Edward Vogel Home After Duty Aboard 'Randolph'

Edward Vogel, husband of the former Mary Rosko, 1823 East Third St., was one of the last area "blue-jackets" who served aboard the carrier Randolph, to return to the States for his discharge.

Under the command of Vice Admiral Mitchel, as well as Admiral Halsey, Vogel, Marino Rocco, 325 Wyandotte St.; Stephen Lockey Jr., 125 1/2 East Fourth St., all of this city, and J. Groller of Nazareth, helped their Essex class flat-top pile up her amazing war record.

Vogel and Lockey received their boot training together at Camp Peary, Va., and were later sent to Newport, R. I. They were joined by the other men who transferred from other ships to make up the crew when the Randolph was commissioned at Newport News, Va.

Overseas since last January, the men returned from the Pacific to take part in the Navy Day celebration October 27 at Baltimore, Md. They wear campaign stars for the Okinawa, Iwo Jima and Tokyo operations.

Vogel graduated from Bethlehem Technical High School and was formerly employed by Bethlehem Steel Company. He is the father of two children, Marie, 2 years old, and Edward Jr., nine months.
