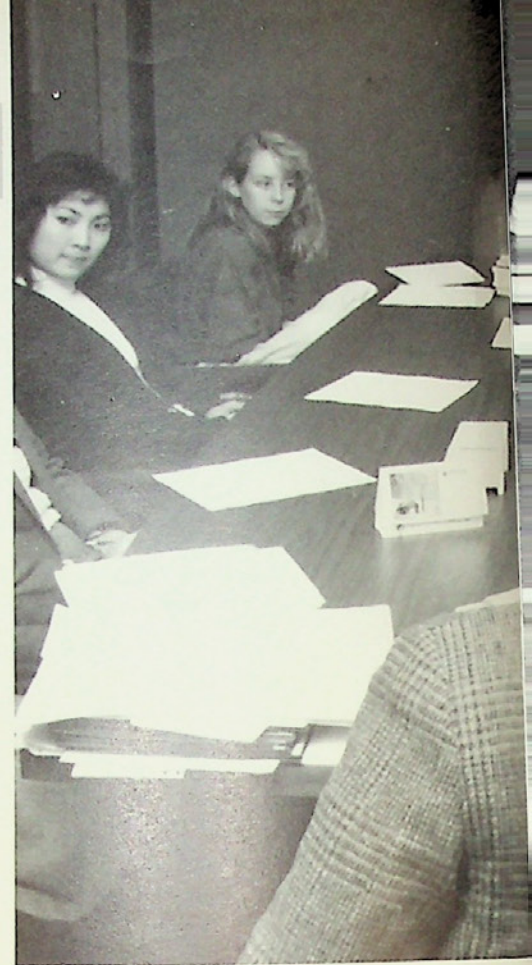




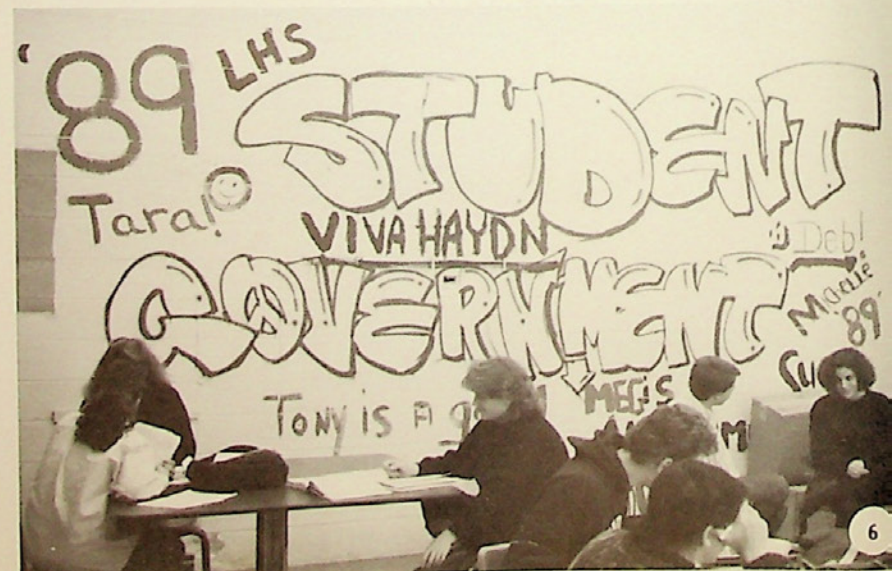
# Leaders In Training

# Homecoming Week Has Ups And Downs

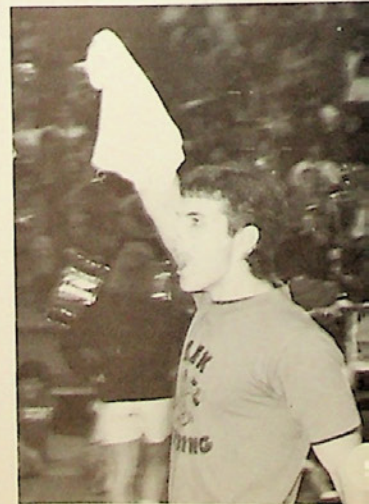

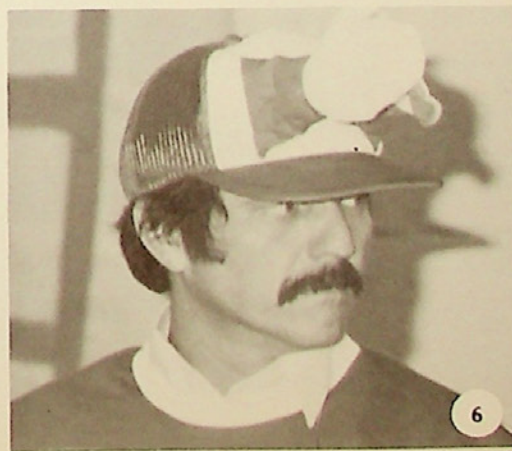
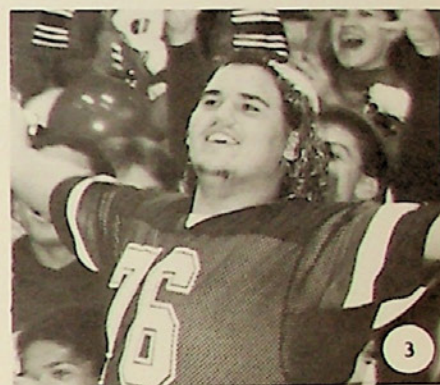

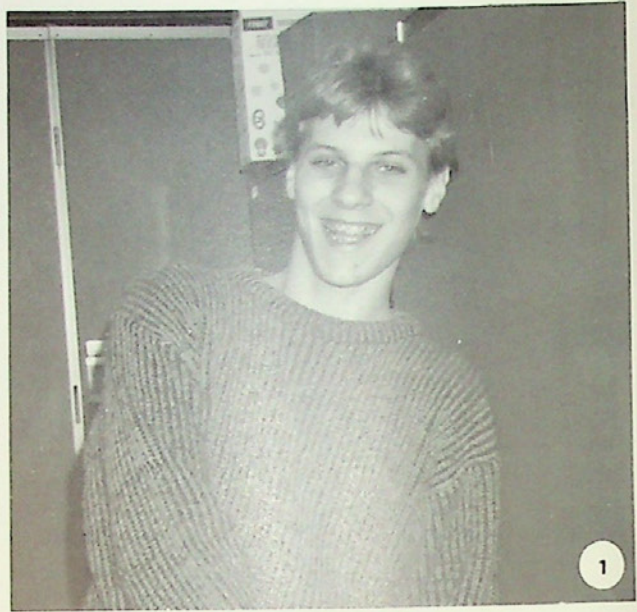

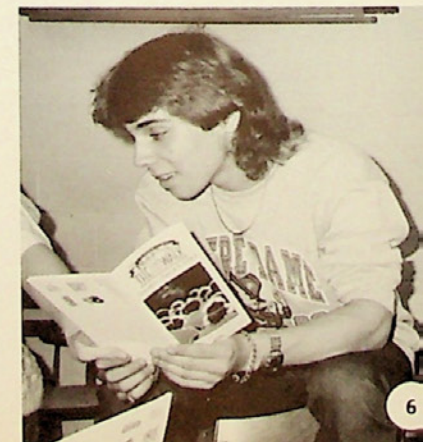
# Interact Serves

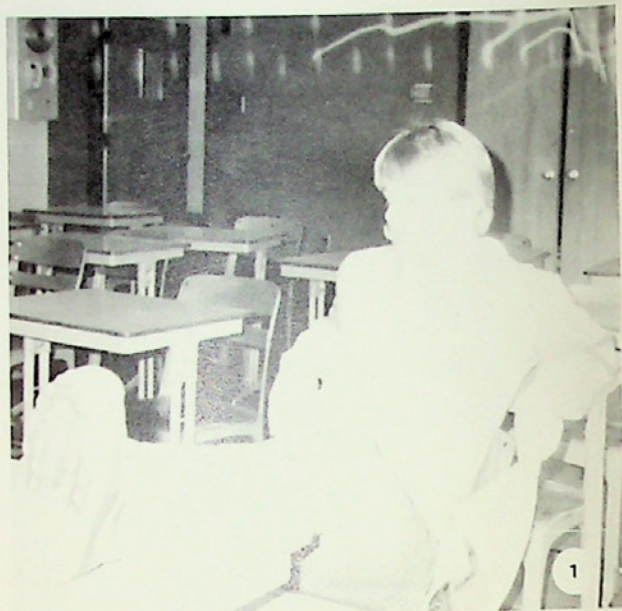


# Mathematical Genii

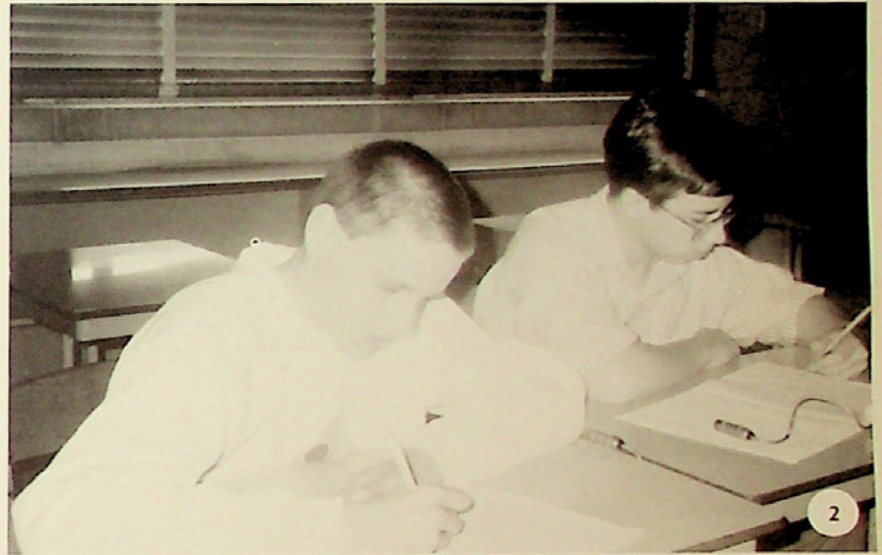


# LHS Whiz Kids

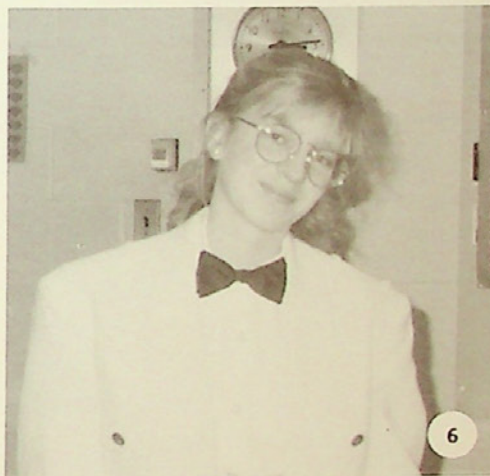

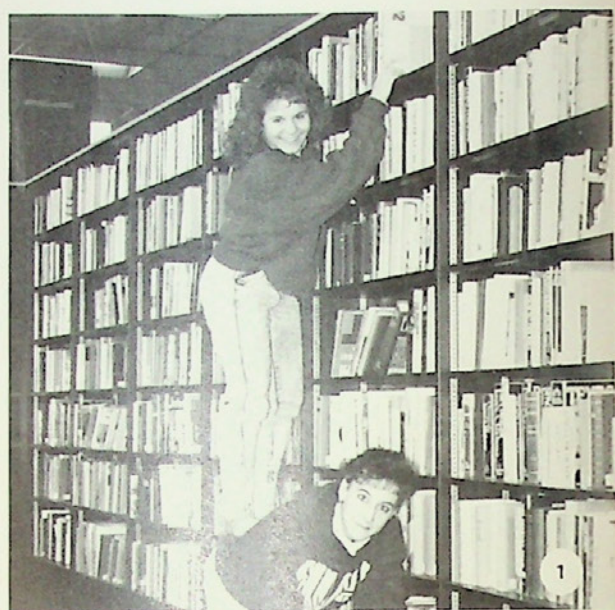

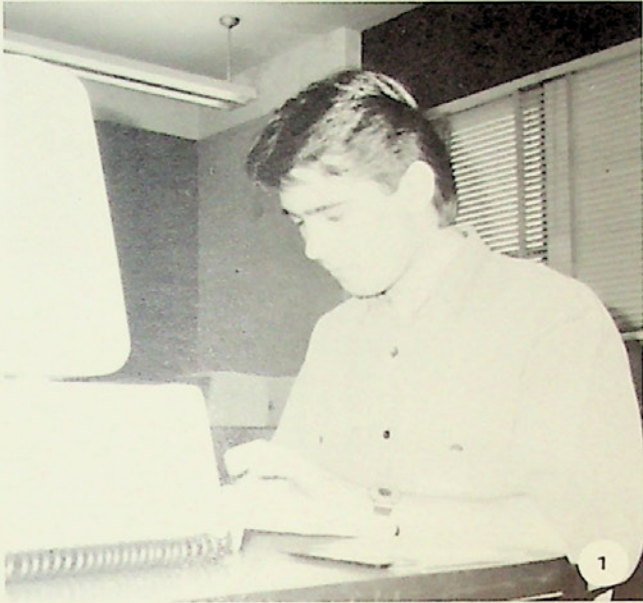


# Masters of Megabytes

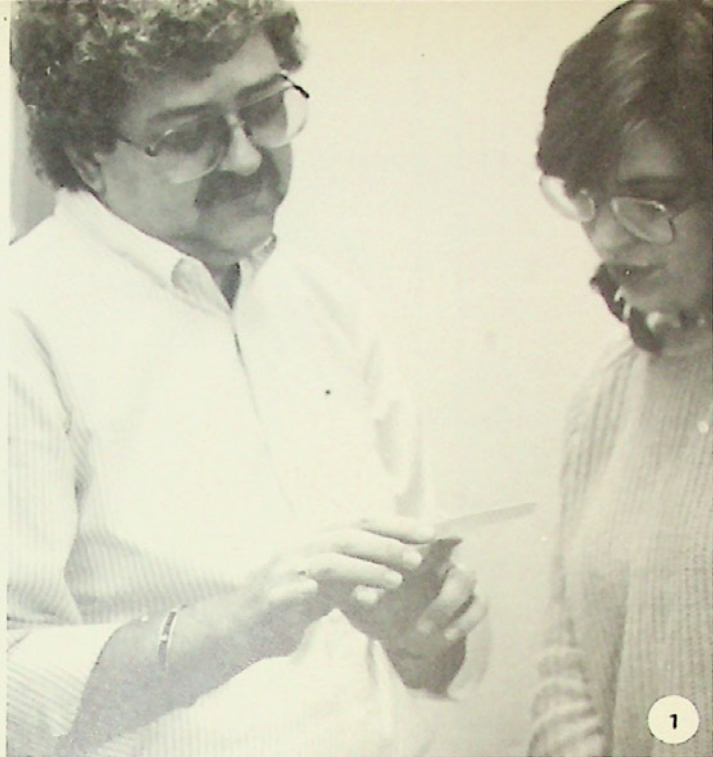




# Photographers Learn

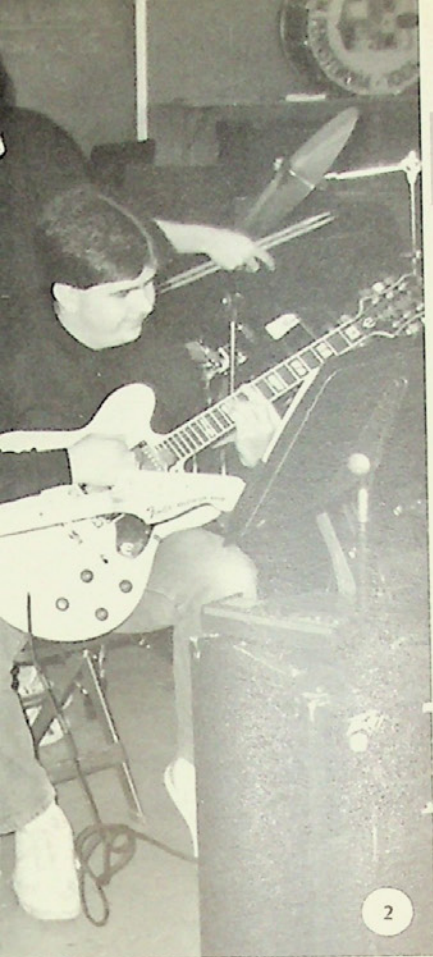

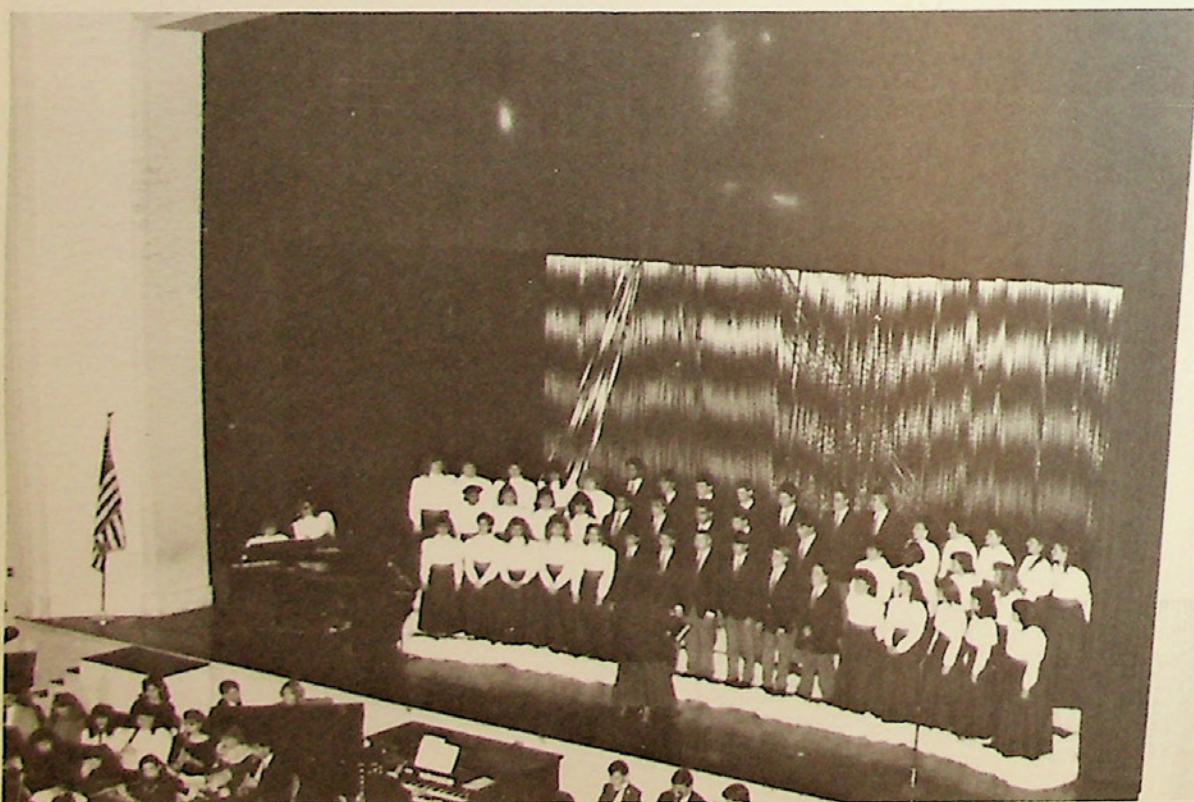
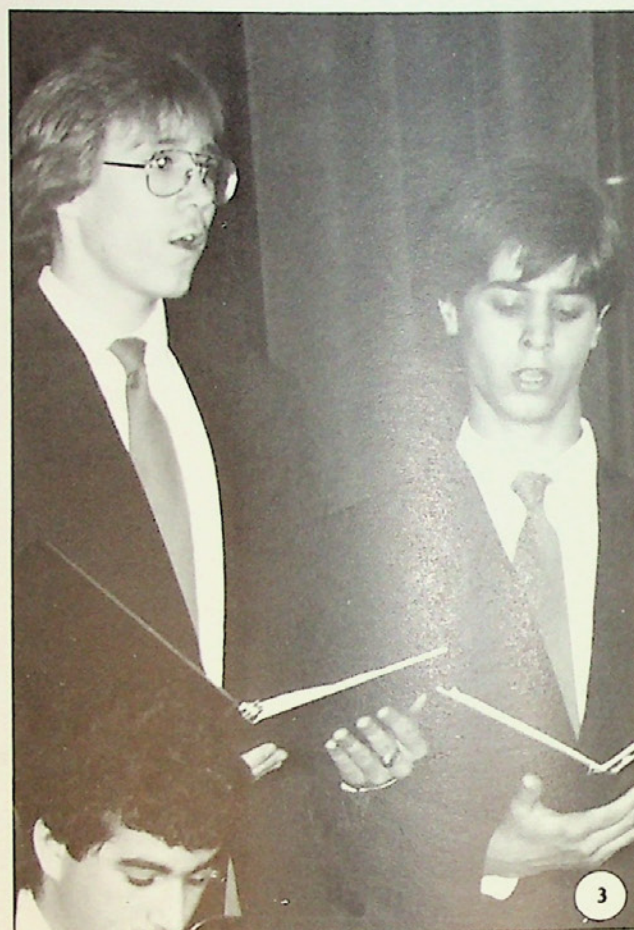

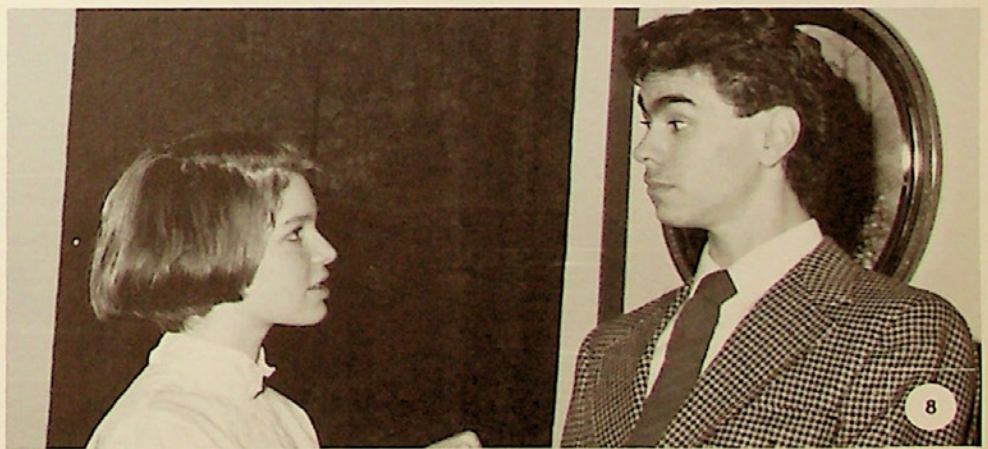
# The Audience

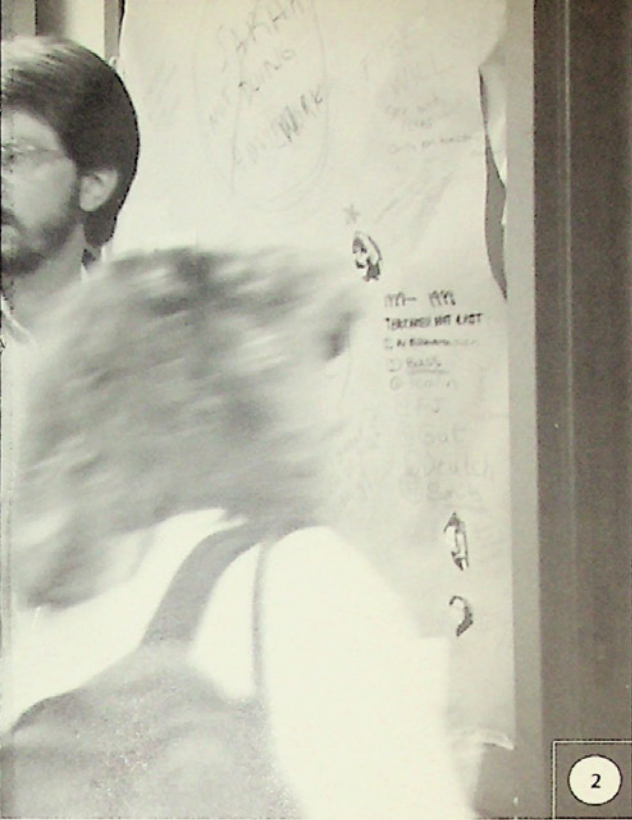
## Can't Be Beat

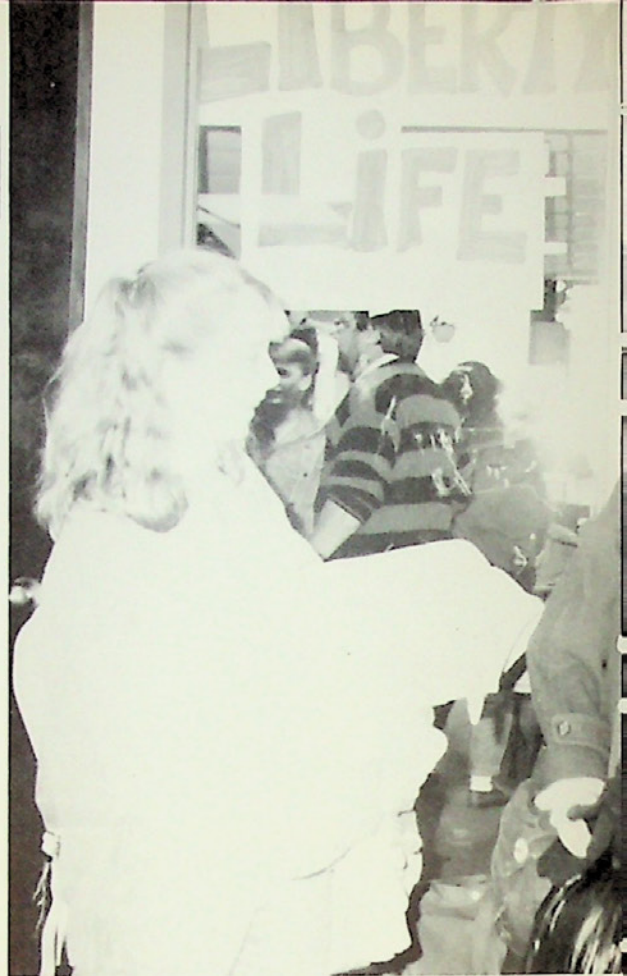


# Student Forum

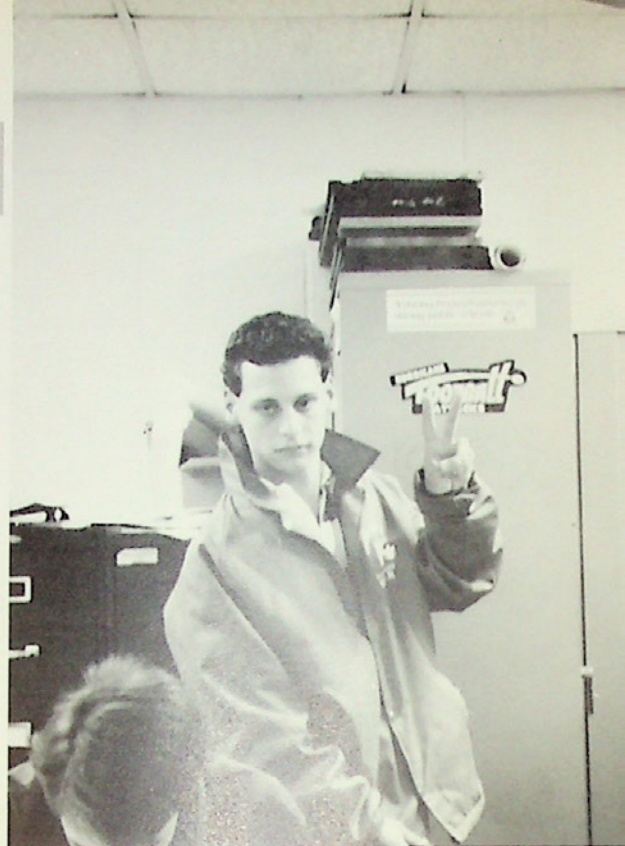
# Recapturing Memories

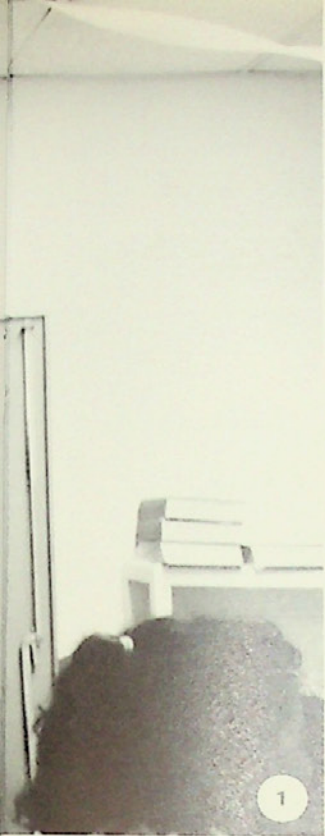

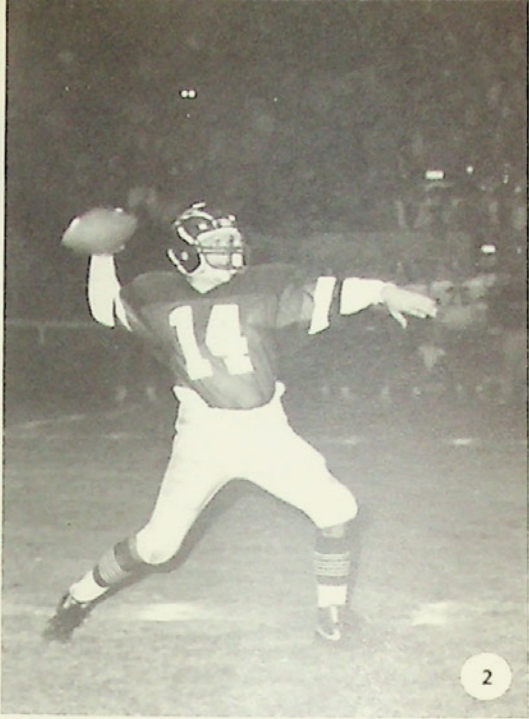

# Serving Up A Good Year

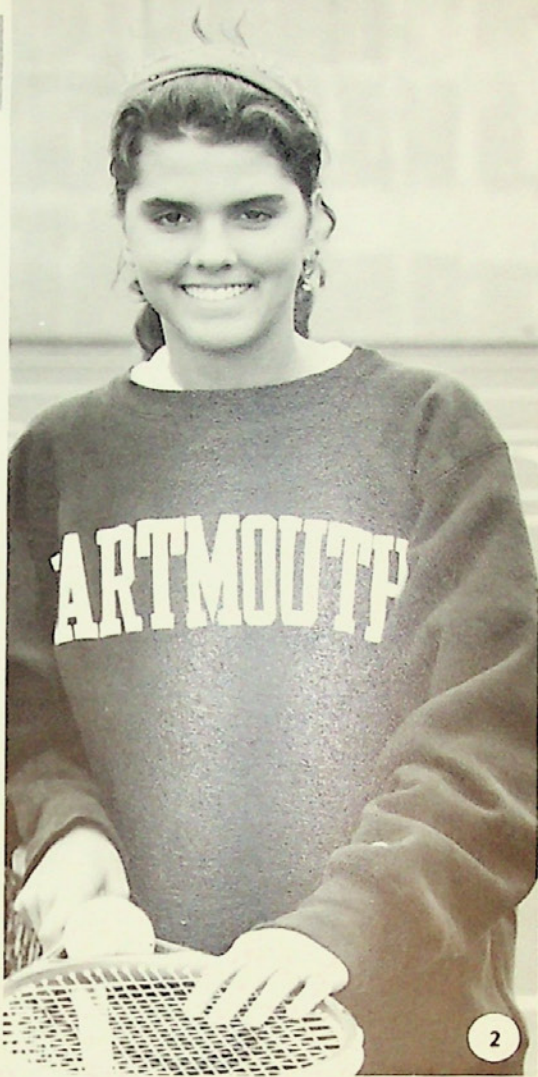

With only six graduating seniors, the underclassmen depth lead by **Todd Zigmund** and **David Crim** lends promise to the future of golf at Liberty.

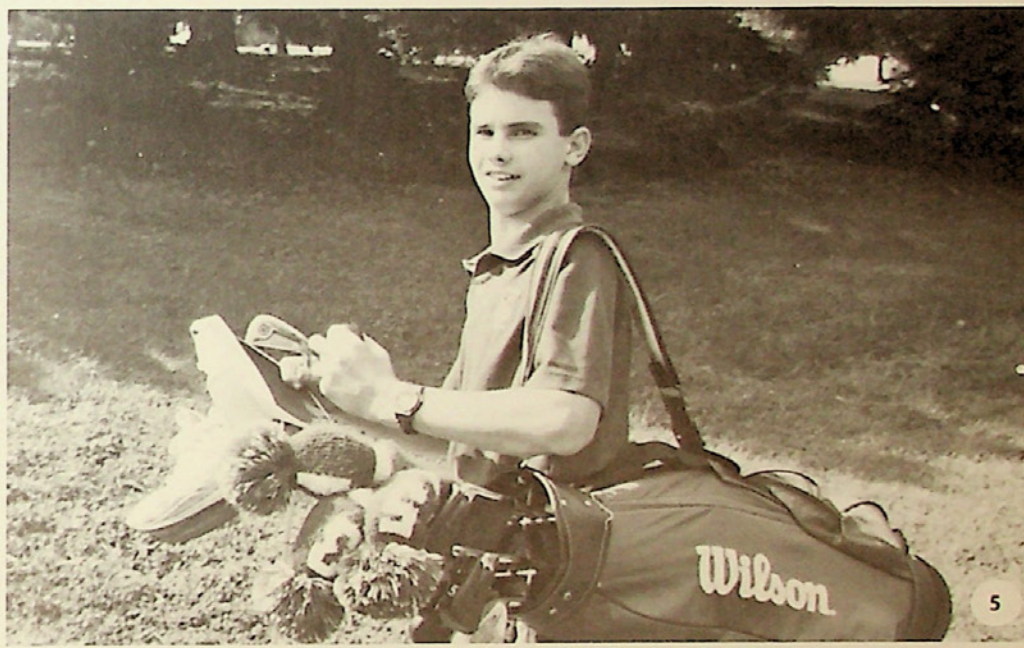

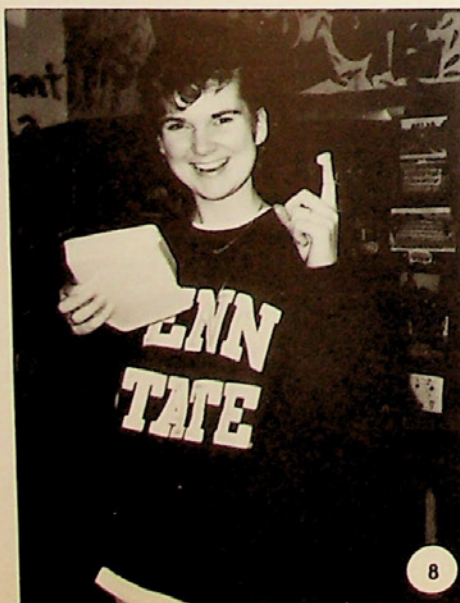

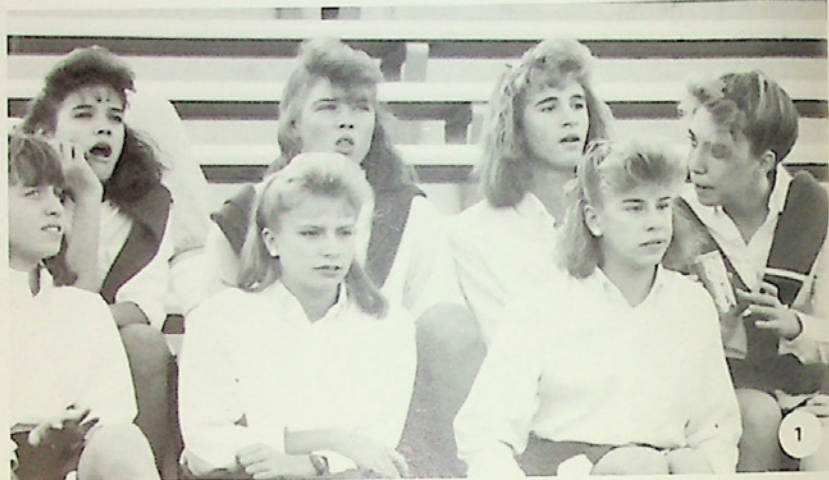

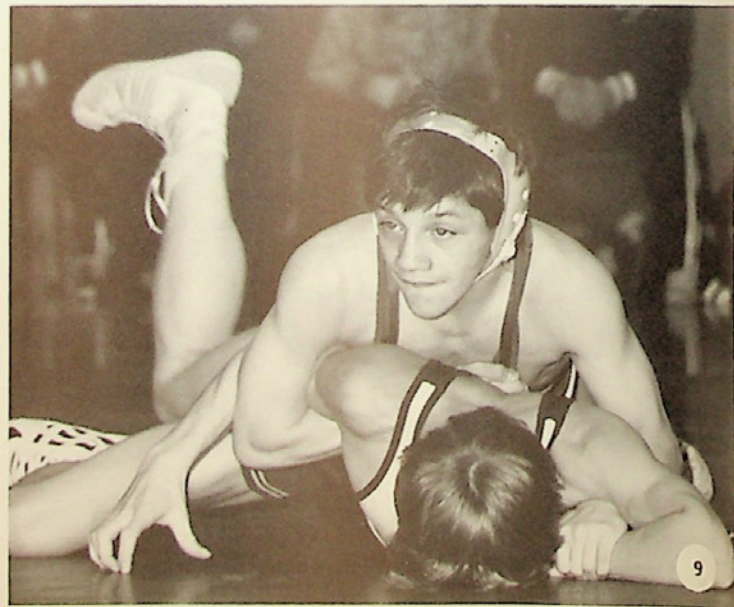
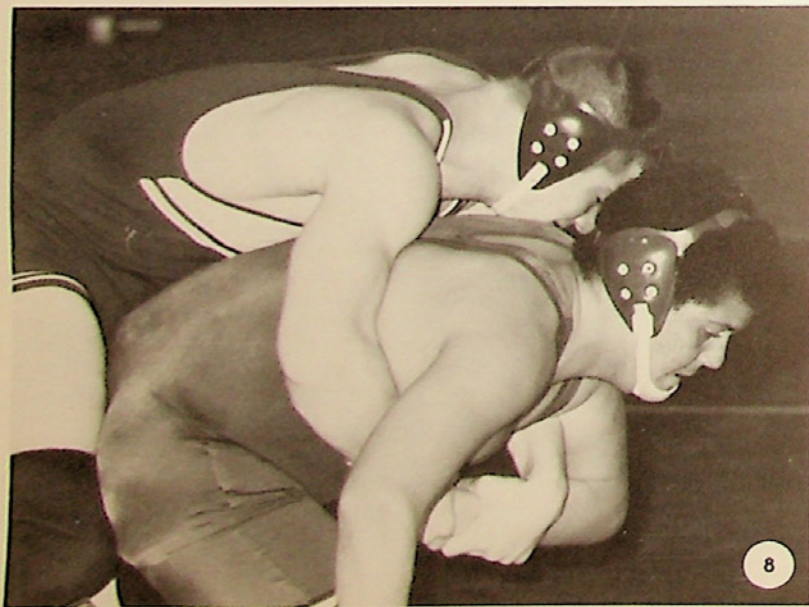
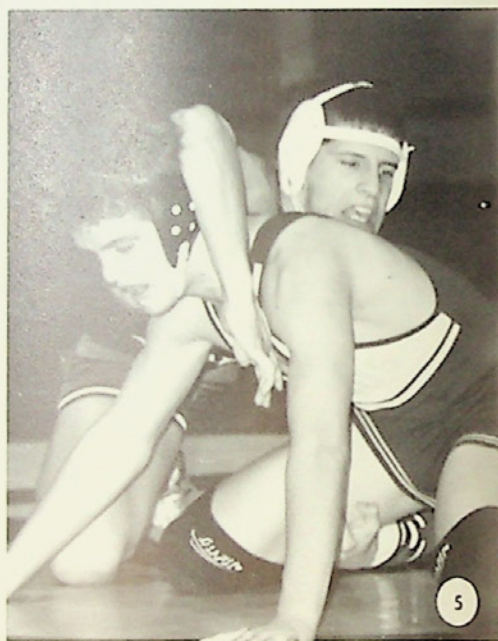
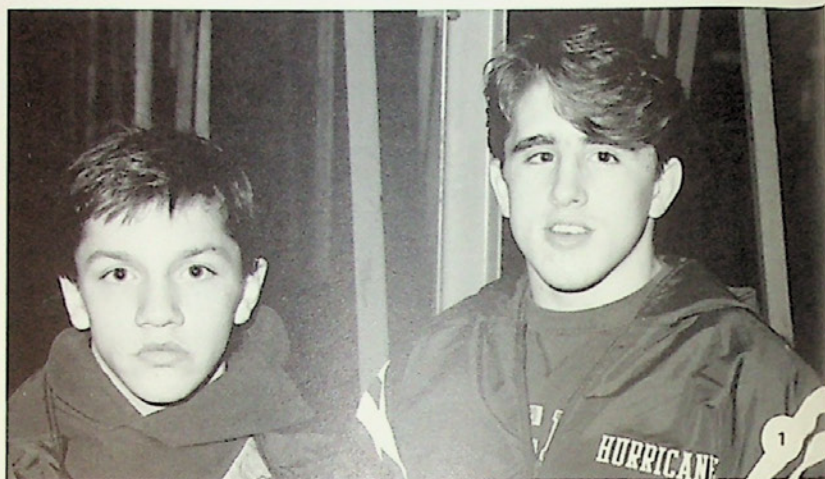


# Setting The Record

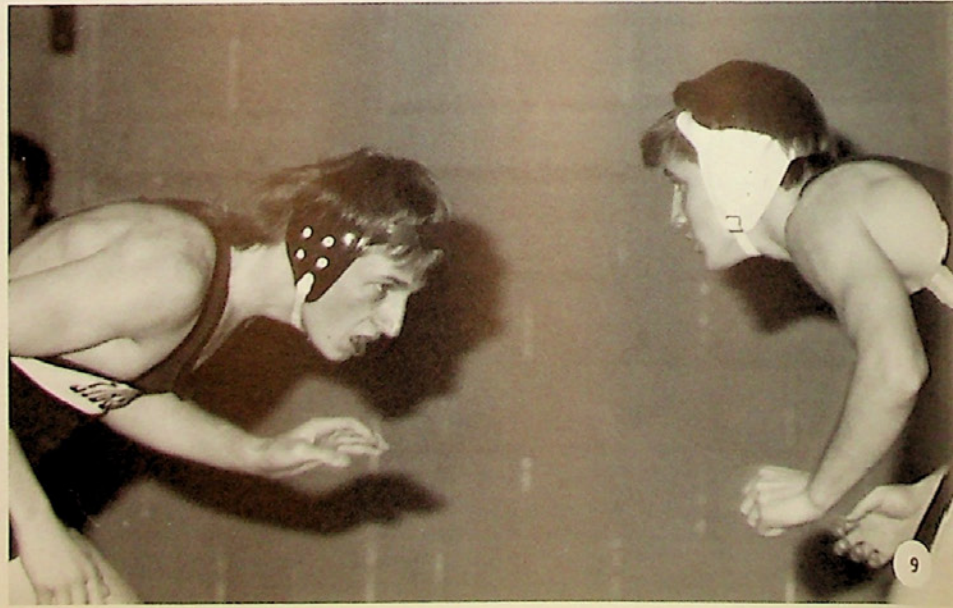


# Pinning Down The Competition

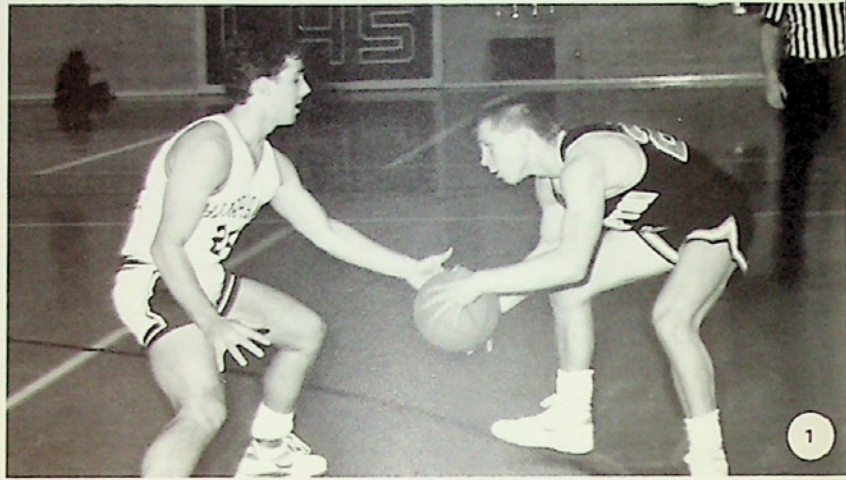

# Winning Ways Return To Liberty

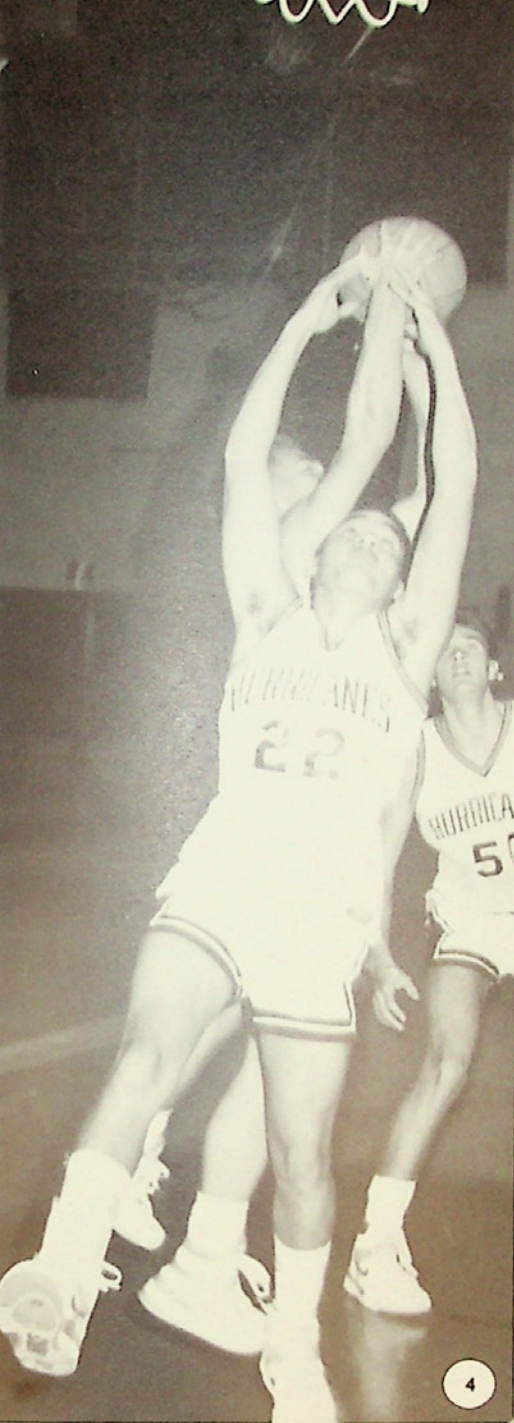

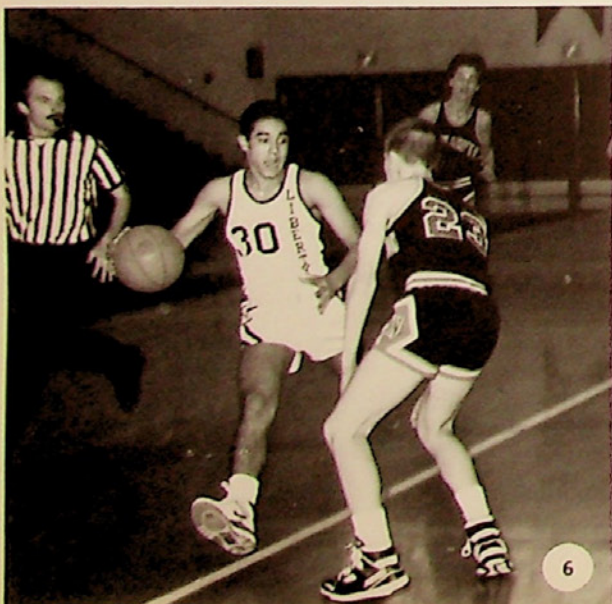

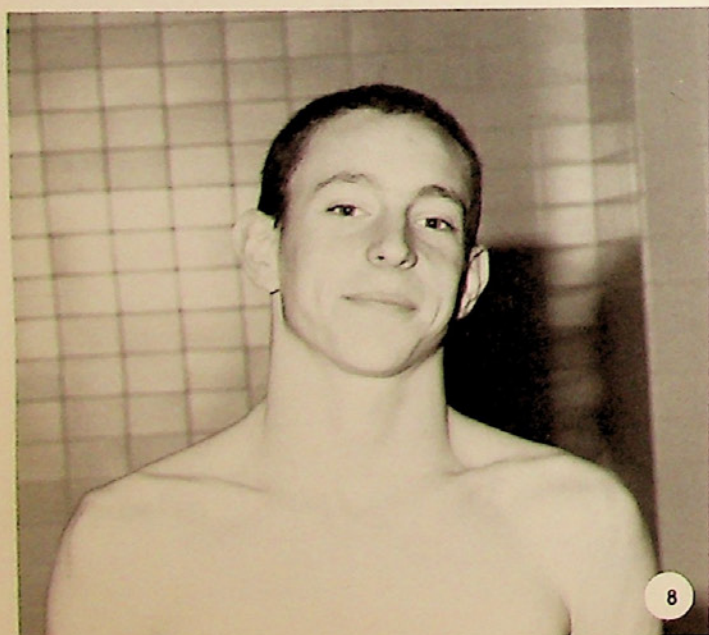
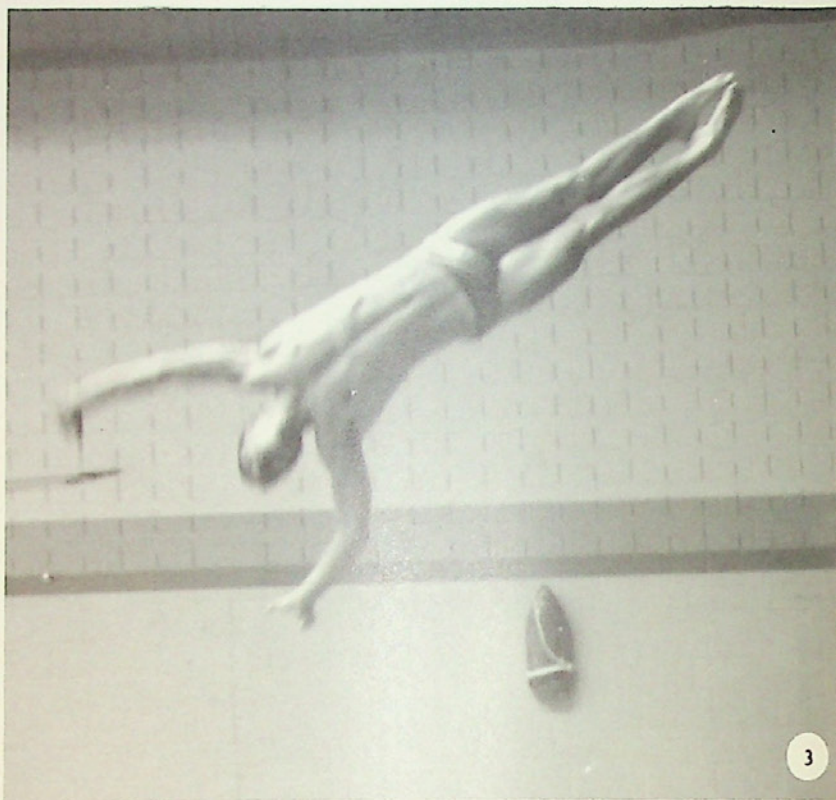


## Shining The Spotlight On Seniors

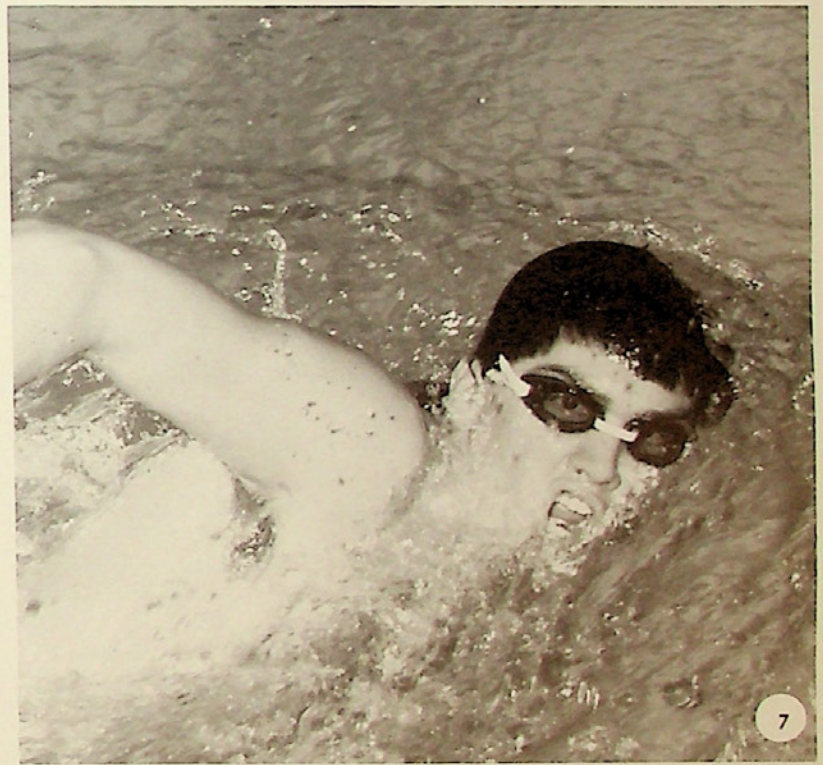

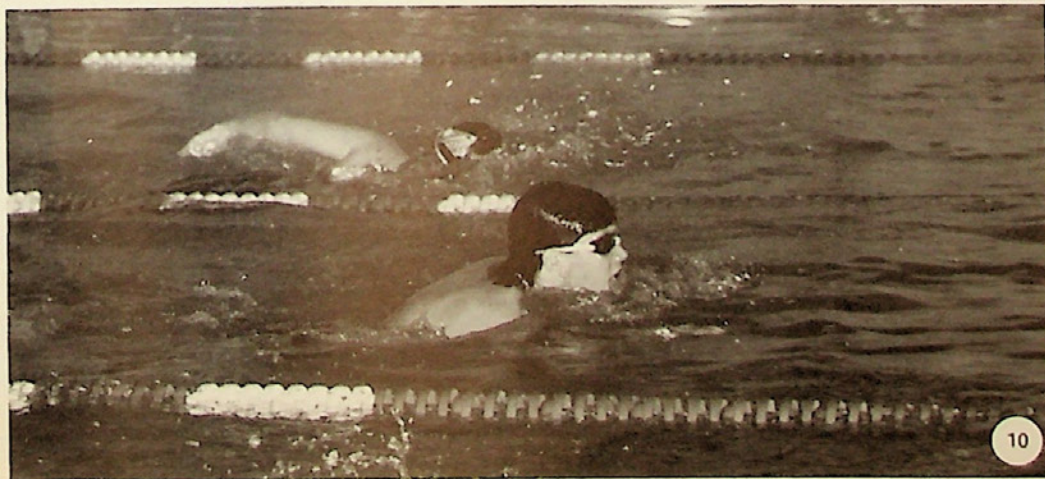

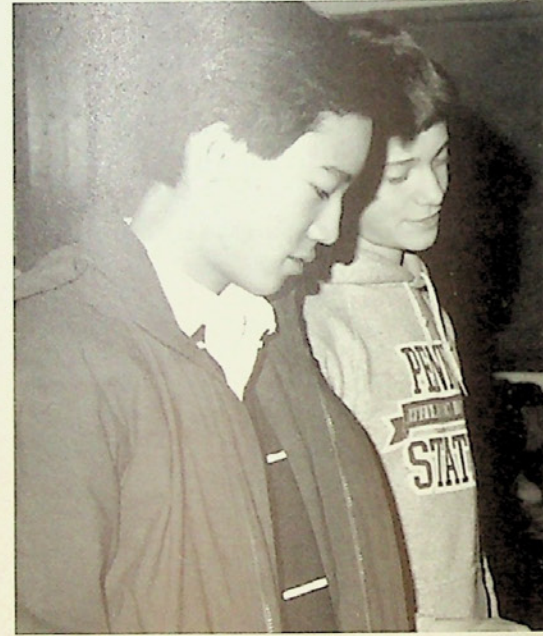


# Blowing The Competition Away

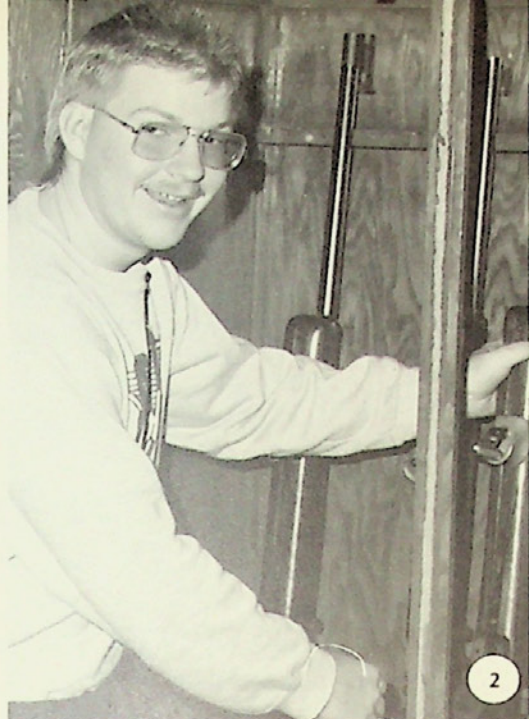

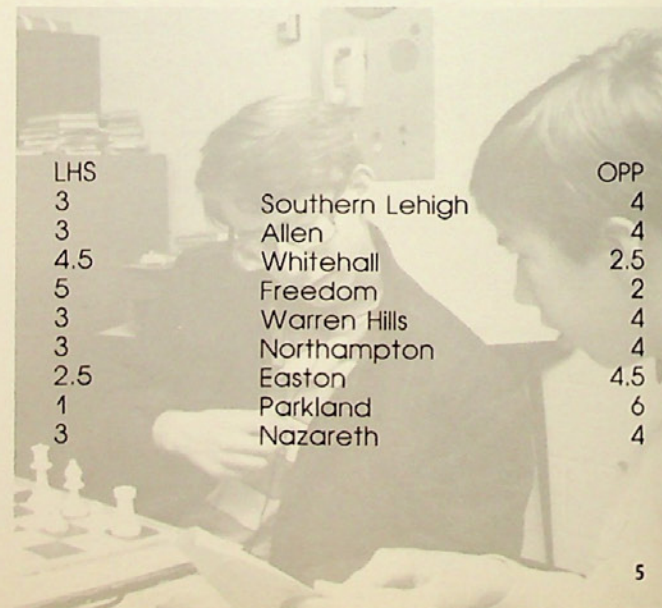
# Checking In

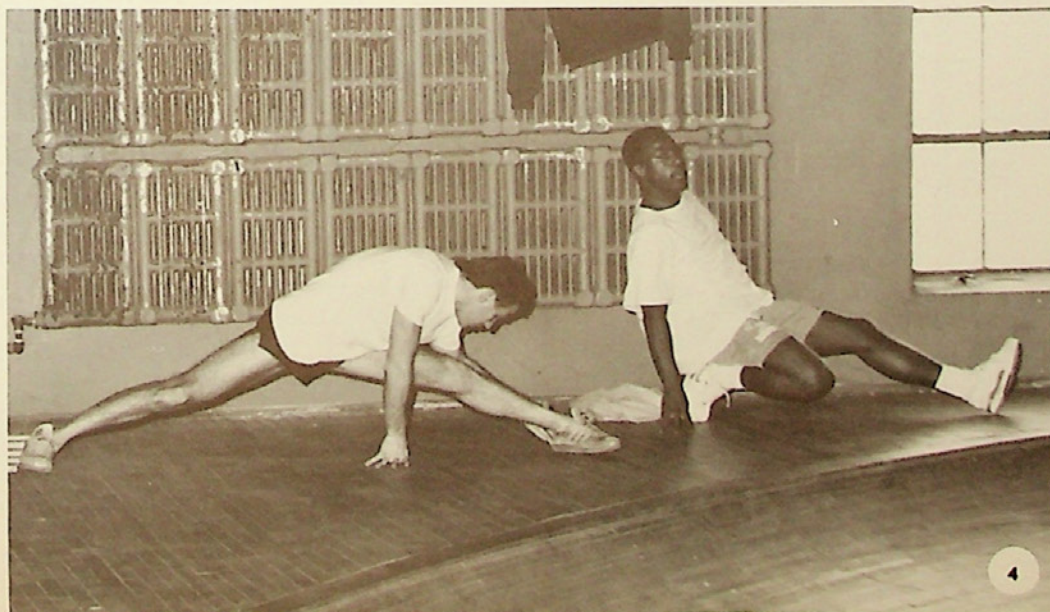
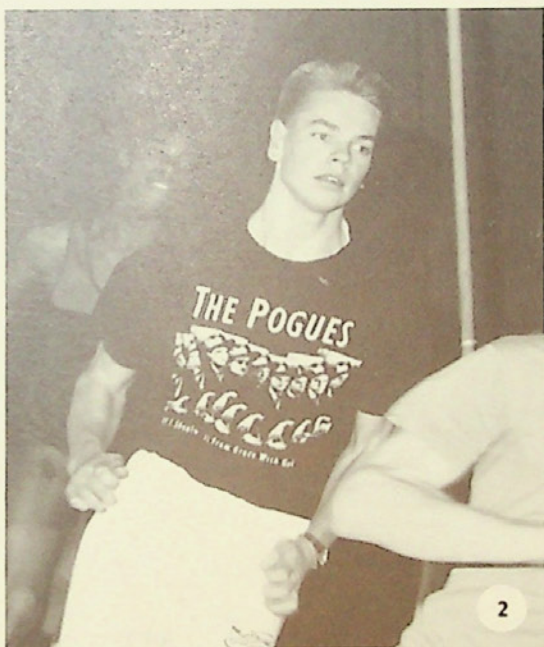
# Running Circles Around The Competition

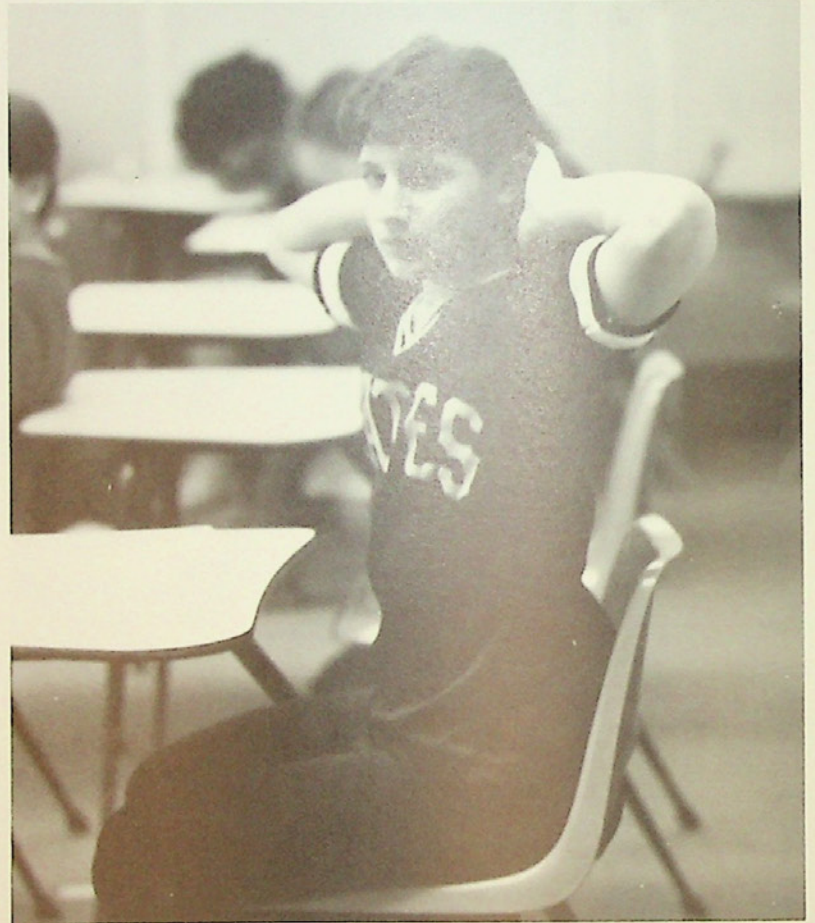

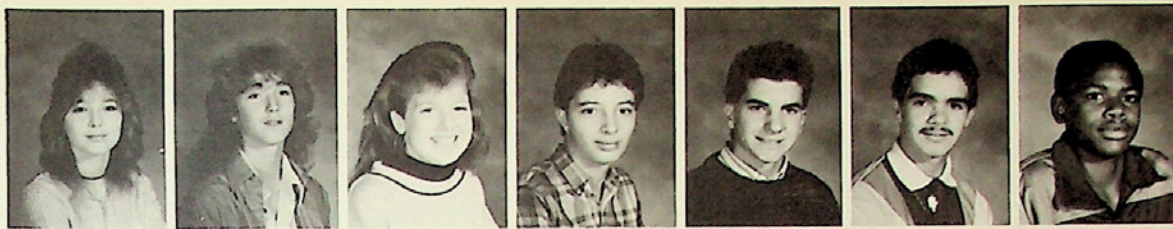
# Freshmen Class Of 1992

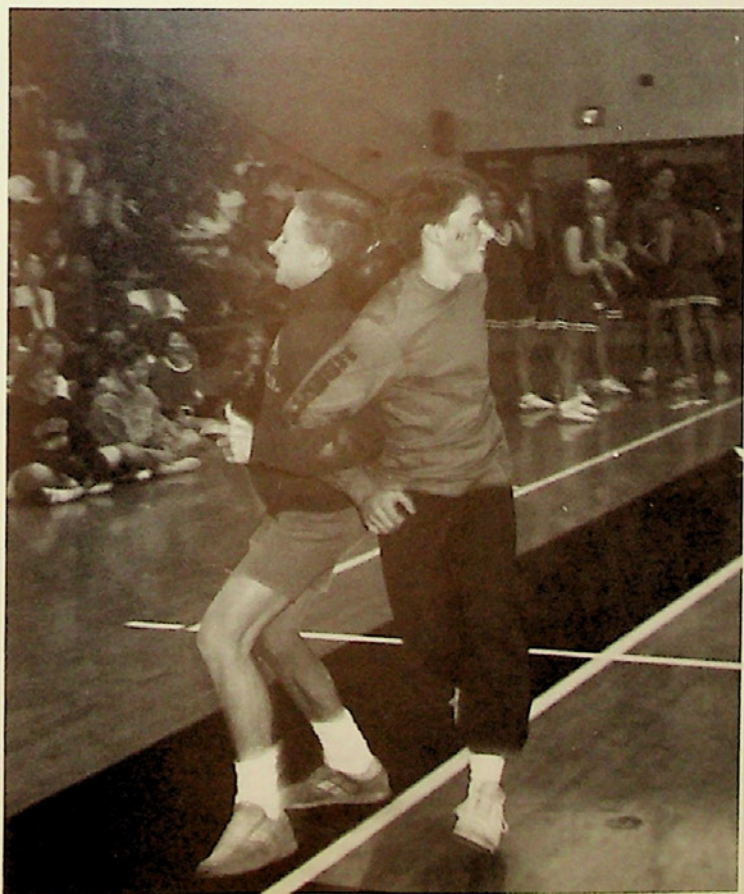
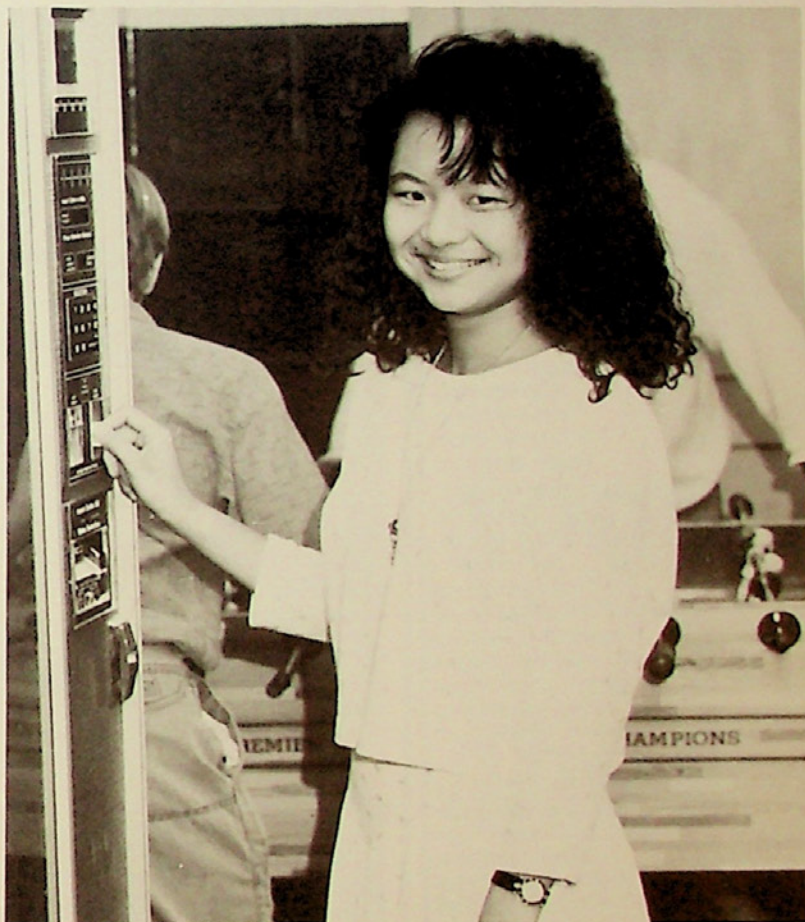




## Juniors Class Of 1990

# Spring One-Acts Create Laughter And Suspense

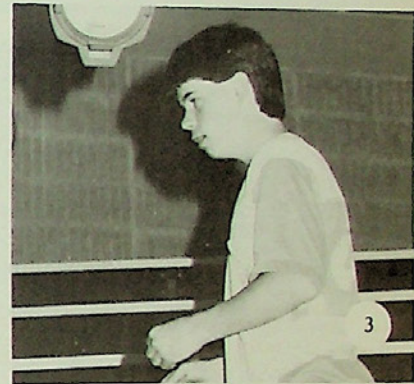

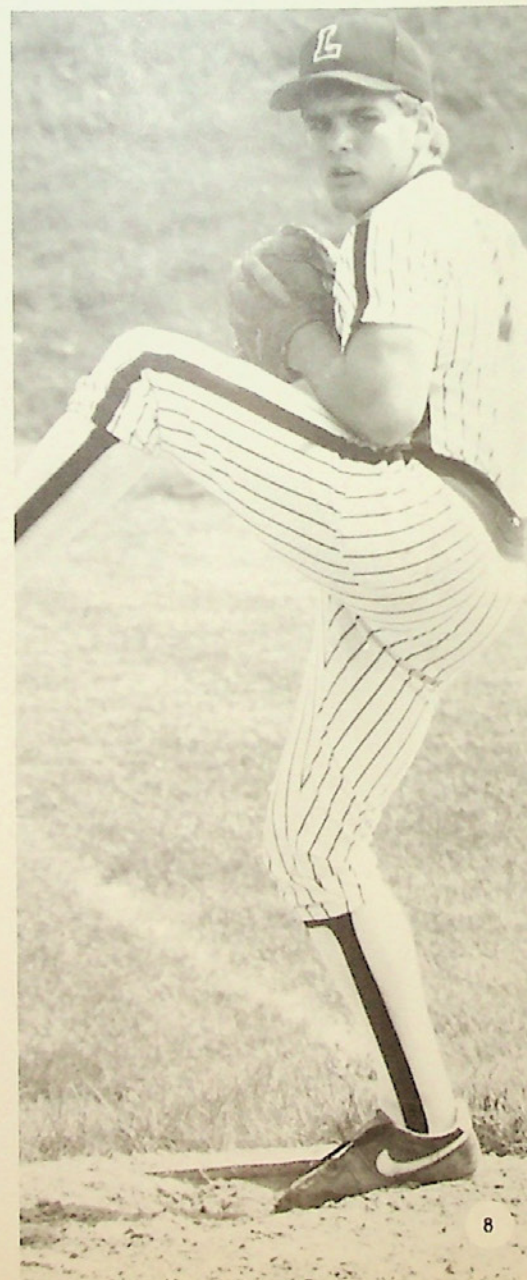
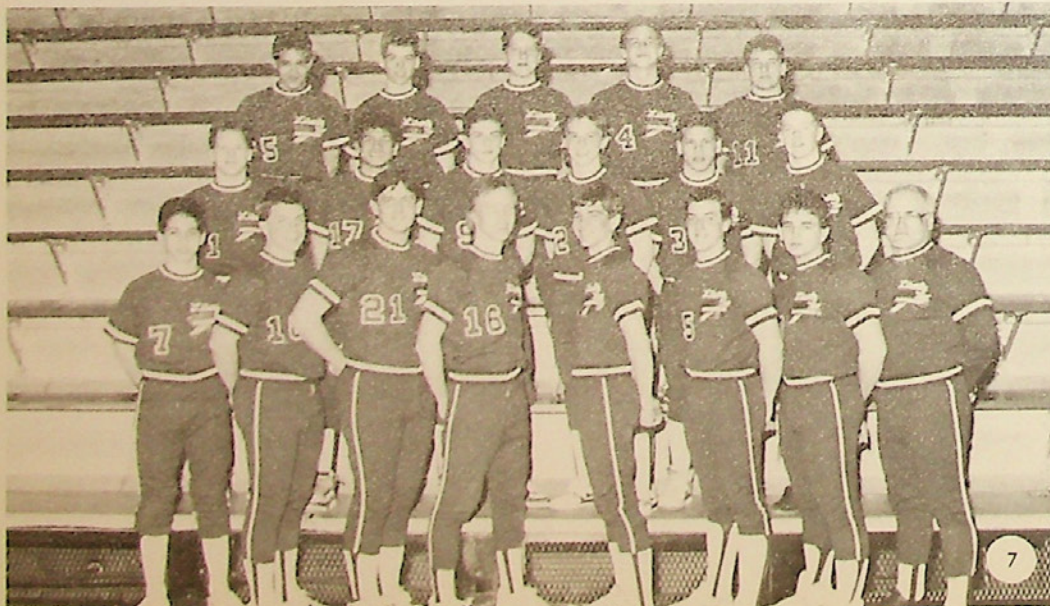


# Hurricanes Dominant In Battle Of Diamonds

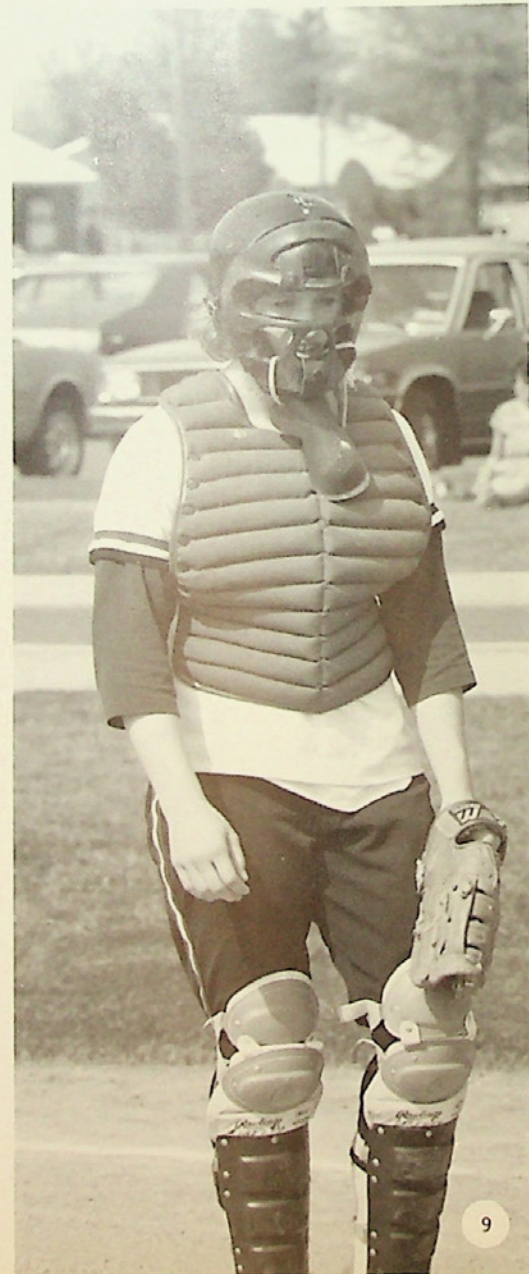


# Girls' Softball Is Big In Spirit

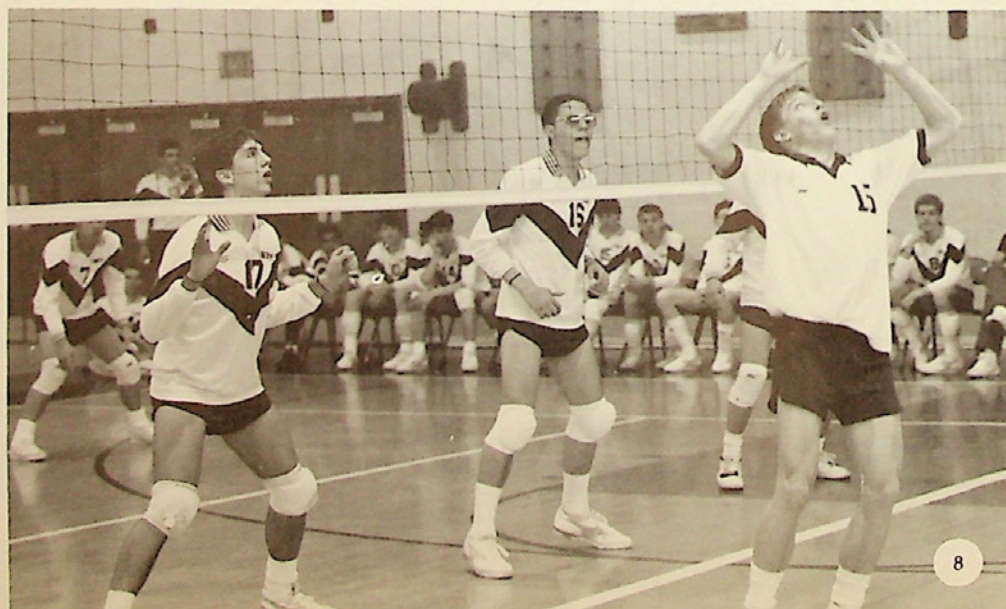
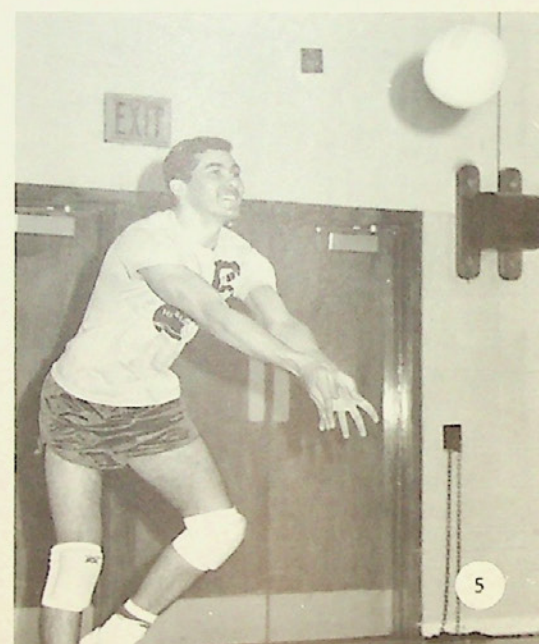


# Boys' Tennis And Volleyball

**Joleen Tocci** was one of the more outstanding members on the girls' track team. **Mario Traca** and **Pat Tocci** proved to be crucial boys' team members.

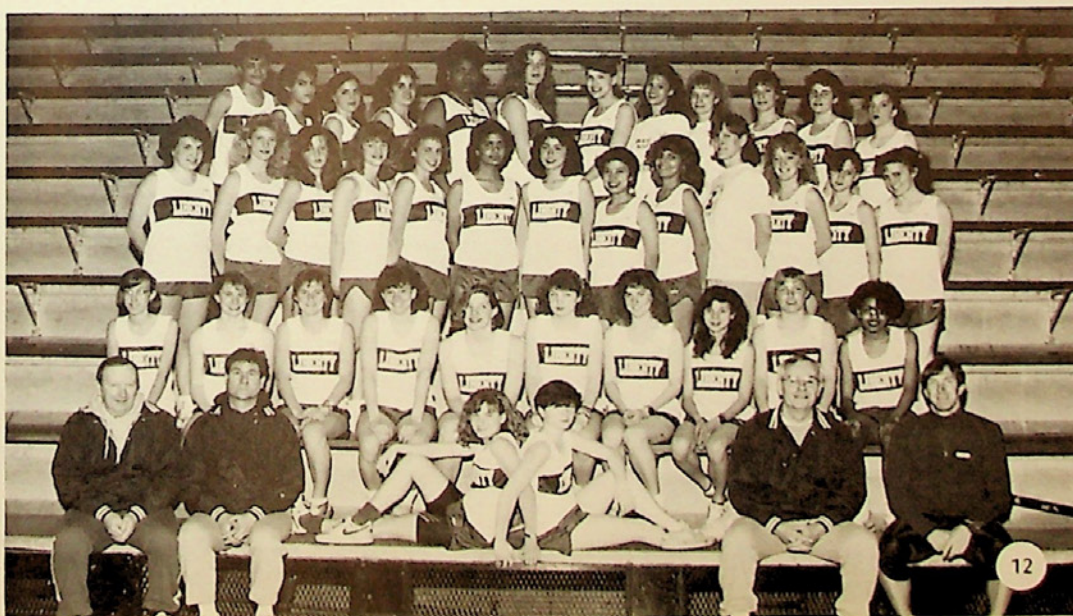

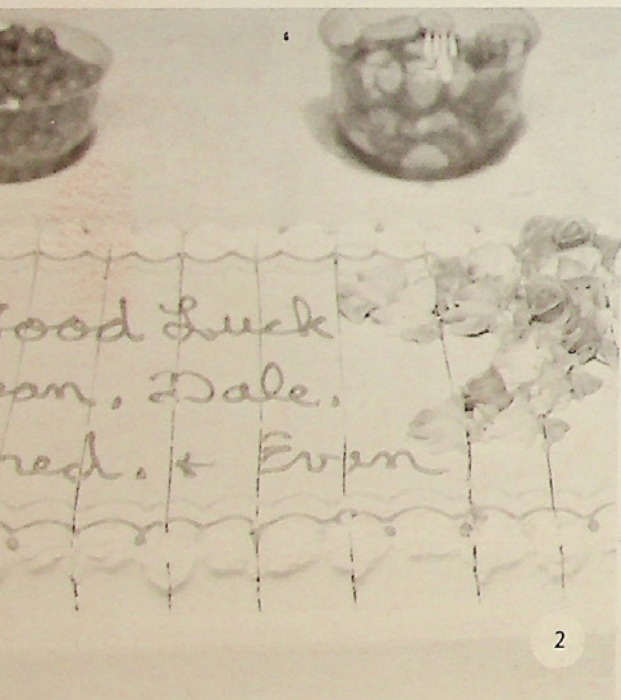


# L.H.S. Faculty Bids Farewell
