In referring to his outstanding mission, the 25 year old gunner remarked, "Munich, Germany, was the roughest mission I flew on. The Jerry ground gunners had their sights on us all of the lime we were on the bomb run and they came too close for romfort with the flak. Al-though our plane was splat-tered by bursts several times, nobody was hurt on the crew. Guess we were just lucky be-cause when we reached our base and landed, we counted over 50 flak holes in the fuse-lage of the aircraft." This veteran airman flies with a group that has received three War Department Cita-tions for extraordinary combat services. The group is the old-est American unit in the Med-iterranean theatre and were the first to drop bombs on Eu-

iterranean theatre and were the first to drop bombs on Eu-rope from this theatre. Sgt. Birkel is a graduate of Liberty High School and at-tended Kutztown State Teach-ers College. He entered the Armed Forces in November, 1942, and received his wings at Tyndall Gunnery School. He also wears the Good Conduct Medal and the European-Afri-can-Middle Eastern theater vibbon with two campaign tars. tars.
