Killed in Action



Sergeant Harry Booth, 25-year-old paratrooper, was killed in action in Germany, March 24, five years to the day that he enlisted in the service of his country. Mrs. Ella Stark, maternal aunt, received a War Department telegram Wednesday, stating that Sgt. Booth was missing in action. It was followed by another telegram yesterday, announcing his death. Mr. and Mrs. P. J. Tierney received the last letter written by him on March 11. Sgt. Booth was stationed at Pearl Harbor for three years prior to arriving in the European theatre last August His mother was the late Mrs. Cora Stiefle Booth. Surviving are two brothers, Arthur, with the U. S. Navy, stationed in Washington, D. C., and Richard, in Easton; and one stepbrother, Warren, in Quakertown.
