A few months later he was appointed to the battalion staff of the 720th Military Police and then moved on to Tokyo, assigned to the First Cav-alry Division, arriving there Sep-tember 11, 1945, before the American Army had officially taken over. To return to the States, Capt. Kempfer was assigned to the Amer-ical Division, boarded the "Gen-eral Ernst" bound for Seattle, Washington, arriving at the western port on November 28. He was then

port on November 28. He was then sent to the separation center at In-diantown Gap, where he was placed on terminal leave.

At Harrisburg, he was joined by Mrs. Sara Mendsen Kempfer who had been in the employ of The Woodring-Roberts Corporation for the past ten years.
