Northampton Soldier's Picture Appears on Poster

While motoring between Allentown and his home the other day, Carl O. Shoemaker, of Northampton, a salesman, saw a face he recognized as that of Sgt. John Seier, son of Mr. and Mrs. Paul Seier, 1637 Main Street, Northampton, looking down upon him from a group of four figures—Jeanette MacDonald, movie singing star; a soldier, sailor and marine.

Startled, Shoemaker took a second look and then went to the Seier home and told the young man's sister Agnes, of what he had discovered. She, in turn, told the parents who upon investigation found the facts to be true.

Sgt. Seier is a member of the Army Air Force and is at Glendale, Calif. He and the sailor and marine were selected to pose with Miss MacDonald during a visit to Hollywood's Canteen. They were told their picture would appear on posters throughout the country, but they didn't believe it.

Two other Seier boys are in the armed forces: Paul Jr., a veteran of six years in the Navy, is in Australian waters, and Frank, believed to be in Alaska with the Army.
