War Department Says Corp. Horvath Prisoner Of Japs

A mother's heart—made heavy last Mother's Day when a telegram from the War Department announced her son was "missing in action" in the Philippines—was gladdened to some extent this week.

A second communication from the War Department, coming almost a year after the first cast its pall of gloom over the household of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Horvath, 821 Carlton ave., informed the mother that Corp. Charles Horvath was a "prisoner of war" in the Philippines.

Corp. Horvath has been in service with the Marines for more than five years. His parents had not heard from him for two years and knew nothing of his fate until the War Department's letter arrived several days ago.
