ception centers. The farewell was
held in the board offices in the
DPA building, Eighth Avenue.

view Road, who was inducted with
the group departed immediately
from Allentown two weeks ago for
Fort Meade.

Members of the board, Franklin
Cole, chairman; Stanley K.
Weaver, secretary, and R. Fred
Stahl, bade the men godspeed and
best wishes for a happy experience.
Other remarks were made by Chief
Clerk L. R. Drown, Appeal Agent
John Diefenderfer and John
Griffiths, president of the Beth-
lehem Tobacco Club, the last named
presenting each of the boys with
a kit.

Peacock was in charge of the boys
going to Fort Meade and Wolfe
in charge of the contingent going
to New Cumberland.

Following the sendoff, Board
No. 3 held a regular meeting,
classifying recently-examined men

and those who came of age in
September, and reclassifying those
already sent for U. S. army exam-
ination and rejected, those who
were previously in 1-B and those
whose deferments expired. The
board will meet again next Tues-
day. Another group of men will be
sent to the Allentown induction
center October 22.
