3 Servicemen From Area Get Wings, Bars

Among young men from all over the nation who received silver navigator's wings this week during graduation exercises at Hondo, Texas, a huge aerial navigation training base, are: Lt. Harry C. Mikolajczyk, 25, son of Mr. and Mrs. Ludwig Mikolajczyk, Easton, R. D. 2, and Lt. Edward V. Shanahan, 24, son of Mrs. Alice E. Shanahan, Pennsylvania Avenue, Bangor.

Graduated yesterday from the Advanced Twin-Engine Army Flying school, Columbus Air Field, Columbus, Miss., was James E. Hewett, 24, son of Mr. and Mrs. James Hewett, of 311 Mountain Avenue, Pen Argyl. He received the silver wings of a flying officer and a commission as a second lieutenant in the Army Air Forces. Lieut. Hewett entered pilot training last August and attended flying schools at Carlstrom Field, Arcadia, Fla., and Bainbridge, Ga. He is a graduate of Pen Argyl high school in 1935 and attended Akron University, Akron, Ohio. He is celebrating his birthday anniversary today.

Lieut. Mikolajczyk was graduated from Nazareth high school with the class of 1935 and enlisted in the Signal Corps in March, 1941. He was stationed at Fort Sam Houston for a year and then transferred to the Army Air Forces.

Mikolajczyk and Shanahan are qualified to navigate giant Allied bombers to Axis targets anywhere in the world.
