Local GI's On Way Home From Front

Cpl. Thomas L. Davis, 140 Fifteenth Avenue, and Pfc Marcus Moyer Jr., 76 West Spruce Street, are on their way home from Europe with the Eighth Infantry Division, the division which accounted for 21 times its weight in Germans by taking 316,187 prisoners during ten months of combat. The two Bethlehem soldiers fought with the Eighth in the Normandy breakthrough, the capture of Brest and the bitter fight in the Hurtgen Forest.

Cpl. Davis was employed by the Bethlehem Steel Company before he entered the service in October, 1941. During the 19 months he served overseas, he participated in the Normandy, France and Germany campaigns, and was awarded the Meritorious Service decoration. He is a member of SS. Simon and Jude Church and attended Liberty High School.

Pfc. Moyer entered the Army on July 26, 1941, and has been overseas with the Eighth for the past 10 months. He was awarded the Combat Infantryman's badge, Pre-Pearl Harbor ribbon, and the Good Conduct Medal while participating in the same campaigns. Pfc. Moyer is a graduate of Liberty High School.
