPERED BY HURRICANES

MORE THAN 20 TRILLION GALLONS OF RAIN fell across Texas and Louisiana during a 17-day period when Hurricane Harvey made landfall three separate times, the first on Aug. 25. Areas in and around Houston were devastated by the rain. The country came together as 24,000 National Guard troops were deployed and millions of meals and liters of water were donated and distributed. Just two weeks later, Hurricane Irma made landfall in Florida on Sept. 10. Irma was the strongest hurricane recorded in the Atlantic Ocean outside the Gulf of Mexico and the Caribbean Sea. The massive storm battered the state's lower half and left tornadoes and storm-surge flooding in its path as it went up the Florida peninsula. More than five million people were evacuated along the East Coast.

Those viewing in the line of totality experienced a few minutes of dropping temperatures, crickets chirping and streetlights lighting. **BELOW A MISTER IN SHANGHAI, CHINA ON JULY 9**, a man cools off as temperatures skyrocket. NASA and the National Oceanographic and Atmospheric Administration announced the year ranked in the three hottest years on record with land and sea surface temperatures averaging 1.62 degrees Fahrenheit above average. **THE MOON COVERS THE SUN** as the solar eclipse reaches totality. The eclipse was the first to cross the entire United States in 99 years.



## DIGGING UP THE PAST

**SCIENTISTS ANNOUNCED JAN. 29**, the discovery of the fossils of a *Mansourasaurus shahinae* in the Sahara Desert. The fossils revealed the dinosaur was nearly 33 feet long and weighed 5.5 tons.



## WE HAVE LIFT-OFF

**SPACEX LAUNCHED A ROCKET ON DEC. 23** and sent social media into a frenzy as the exhaust left a strange streak in the sky. The company followed up Feb. 6 with the launch of Falcon Heavy, the most powerful rocket launched in decades. To keep it interesting, Elon Musk packed a Tesla in the rocket.



## FIND OF THE JUNGLE

**ON FEB. 2, 2018**, using Lidar remote sensing technology, archaeologists discovered more than 60,000 Mayan ruins — spread over 810 square miles — hidden under a jungle in Guatemala. This transformed the way scientists viewed and researched the Mayan civilization.

## DEVASTATING WILDFIRES

**DRIVEN BY SURGING WINDS ON DEC. 4**, the unruly blaze was recorded as the third largest in California history and forced mass evacuation as fire and ash overtook cities throughout the state. Firefighters worked to slow the spread of fires as they reached backyards.
