A Lehigh University professor who served as an officer in World War I and spent two years after the conflict in reconstruction work in France will again don the Army uniform next week.

Dr. Earl L. Crum, head of the department of Greek at the university, announced today that he has been commissioned a Captain in the United States Army and will report for active duty to the Provost-Marshall General's School at Fort Custer, Michigan, July 21. After a month of training there he expects to be transferred.

Dr. Crum was a First Lieutenant in the previous war. After the war he completed his graduate studies and received the doctorate from New York University in 1924. He has taught Greek at Lehigh for 15 years and his departure will probably mean the closing of that department for the duration.

In July, 1935, Professor Crum visited Portugal to study the history and architecture of that country, to supplement a trip to Portugal in the summer of 1932. During these trips he took over 800 pictures relative to his study of architecture. Previous to his Portugal sojourn, Professor Crum conducted courses on a Mediterranean education cruise.

His wife, president of the local American Association of University Women, will remain at their Bethlehem home, 717 Seventh Avenue, during Professor Crum's absence.
