Lieutenant Raymond Faust, Bethlehem R. D. 4, has been promoted to the grade of First Lieutenant somewhere in England. He is a navigator on a C-47 and is attached to the First Allied Airborne Army commanded by General Lewis H. Brerton. His organization has participated in four major invasions, the Sicilian, Italian, French and Dutch campaigns. For outstanding achievement during the D-Day invasion by the Airborne group over the peninsula of Normandy, his outfit received the Distinguished Unit Citation. He was awarded the Purple Heart for wounds received on D-Day in addition to the Air Medal, and one Bronze Oak Leaf Cluster.

Lt. Faust entered the service in February, 1943, and received his wings at Selman Field, Monroe, La. His wife, the former Virginia Andrews, and three children reside at the Bethlehem address. First Lt. Faust is a graduate of Liberty High School and was employed by the Bethlehem Steel Company in civilian life.
