Capt. Reynolds Wins British Military Cross

Capt. Frank E. Reynolds, chaplain, U. S. Army, of 1112 Maple St., was awarded the British Military Cross "for distinguished service and devotion to duty." Presentation of the award was made by Lord Halifax Tuesday, March 26, in Washington, D. C.

The citation accompanying the award read in part, "During the action on Makin Atoll, in November, 1943. Capt. Reynolds of his own volition and with utter disregard for his personal safety went into and beyond the firing lines to give aid and comfort to the wounded and assist in locating and recovering the bodies of the dead despite the fact that he was clearly exposed and constantly under fire from enemy lines and a well concealed enemy machine gun."

Capt. Reynolds is a graduate of Liberty High School, Ursinus College and Lancaster Seminary. He entered the service in August, 1942, and after attending school in Harvard, Mass., served with various army units throughout the States. Assigned to overseas duty in April, 1942, the young chaplain served in Hawaii, Makin and Saipan, before returning to the States in April of last year. Discharged in January, Capt. Reynolds is now doing graduate work at Yale Divinity School.

He is married to the former Ruth Roth, of Reading, Pa., and is the father of two children, John Calvin, 4, and a two-month-old daughter, Mary Jane. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Israel Reynolds, of the Maple St. address.
