Hellertown M.D. Made Captain In Burma

Dr. Edward B. Deibert, Hellertown physician in military service in Burma, has been promoted to the rank of Captain in the Army Medical Corps. He was commissioned First Lieutenant in April, 1944 and reported for active duty at Carlisle Barracks, May 20, 1944. He later served in the Medical Department of Lawson General Hospital, Atlanta, Ga., qualifying as an internist before leaving that institution to join an Engineer Regiment at Claiborne, La.

Capt. Deibert went overseas in November and is now located on the Stillwell Road with the only Dispensary over a 90-mile stretch of road.

The son of Dr. and Mrs. E. J. Deibert, 411 Main Street, Hellertown, he was graduated from Lehigh University with the class of 1936 and from the University of Pennsylvania in 1940. He served his internship at St. Luke's Hospital and practiced in Hellertown two and one half years before entering the service.
