Ray Christman¹⁹⁴⁵ Nazareth Soldier, Now a Prisoner

Pfc. Raymond J. Christman Jr., son of Mr. and Mrs. Raymond J. Christman Sr., 370 Belvidere Street, Nazareth, who had previously been reported missing in action in Luxembourg by the War Department, is a prisoner of war in Germany, according to a card written in his own hand and received by his parents yesterday. He stated that he was well and his parents should contact the Red Cross for information regarding the sending of letters and packages. The card was dated January 11.

Pfc. Christman, who is 21 years old, entered the U. S. Army on March 4, 1943. He received basic training at Camp Wheeler, Ga., and was an instructor at Fort Meade, Md., before being sent to England in August, 1944. He had seen action in France, Belgium, Germany and Luxembourg and was with the Keystone Pennsylvania 28th Division of the First Army.

He was graduated from Nazareth High School, class of 1942, and prior to entering the service was employed by the Nazareth Planing Mill.
