## Pvt. Frank Thom Released From German Prison

A German prisoner since last December when von Rundstedt made his push in Luxembourg, Pvt. Frank Thom, 1165 Mechanic Street, this city, and husband of Wanda Thom, New York City, has been liberated, according to a letter received from him by his wife.

The local soldier, together with a number of other Americans, was released on March 31, by one of the units of the hard driving American armies.

A letter from him, dated April 2, has been received by his wife. He tells her that following a hospital checkup he expects to be returned to the United States. He is the

father of two children, one of whom is eight months old, who he has never seen.

A graduate of Liberty High School, he played with the school's soccer, football and baseball teams, and also with other local teams. He attended Lehigh University.

A member of an infantry unit, he was inducted at New York City, 18 months ago, and received his preliminary training at Camp Blanding, Fla. He has been overseas since July of last year.
