Released In Red Advance

T/4 Daniel H. Ritter, who was held in a German prison camp since September, 1944, has been released by the advancing Russian army, according to a War Department message based on reports received from the U. S. Military Mission in Moscow.

Previously reported missing in action, Ritter informed his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Robert Ritter, Newburg, Nazareth P. I. that he was being held in a German prison camp on a card dated October 30, 1944. He also stated he had been wounded in action and had recovered from his injury.

A Nazareth High School graduate, the young Army Engineer entered the service in February, 1942. He was sent to Camp Polk, La., for basic training and sent overseas in June of last year.

A brother, Staff Sergeant Thomas Ritter, is recovering from injuries in a hospital in France.
