Reported missing thirteen months ago, the young man's parents have received from the Navy Department r. mes-sage indicating that he lost his life in the sinking of his ship, the USS Quincy during an engagement with the Japanese fleet in the battle of save Island, August 9, 1942. Memorial requiem mass will be sung by Father Joseph H. Ostheim-er, rector of St. Peter's Catholic Church at Coplay, tomorrow mora-ing at 9 o'cloc'. Tapler, who graduated from Our Lady of Hungary School i. North-ampton, was within two months of completing 10 years of service in the Navy at the time of his death. Since August 19 of fast year, when Tapler was first reported missing, two other Coplay residents have died in service. Private Anton L. Hirschman was killed in a plane crash near Pope Field, N.
