**Mrs. Jennie Fritzo Has Two Sons in
Army and One in Navy.**

A further culling of families in the Lehigh Valley area reveals an additional three-star mother.

Mrs. Jennie Fritzo, of 1134 Pine Street, Easton, qualified for the ever growing list of three-star mothers in this area, with two sons in the Army and one in the Navy. Another son works long hours building warships, and a fourth is expecting to enter Army service.

Staff Sergeant Ricci Fritzo, 31, entered service nine months ago and has not been home since that time. He is enrolled in a school for glider pilots at Twenty-Nine Palms, Calif. He attended Easton High School and in civilian life served as manager of Swartz Motor Company.

Corporal Pat Fritzo, 29, who re-entered service over a year ago, is attached to a military police battalion at Atterbury, Ind. He was first called to duty with the Easton unit of the National Guard in September, 1940, but was later released under the age law which then applied to 28-year-olds. He was also associated with Swartz Motor Company at one time, and just prior to entering service was employed by Bethlehem Steel Company. He is a former student of Easton High School.

Joseph Fritzo, 25, seaman, second class, who has been in service about ten weeks, is currently stationed at Sampson, N. Y., awaiting assignment to another naval base for advanced training. He attended Easton High School and was employed by Lesile's drug store before entering service. He is married to the former Anna Maida, of 229 West Nesquehoning Street, Easton.
