Dr. S. H. Mirbach Plans To Resume Practice Soon

Dr. S. H. Mirbach, released from the Army Medical Corps Oct. 10, 1945, will resume his practice in this city at 81 East Broad Street, shortly.

Dr. Mirbach entered the service Jan. 16, 1943, as a first lieutenant. He was later promoted to the rank of captain while with the 17th Airborne and 5th Red Diamond Division, which spent 11 months in combat as part of Patton's 3rd Army. He received five campaign stars for participation in the Normandy, Northern France, Rhineland, Ardennes and Central Germany campaigns. In addition he was awarded the Bronze Star Medal for "distinctive service in action against the enemy."

While overseas Dr. Mirbach was stationed in Ireland, France, England, Germany, Luxembourg and

Czechoslovakia as a member of the 5th Medical Battalion. He is married to the former Eleanor Rager, daughter of Dr. and Mrs. S. E. Rager, of Kutztown. Dr. Mirbach's last station was at Camp Campbell, Ky., from where he was discharged.

Dr. Mirbach graduated from Jefferson Medical College in 1937 and interned at Sacred Heart Hospital. He was on the staff of both the Sacred Heart Hospital, Allentown, and St. Luke's Hospital. He is a member of the American Medical Association, Northampton County Medical Association and the Alpha Omega Alpha, honorary medical society.
