MITCHELL BOYER, U. S. N., **BURIED AT ARLINGTON**

Bethlehem Native Had Served in Navy for Fifteen Years.

After a mass this morning at SS.
Simon and Jude Church, on West
Broad Street, the remains of Mitchell E. Boyer, C. F. C., U. S. Navy,
were interred this afternoon in Arlington National Cemetery at Washington, D. C., with full military
honors.

Mr. Boyer, who was born in Bethlehem May 13, 1908, was the son of
the late Mr. and Mrs. Albert Boyer.
He was educated in Bethlehem public schools and at the age of 19, enlisted in the U. S. Navy.

From the time he entered the
service, he made very rapid progress
in his chosen field. After his basic
training at Newport, R. I., he served
on several types of fighting ships in
all parts of the world, including
three years of service with the Asiatic fieet in China.

In his branch of the service, Fire
Controlman, he was ordered to the
War College at Washington on several different occasions, for advanced training, always completing
his course at or near the head of
his class.

On June 1 he was again ordered
to Washington for further study,
where he again passed third from
the top of his class. On September
18 he was to have gone on new construction at an East Coast shipyard.
