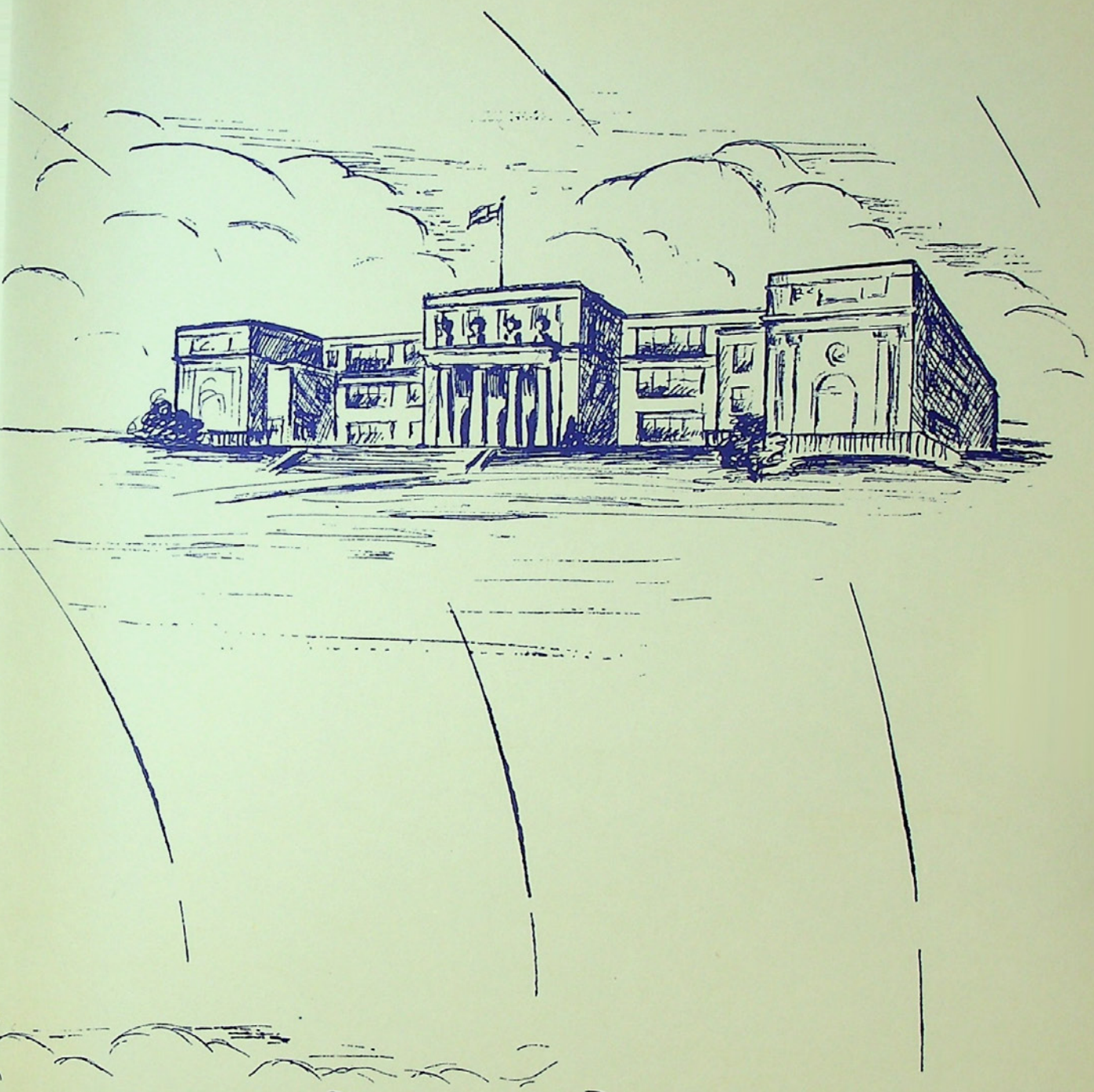

Dear Mr. Klein,

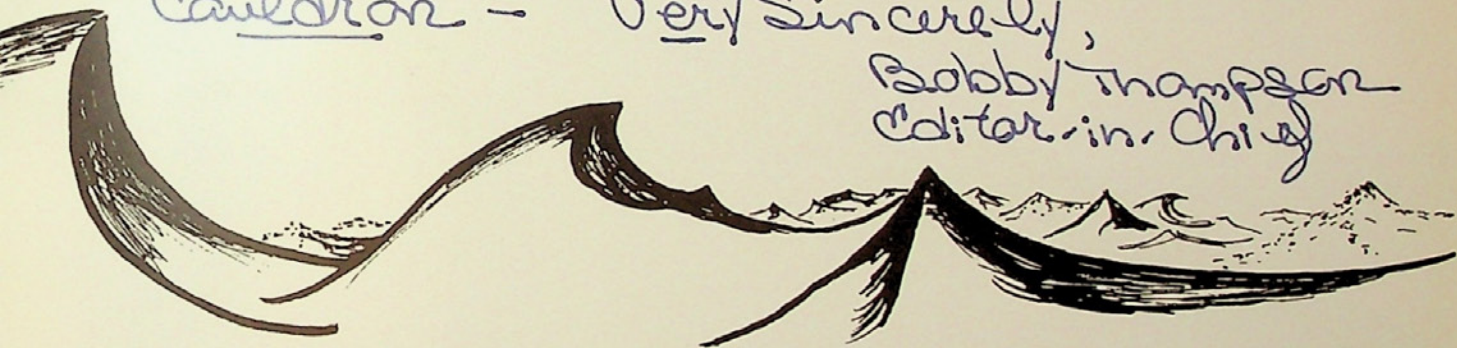

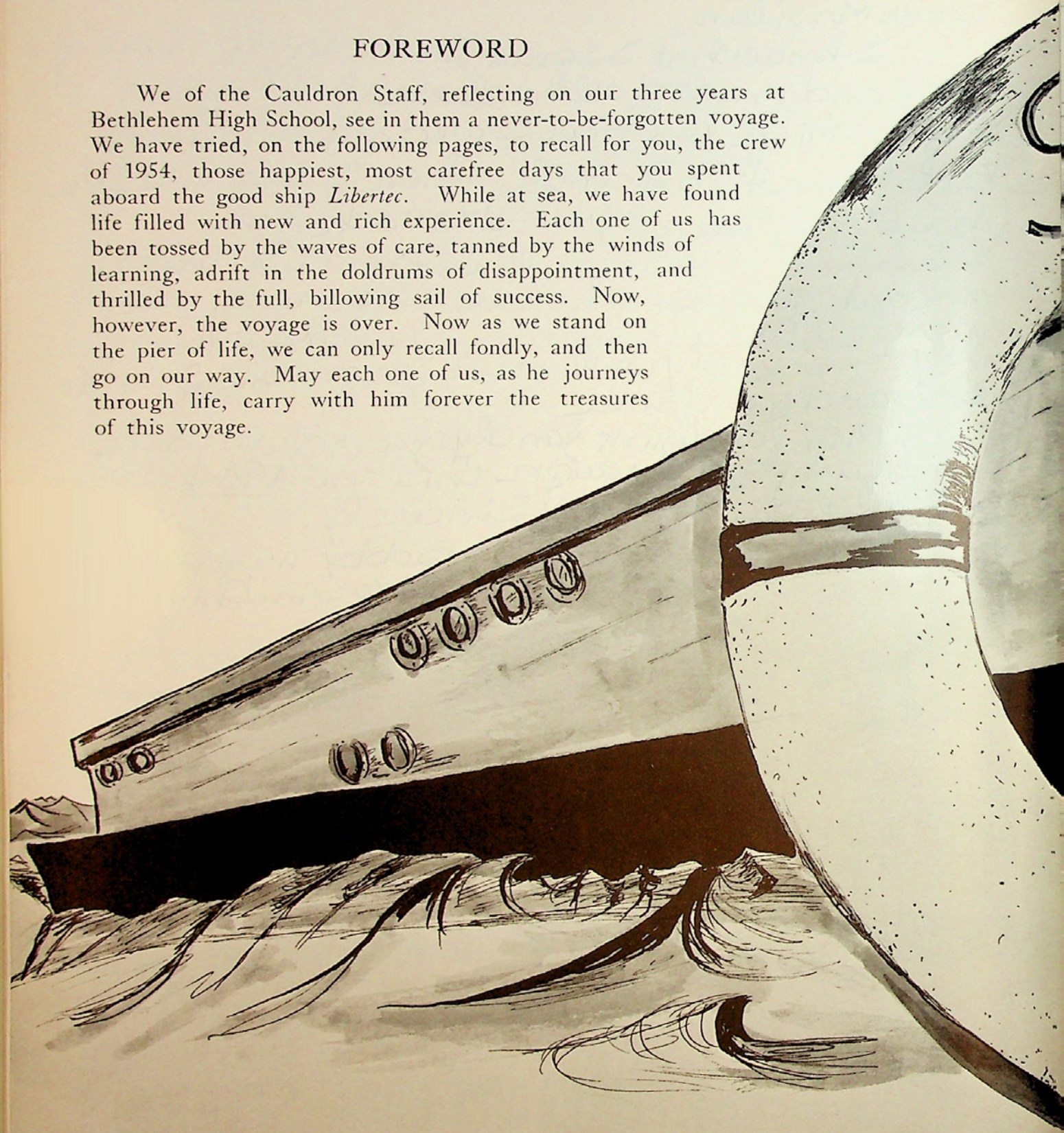


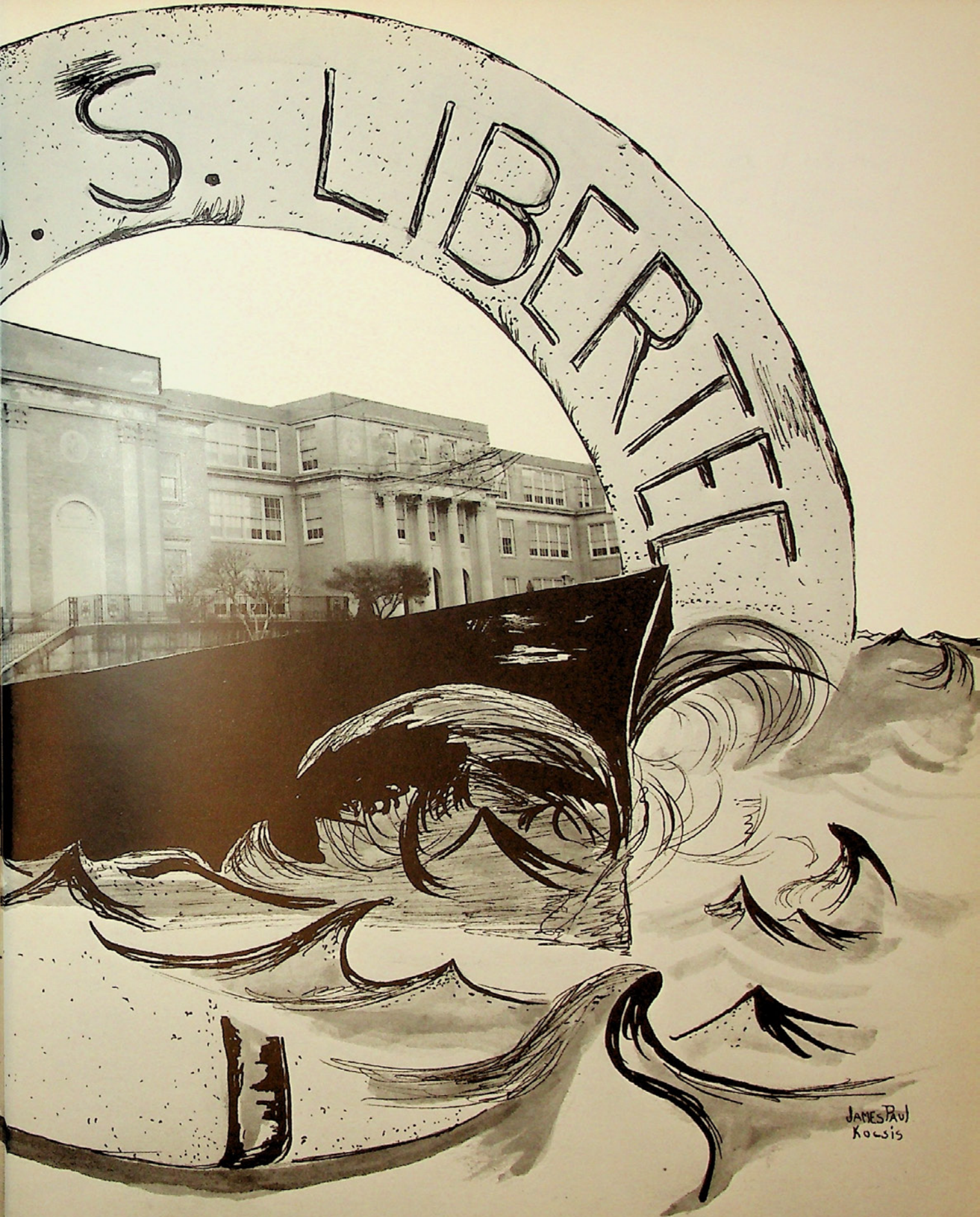

We know she can retire with a feeling of success and satisfaction from a job well done.



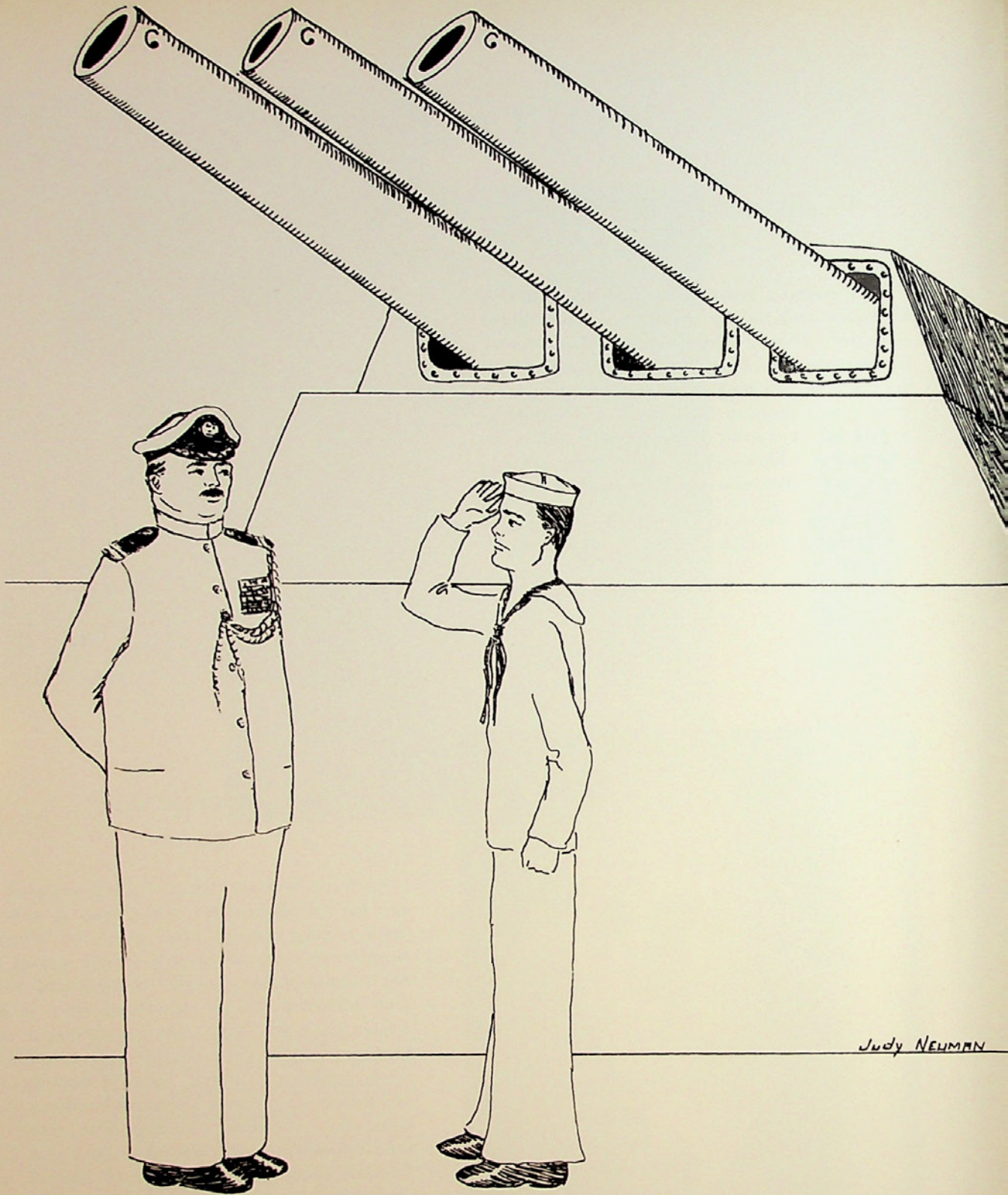

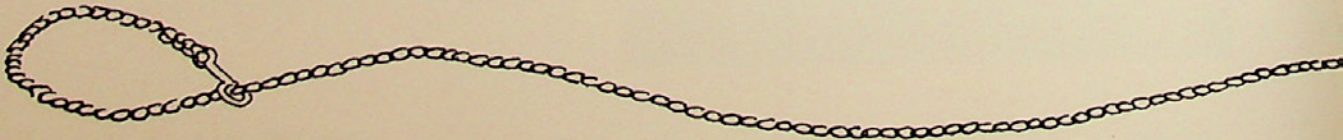

We who know "Pop" will always be grateful to him for his advice and interest in our education and in our personal welfare.

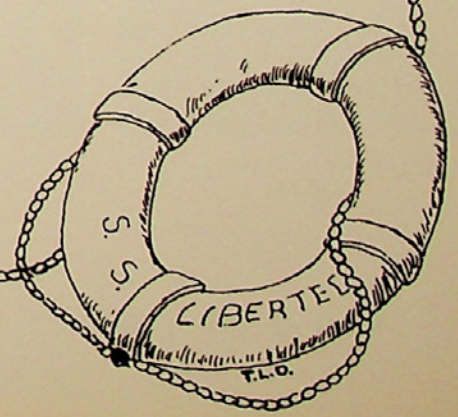

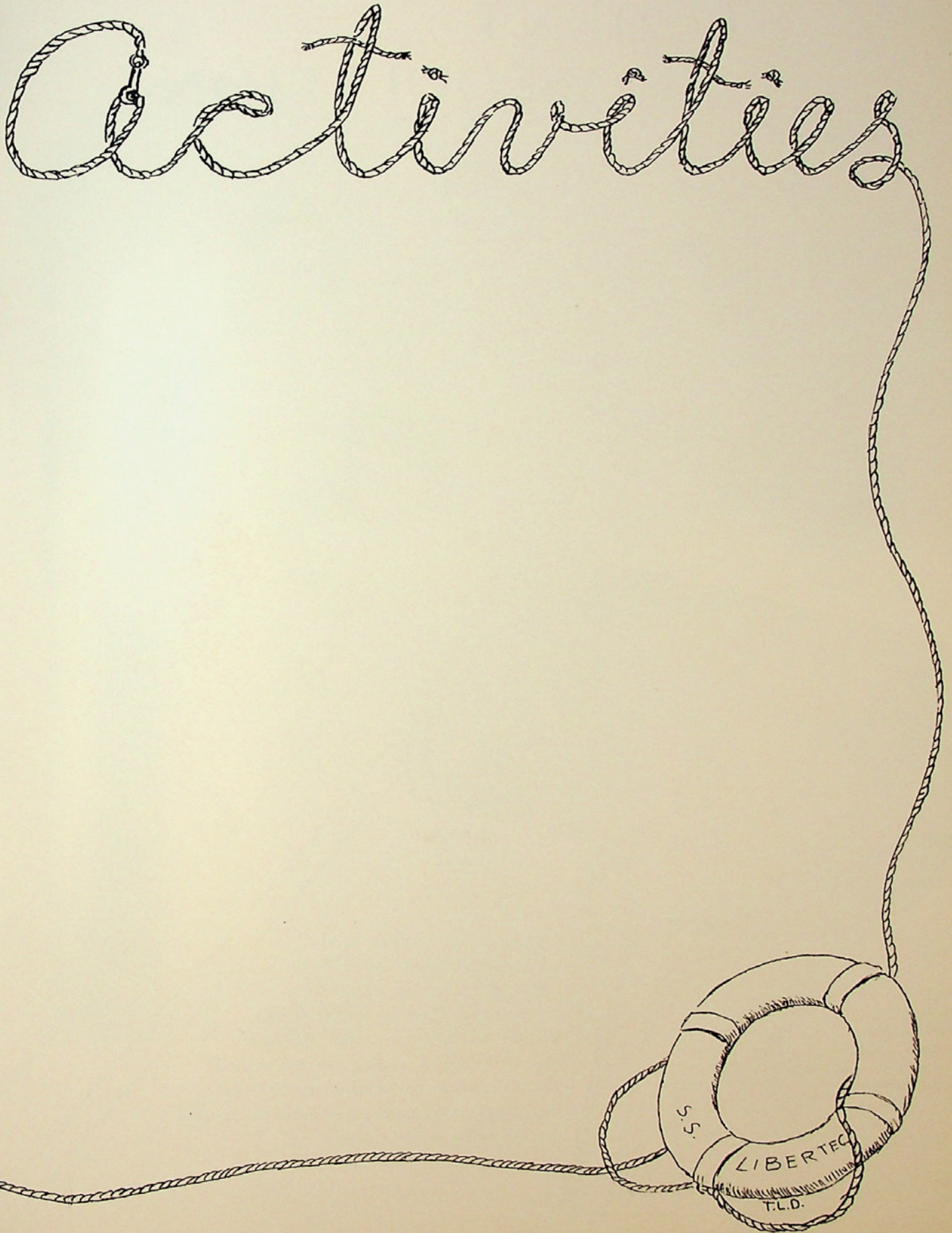

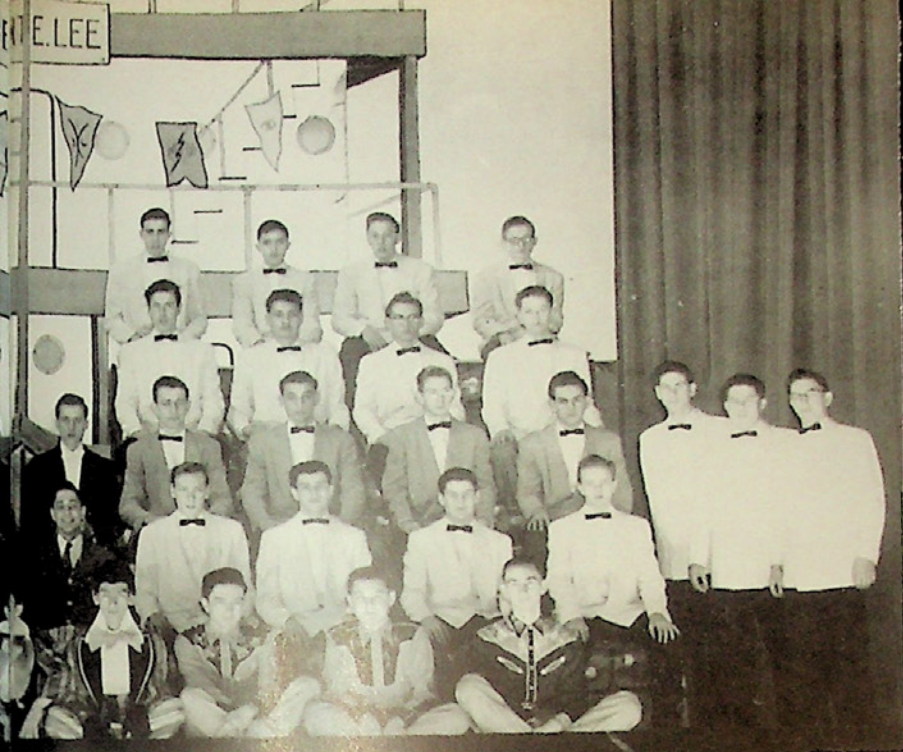
The Glee Club under the Direction of Mrs. Aungst, a new member of the faculty, is proud to have gone through another productive year of singing.

DRAFTING

Drawing has been handed down by man through every phase of history. Primitive man used drawing as a means of relating his stories. Later man revealed his creative power in the beauty of structural and architectural achievements. From these early forms of drawing, man has received a way of talking by picture known as drafting.

Drafting opens the door to a world of opportunities, where a boy has a chance to create and help build things beyond his wildest dreams. Through drafting, man has been able to harness great rivers, cross oceans, and do many other things once thought impossible.

Tech High School offers boys a fine opportunity to learn this wonderful trade. Here the boys are offered a three or four year course, depending upon the time he enters the school. Boys entering in the ninth grade are compelled to take one year of mechanical drawing. Here they are taught geometric figures, orthographic projections, and general arrangement.

At the end of this year, they are given a choice of shops. If they decide to remain in drafting they are given a choice as to what type (architectural, structural, or mechanical) they wish to follow. The boys are then divided into two groups, the first year draftsman and the second year draftsman.

In the eleventh grade, the boys are given an advanced course in drafting that prepares them to go into industry. Here they are taught standards and other important information.

The twelfth grade course is one that is planned to cover everything they have learned. This usually reveals any faults or difficulties they have, so they can be corrected before they graduate.

MACHINE SHOP

Instructors.....MR. H. ROSS, MR. VAN HORN

One of the many shops at Tech is the Machine Shop. There are two of these shops, one located in the basement of the school and the other on the second floor.

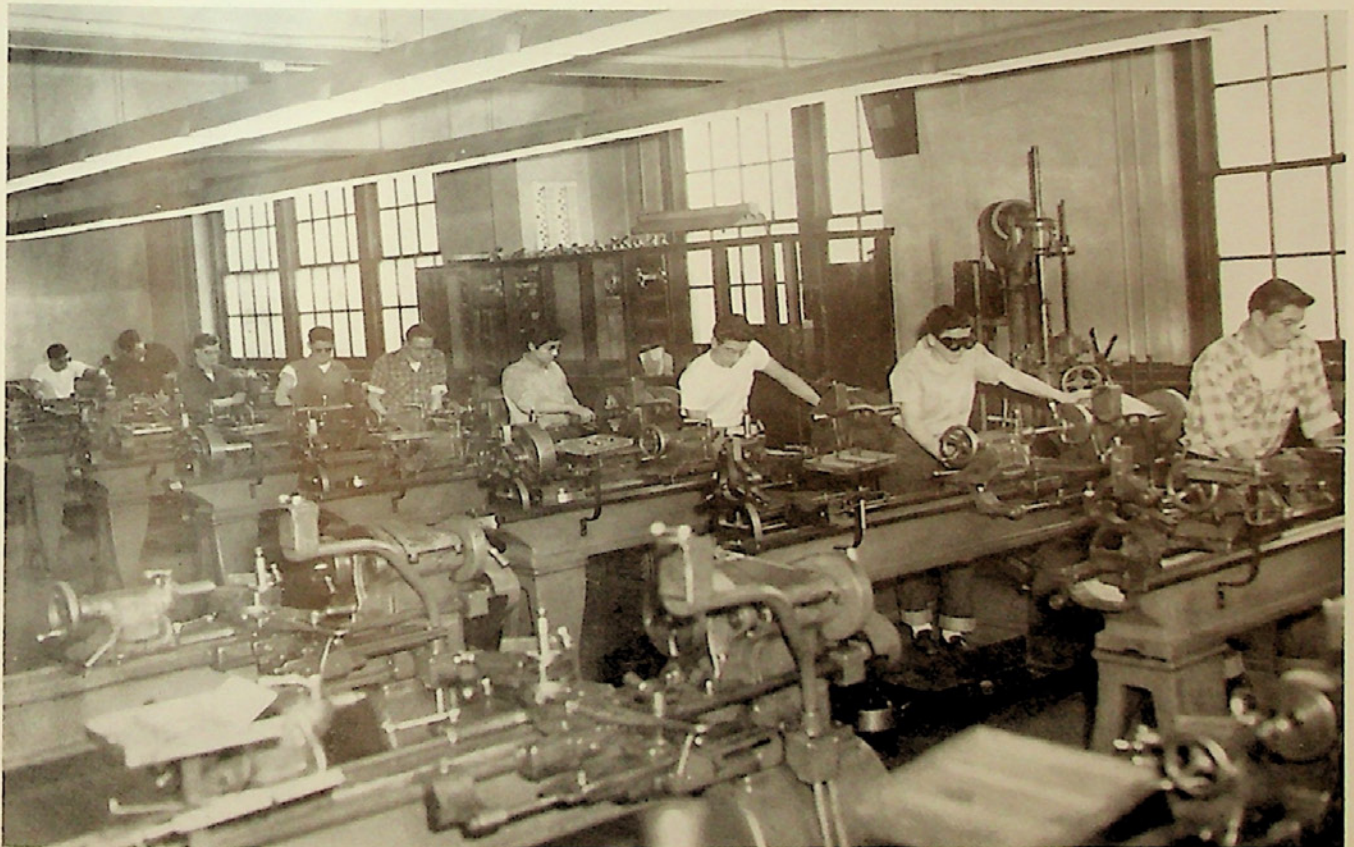
Mr. Ross directs the shop in which there are the lathes, grinding machines, drill presses, and emery wheels. All the grinding, turning down, and filing to be done on the jobs is done here.

Some of the articles made are as follows: tenth grade—plumb bob, center punches, and gear blanks; eleventh grade—clamps, taper socket, and anvils; twelfth grade—lighthouse, spiral gear blanks, and bevel gear blanks.

The other shop, located in the basement, is directed by Mr. J. Van Horn. In it can be found milling machines, shapers, and a boring machine. Here jobs are shaped or milled down to size. Some work is done on mills, drills, reamers, vices, and gears.

At the beginning of each month, the classes exchange shops in order that they may mill or turn down a job to a specific size. At the same time, this will give them experience in learning and knowing how to operate the various machines.

Near the end of the school year, many senior machinists are offered jobs by the Bethlehem Steel Co., Roller-Smith Co., and other nearby industries.



ELECTRICAL SHOP



Instructor.....MR. JOSEPH RISBON

In our world today, electricity plays an important part. In our homes, we have many important electrical appliances such as electric irons, dishwashers, vacuum cleaners, etc. In industry we have many great motors and machines that move by electricity alone. To keep these things in good working condition, we need skilled tradesmen.

At Technical High School, boys selecting this trade are given three years of instruction. In the sophomore year, these boys learn the use of electrical instruments, such as the voltmeter, the ohmmeter, and the ammeter. They are also given the principles of the series and parallel circuits. In the junior year, they study electrical theory of both the A C. and D. C. types of power and then apply it to repair work on motors. The senior year is spent in learning more advanced theory, and in rewinding all types of motors. Some time is also spent making general repairs on equipment around the building.

With this knowledge and training, the boys are then usually prepared to go out into the industrial world and work as apprentice electricians or electricians' helpers.

WOOD SHOP

Instructor.....MR. DON L. DETWILER

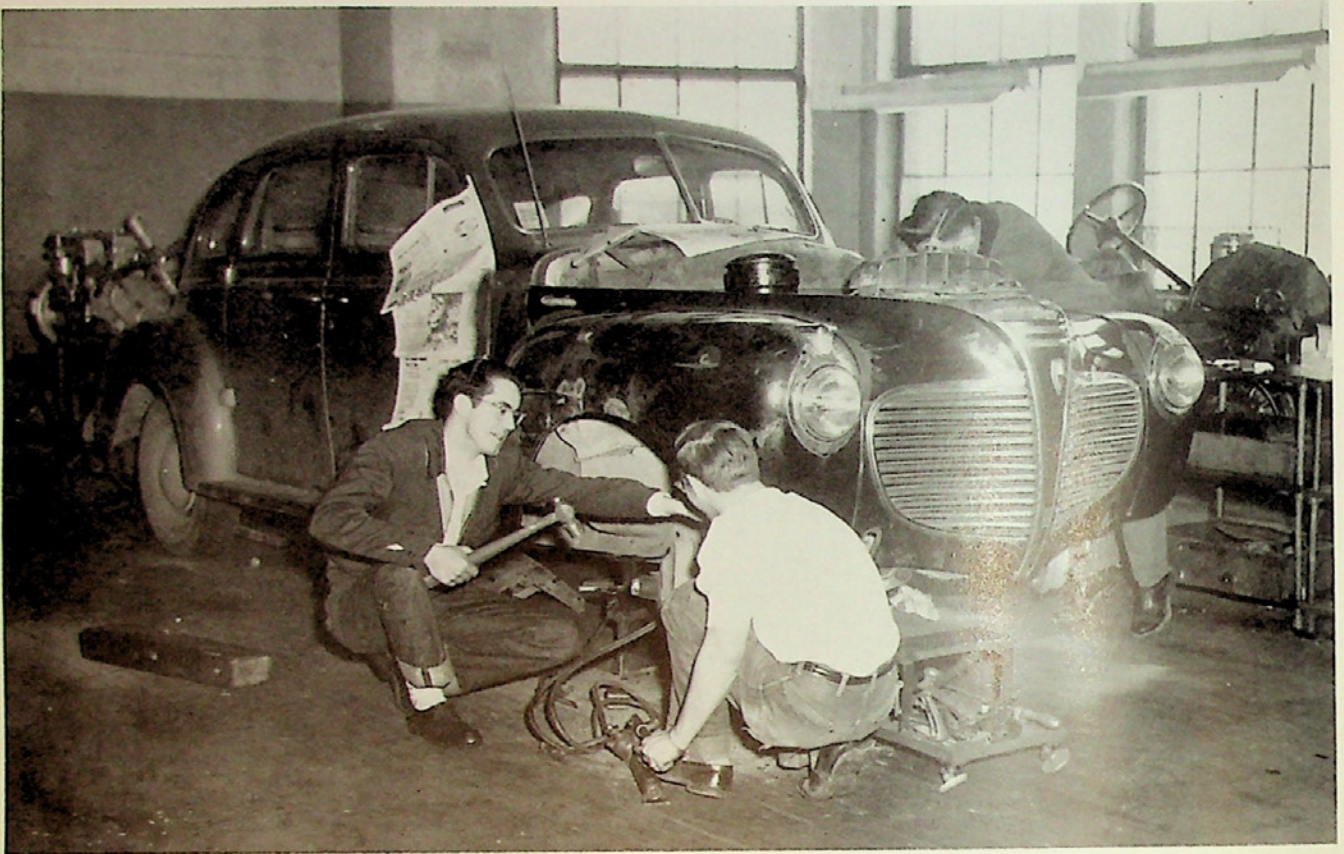
The Woodworking Department, under the direction of Mr. Don L. Detwiler, is one of the most efficient shops at Tech. Due to careful direction, every amount of space is used for storing wood and for working.

In order to gain the experience which is so necessary for the students to have, they go through three phases of preparation. In a student's first year, he learns three basic things; how to recognize different types of wood by their weight, grain, texture, and color; the names of different tools and how to use them; and the different joints used and how to make them. In the junior year, he begins to operate machines such as the power saws, lathes, sanders and drill presses. He learns how to operate these machines safely and how to clean, lubricate, and make simple repairs on them. When he is in the senior year, he assumes the full responsibility of doing most of the outgoings job and of helping the sophomores and juniors.

Much of the work done by the boys is for organizations such as the Red Cross, Salvation Army, Church Groups, Veteran's Hospitals, and other charitable groups.



AUTO SHOP



Instructor MR. JOSEPH VALLONE

Since the automobile plays a vital part in our everyday lives, there is a constant demand for well-trained proficient auto-mechanics. Therefore, any boy who chooses the vocation is virtually assured of a secure high-paid career at the termination of his training.

In the first year in the Auto Shop, the students learn the fundamentals and shop theories. The actual work could not be accomplished without these. They also do minor jobs such as washing and sanding cars.

As the students advance in grades, they are taught the more intricate and detailed phases. Some of these jobs are: engine overhauling, advanced body and chassis work, spraying and painting, overhauling clutches, repairing automatic transmissions, testing circuits, and wiring, and relining brakes.

The shop contains a fine collection of reference and technical books and pamphlets showing the proper methods of using tools and equipment, fundamentals of engines and power transmission, etc. There are also motor manuals for virtually every type of auto manufactured. If a student is in need of references, he has many to which he can turn.

Since there are many different operations to learn, it is impossible for the boys to be trained technicians upon graduation. But nevertheless, Mr. Vallone is doing a good job of teaching all that he can in the limited time allowed.

PRINT SHOP

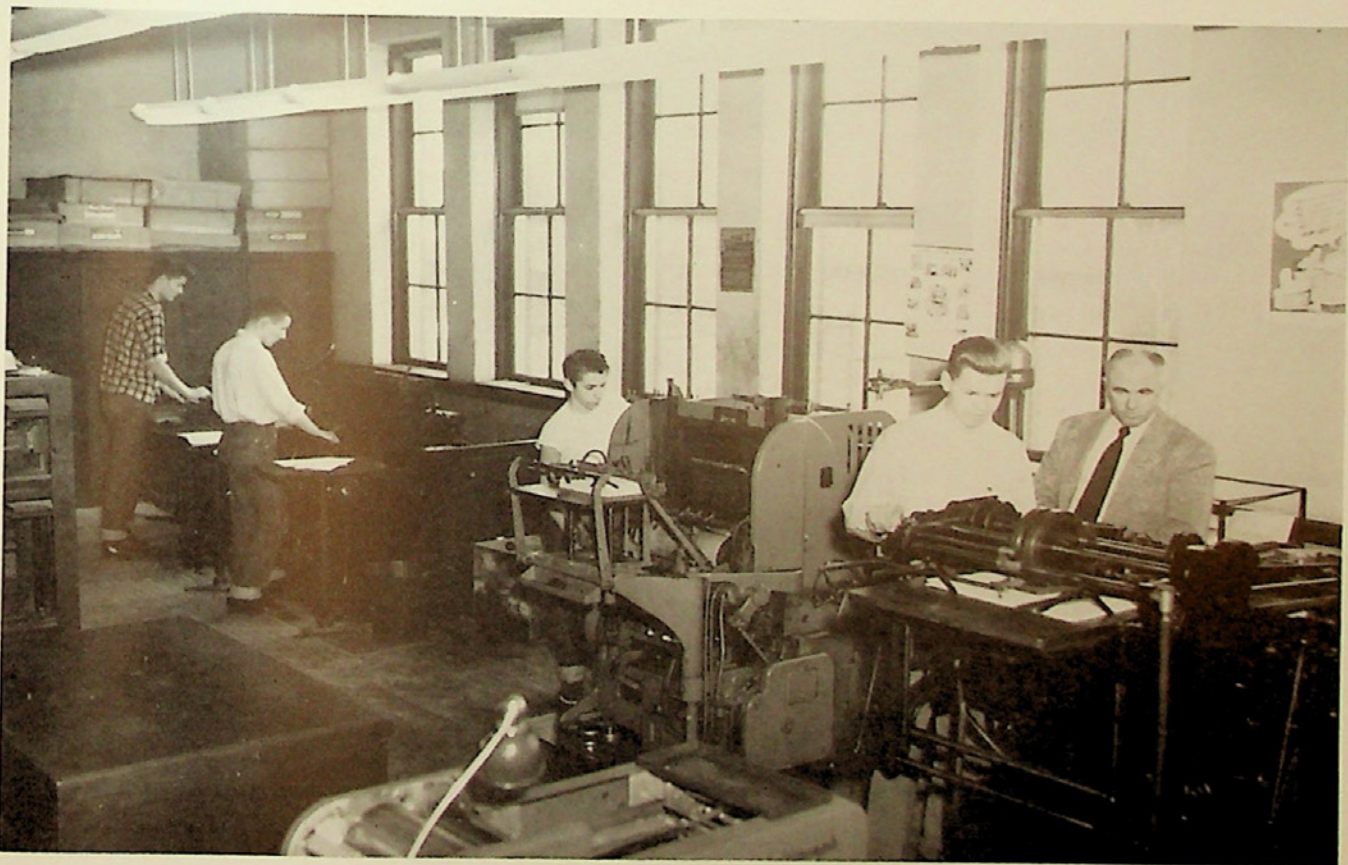
Instructor..... MR. ARCH HUNSINGER

Printing, known as the "Allied Trade," is one of the oldest crafts, and surpasses all in historical background, artistic taste, and in originality. Without printing, industry would not be as far advanced as it is today. If you take a look around, you will see why it is called the "Allied Trade." Printing is the art of assembling type in a systematic fashion in order to reproduce words on paper. It is of great educational value because it increases the study of spelling, punctuation, paragraphing, capitalization, and the art of putting one's expression on paper.

The Print Shop at Tech consists of three rooms; namely, the composing room, the press room, and the bindery room. In the composing room, which contains over two-hundred and fifty cases of type, the job is set up and made ready for the press room. The press room consists of three platen presses for small jobs. It also contains two automatic cylinder presses for the larger forms, and a multigraph for offset forms. After the jobs are printed they go to the bindery room for trimming, perforating, stitching, folding, or drilling. After that, they are packaged and delivered.

Upon completion of this course at the end of three years, the student has attained the basic fundamentals needed to pursue the trade in the way of an apprenticeship.

In the Vocational Department print shop, a great deal of printing is done for elementary schools, junior and senior high schools, and other departments of the school district. The various jobs include small forms such as tickets for school events, sports events, and dances. Also included are memo pads, tardy slips, library overdue notices, schedule cards, and many others. The other larger forms are report cards, announcements, letterheads, programs, school tax duplicates, and curriculum bulletins.



RADIO SHOP



Instructor.....MR. EDWARD D. HARTMAN

Radio is a fascinating medium of communication. It reaches everyone as entertainment, but most important, it is the chief factor of communication in modern warfare and during times of distress.

The Vocational Department Radio Shop is one of the most up-to-date shops in the school. During the course of three years the student studies both the theoretical and the practical phases of radio thoroughly.

The theoretical portion of the course deals with the fundamental principals of radio. Later, the student studies the practical phase of radio, applying the theories he has learned.

After the boy has learned the practice job done in shop, he is given defective radio sets on which to work and repair. Mr. Hartman, the instructor, by working with the boys, tries to teach them everything he has learned about radio. This, however, is only possible if the boys apply themselves in their shop-work and academic studies.

The radio course in the Vocational Department gives the radio student an excellent background in radio repairing. Also, after completing the course, the student's acquired knowledge can be readily applied to a college course in any college offering radio and electronics.

FUTURE CRAFTSMEN OF AMERICA

Adviser.....MR. DAYTON DUBBELING

The Future Craftsmen of America is just what the name implies. It is an organization of boys who will, in the future, become craftsmen in the industrial world.

One of the club's objectives is to increase the boys' knowledge of his trade. It shows him through lectures, books, etc., the opportunities that wait for him as tradesmen in the world around them. It also helps to create a fellowship and understanding between the boys and their trades.

The other objective is to make boys more proficient on the job. This is done through various work projects done for local charitable organizations. On these projects, the boys do the work respective of their trades; therefore they have a chance to become more skillful.

The club had declined after the World War II but, under the able guidance of Mr. Dubbeling, it is now a robust, energetic organization.

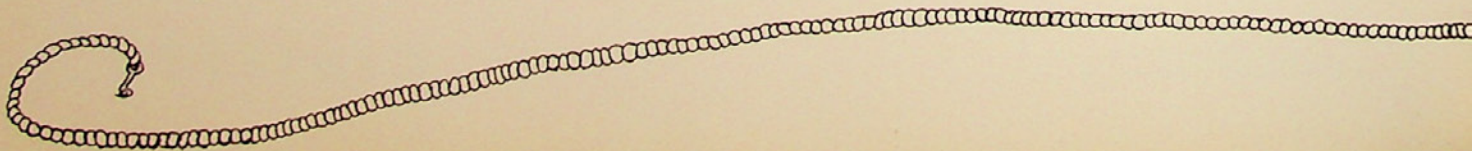

Easton again bowed to the Hurricane, this time by a 54-49 score, before Central Catholic repeated their win over the Bethlehem Cagers, 72-71.

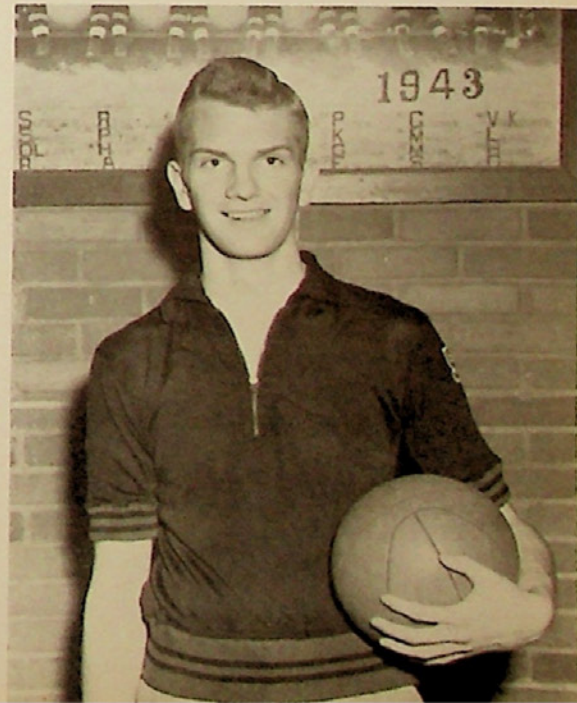

The Bethlehem High Cagers next defeated Reading 72-58, before again being beaten by a power-packed Allentown team, 65-67.

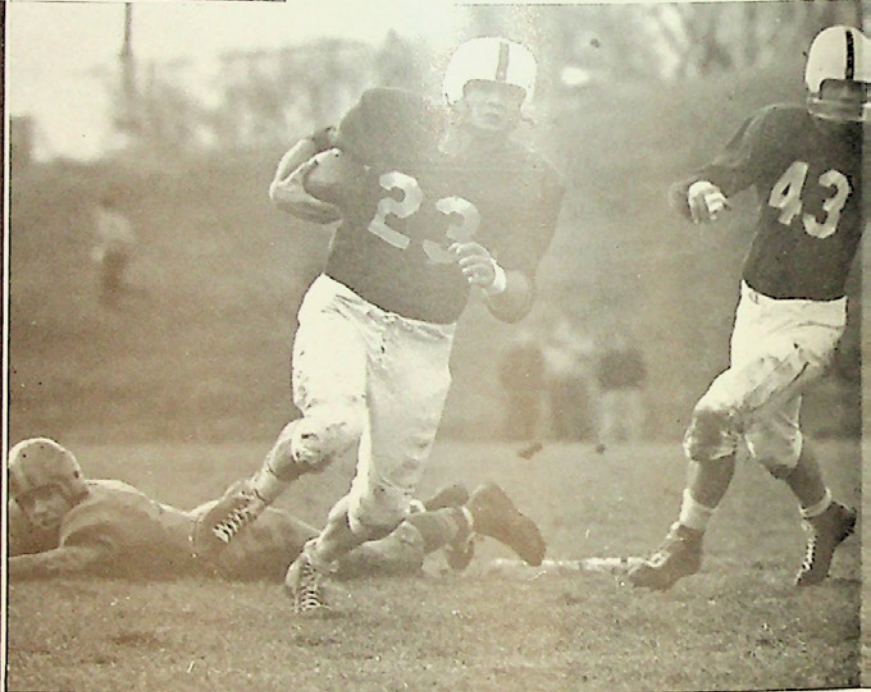
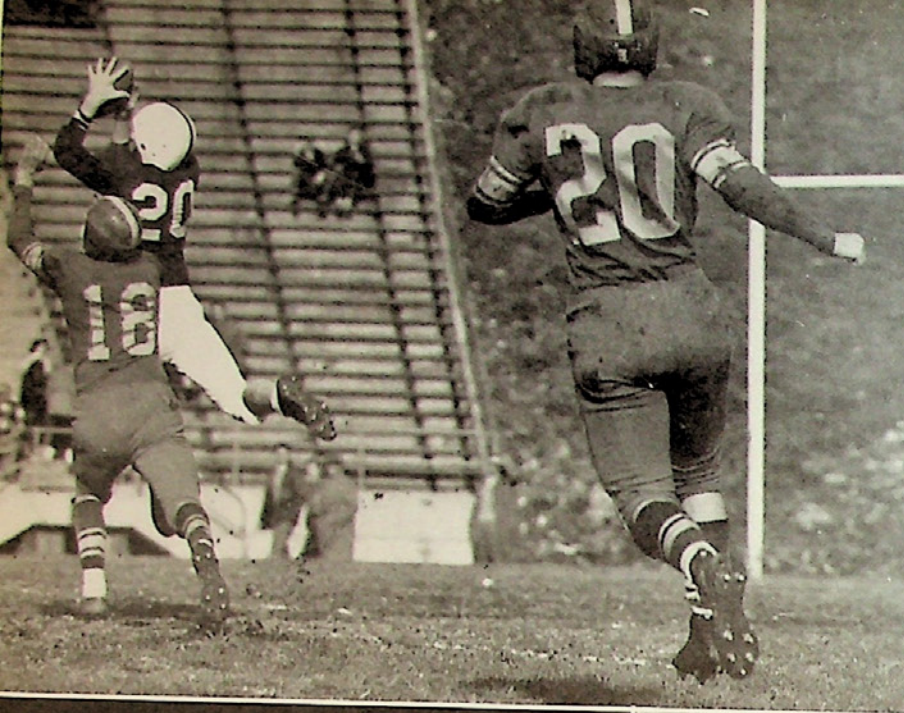

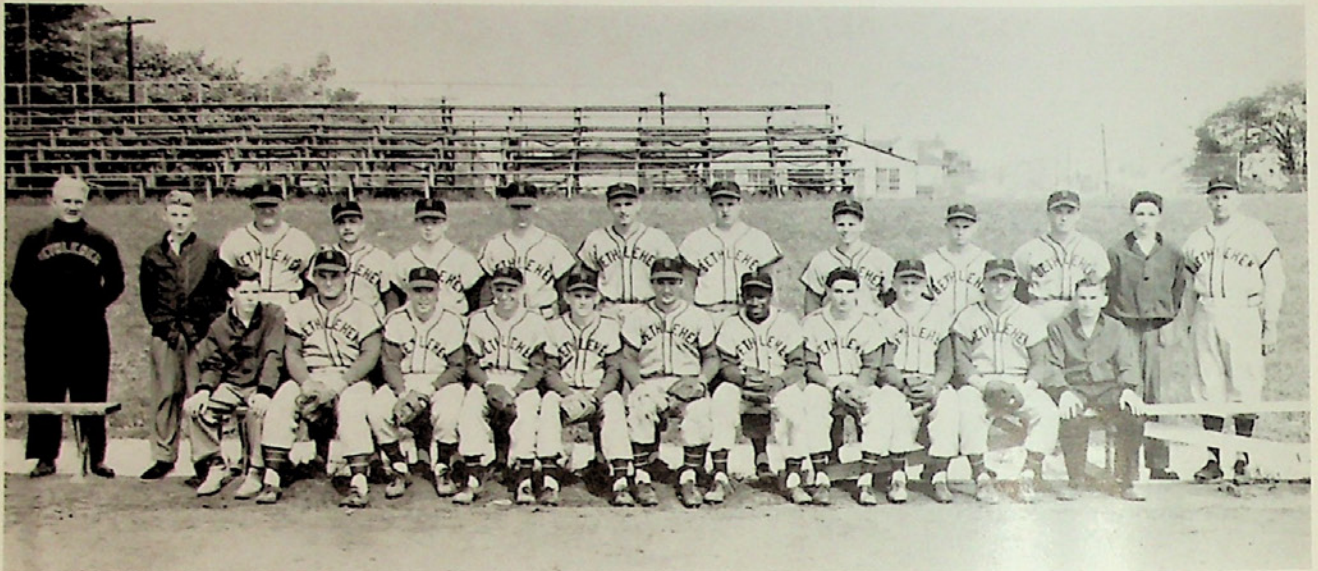

Northampton and Nazareth completed a successful season for the matmen, losing to Bethlehem by scores of 23-19 and 29-13 respectively.

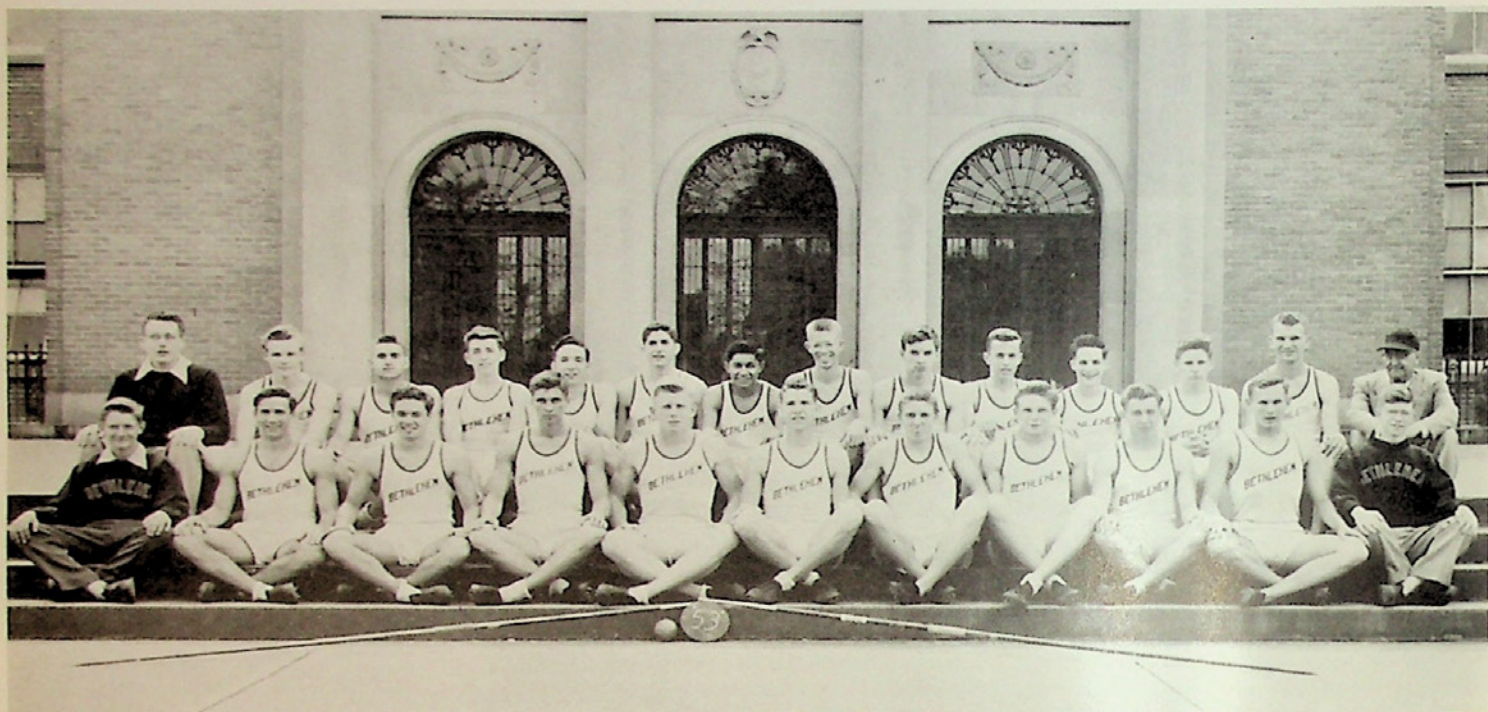

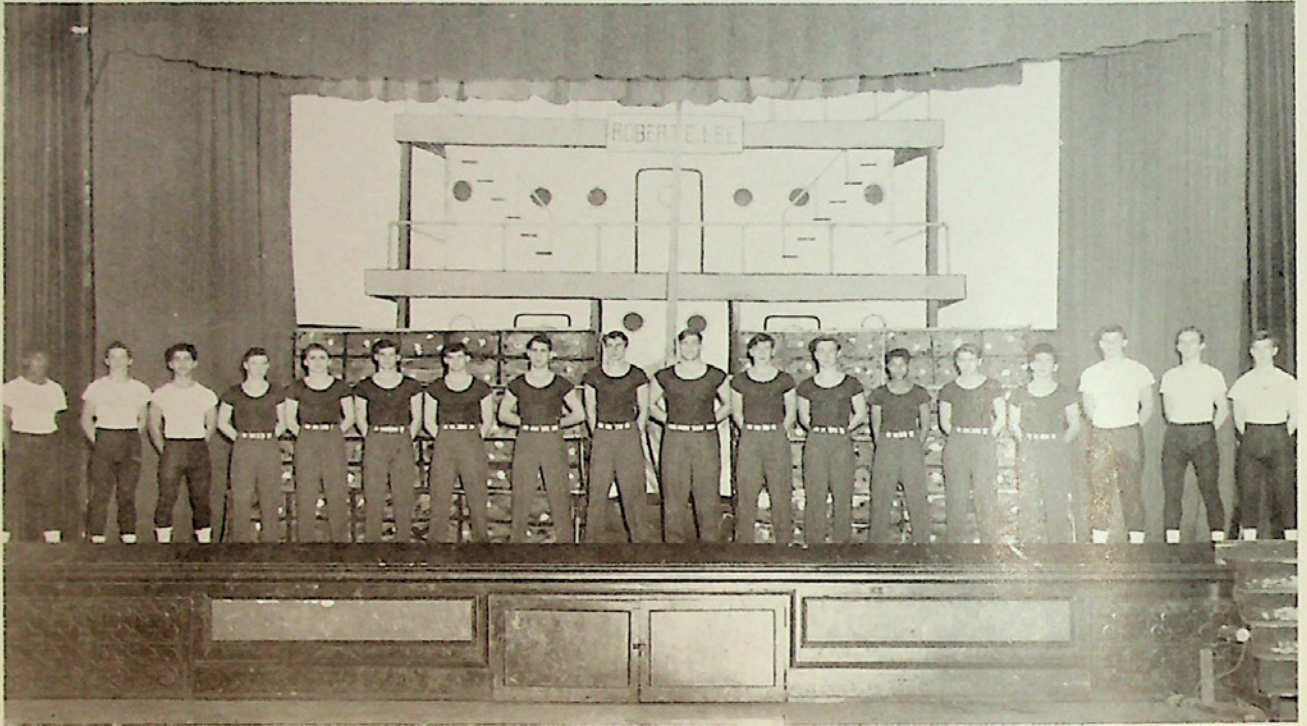
Other positions will be filled by Dan Simon, Kit Illick, Bill Scheirer, and Bob Bauder.

The bowling league at Liberty High School was established four years ago. Each year many enthusiastic bowlers are anxious to enter the organization.

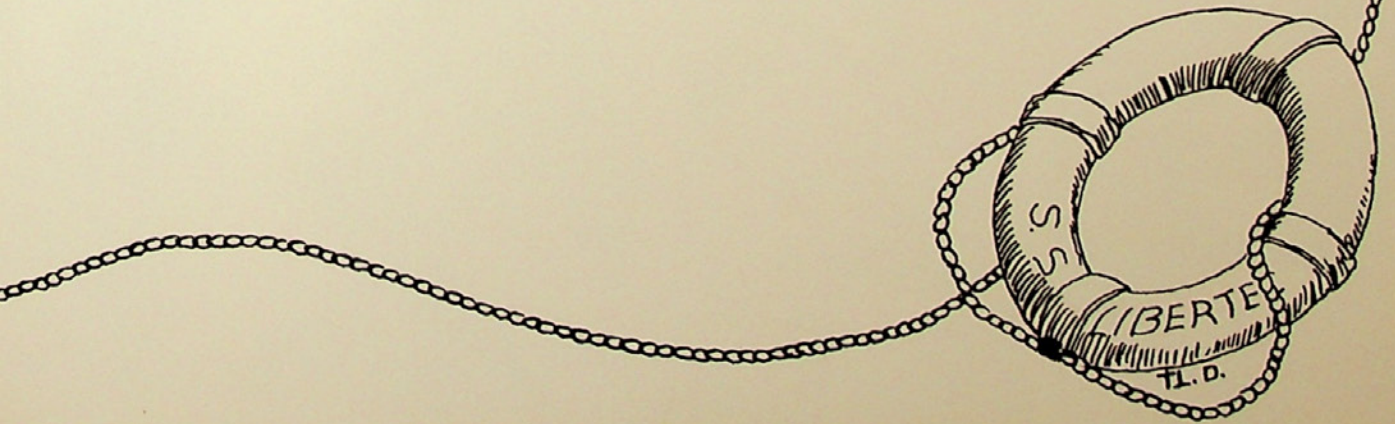

After three weeks of orientation and practice, teams were formed. Not only did the teams try to win the pennant, but also each girl tried very hard to win top honors in the league.

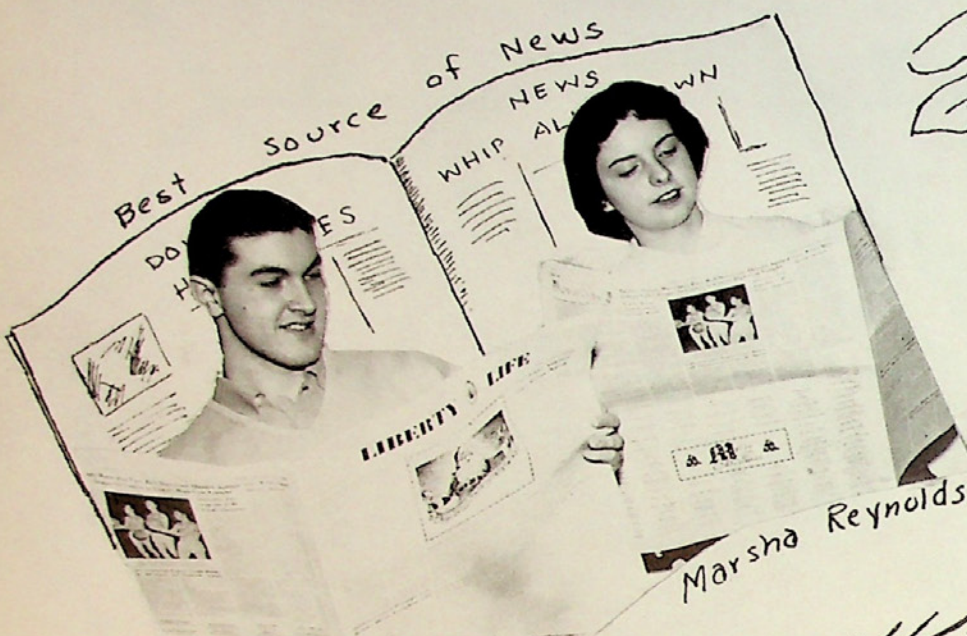

TECH CLASS PROPHECY

The year is 1984 and I, Richard Stofko, am about to embark on a trip to Europe. As Secretary of State it is my job to establish friendly relations with foreign nations. For this reason I am making this "Good Will" tour.

I arrived in New York City a few days before my trip was to begin and stayed at the La Bar Hotel which is owned and operated by my old classmate Justin La Bar. On the ship's deck we were greeted by its captain, Joseph Horvath and his officers. The ship, The Techson, was designed by Zenon Wasylciw and built by the Czipoth-Tulio Ship Builders Company.

I spent my first day on the Atlantic on the ship's sun-deck going over the documents which I was carrying. I was deeply engrossed in my work when a sudden burst of laughter filled the air. The laughter came from a couple who were lounging in the chairs at the far end of the sun-deck. Recognizing the man to be Fred Packard, I went over to join them. I was surprised to find that they were on their way to France to spend their honeymoon. Fred said that his business, The Always Tilt Pin-Ball Machines, had kept him so busy that he never got around to marrying till now. We talked about old times for over an hour before I returned to my chair. On the way, I meet John Kozauer who was going to visit the land of his birth, Germany. He told me that he was a machinist in the Bethlehem Steel Company and that he had been saving money for the trip for the past twenty-five years. I wished him an enjoyable trip and returned to my chair. I spent the rest of the day there undisturbed.

That evening I ate supper at the captain's table. The food, which was prepared under the direction of the ship's chef, Vincent Riestra, was superb. I also enjoyed the entertainment which was provided throughout the evening by the ship's orchestra under the direction of Robert Garcia. I was very happy to see that a few of the orchestra members were old school friends of mine. There was Frank Csaszar playing the saxophone, George Balent with his squeeze-box, and David Harpel plucking away at the guitar.

After we had finished our supper, Captain Horvath took me around to the other tables in the dining room and introduced me to some of the passengers. Among these successful people were some of my high school classmates. There was Roger Zimmerman who was a foreign correspondent for the New York Times. At another table I found Bill Reiser and his associates, Roger Conrad and Richard Free. They were going to Spain in an effort to secure some contracts for the Bethlehem Steel Company. Richard Siegfried and Charles Schortz, two Hess Brothers' buyers, were also present in the dining room. They were going to Paris to purchase some of the latest fashions. I also met Mr. and Mrs. William L. Henry who were going to France for their vacation. Bill had been a prosperous Cadillac dealer in Philadelphia for many years.

The following morning the ship's first-mate, Alexander MacWilliam, took me on a tour of the ship. First we went to the engine room where I saw an atomic powered engine for the first time. Busy at the controls of this powerful motor were Johnny Kostalis and Pete Lambert. Next, I was taken to the radio room where Robert Hornak was stationed. Bobby gave me a general outline of what his duties as radio operator were, and then he gave me the earphones so that I could hear the calls that were going out from other ships in the area. We then went on to the kitchen which prepared the food for the passengers and crew alike. Its size and cleanliness were overwhelming. I would never believe it if I had not seen it. There were at least a dozen cooks and a score or more of butchers, potato peelers, dish washers, etc. at work there. As I was walking around the large room, I noticed a familiar figure bent over a huge pot. As I drew nearer to the figure, I recognized it to be none other than that of Louie Xenophon. He was fully engrossed in the task of making chicken soup for the afternoon dinner. Next, I was taken to the observation tower where my old friend Harry Ziegenfuss was at watch. It was his job to report any ships or planes in the vicinity to the captain or the first-mate. He let me look through the binoculars, but I didn't see anything but water. The ship was scheduled to reach England at two o'clock that afternoon; so after we completed the tour of the ship, I went to my cabin to prepare to disembark.

We arrived in London's port on schedule. Before going ashore, I commended the captain for the congenial hospitality he displayed throughout the voyage. Waiting to greet me on the pier was our ambassador to England, James P. Maloney, and a number of English officials. I was taken to the American Embassy where the staff was eagerly awaiting to hear the instructions that I had brought for them. When I arrived at the Embassy, the doorman stationed there opened the car door for me, and as I stepped out I was surprised to find the doorman to be Robert Stahler. I spent the remainder of the day at the Embassy going over the instructions with the staff. The following morning I visited the Prime Minister of England and in the afternoon I was the guest of the King and Queen. The remainder of my stay in London was taken up by appearances at political meetings and visits with English officials.

After a week's stay in England, I boarded a Bowman Air Lines Constellation and flew to France. From France I went on to Germany, Italy, Yugoslavia, Greece, and finally Turkey. In each of these countries, I went through the same routine of political appearances, instructing Embassy Staffs, and being the guest of various officials of the particular country I was visiting. By this time I was quite eager to get back to the United States so I decided to make the trip by airplane instead of by ship as had been previously planned.

The air liner on which I made my return trip was another of those owned by Warren Bowman. Through years of tedious work, he had built for himself the largest international air lines in the world. The pilot of the plane was that "space cadet" from way back, Manuel Ruiz. We made the twelve-hour flight without incident and landed at the La Guardia Air Field at eight o'clock on the evening of June Fifth — five days ahead of my scheduled arrival.

From New York I took another plane to Washington, D.C. When I reached Washington I went straight to the President, Norman Zoltack, to make my report of the tour. The following day I appeared before Congress to suggest what policies to follow in our dealings with those nations which I had visited. After the session with Congress, I was given permission to go home to visit my family in Bethlehem. President Zoltack said that since I had returned from my tour before schedule, it would not do any harm if I went home for a few days.

I left Washington by train early that evening. The conductor on the train was my old friend Smokey Pierson. I talked to him for a few minutes and he said that he had a number of jobs, but none of them were as pleasant as this one. He also told me that the engineer of this train was our old classmate, Gordon Gress. I arrived in Bethlehem at ten o'clock that evening and was met at the station by my brother, Ronald. He took me home where the rest of the family was waiting and we had a joyous reunion which lasted until two o'clock in the morning.

The following morning as I was eating breakfast, I turned on the radio and tuned in the local station. The voice that came through was that of my old friend, Robert Donchez. He was the sports caster for WGPA. After his program, I left for town to get a haircut.

While walking on Fourth Street, I noticed a sign which read, "Mingora's Meat Market." I entered the store and found just what I expected — Gipper with his meat cleaver doing a nice job on a side of beef. We got into a conversation which would have lasted all day had I not told him that I was going to the barber. He told me that only two blocks farther down the street, our old friend Louie Banuelos had a barber shop. So, I left the store and went to Louie's Barber Shop for my haircut.

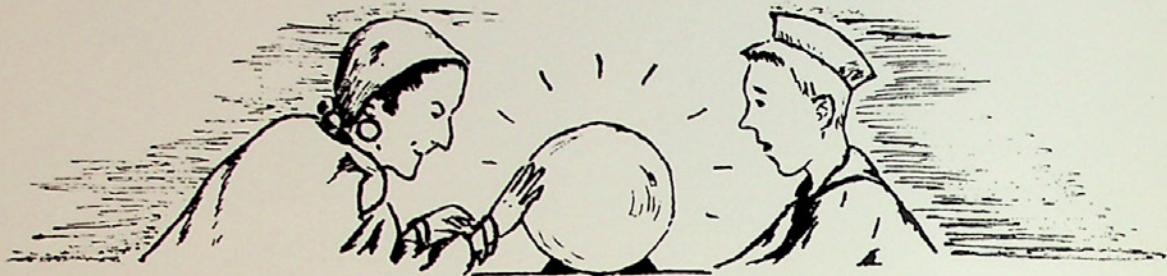

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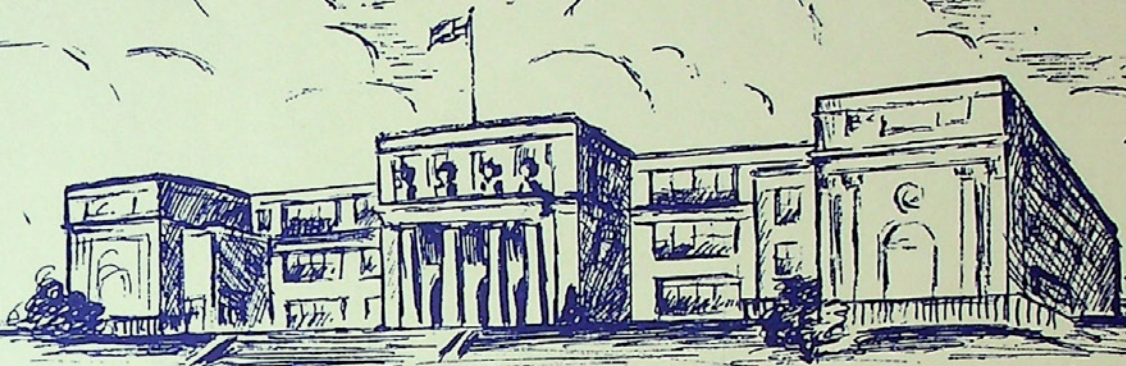
