Lt. Francis Bequette Capozzi has received a Field Promotion to First Lieutenant for action with the 307th Airborne Engineers over and in Holland on September 17th.

Quoting "The Paraglide," the publication of the 82nd Division "The 307th Engineers played a vital role in seizing and holding the famous railway and highway bridges at Nijmegen, Holland, one of the main objectives of the Dutch invasion. The Engineers, carrying on heroically in the face of a withering fire, moved wave after wave of paratroopers across the River Waal in canvas assault boats."

Lt. Capozzi is the son of the Rev. and Mrs. F. C. Capozzi of St. Mary's Episcopal Church, Wind Gap, and husband of the former Gloria Constable of Johnsonburg, Pa.

Lt. Capozzi before enlisting in the armed forces was a printer, employed in the Printery of the Bethlehem Steel Company. He is a brother to Lt. G. F. Bennett Capozzi, U. S. N. R., one time Globe-Times reporter and for four years was carrier for that paper at Wind Gap.
