Wounded Local Soldier Dies On Troopship

Enroute to the United States, Private Peter A. Fodor, 18, seriously wounded on July 8, while participating in one of the engagements on French soil, died on Aug. 10, aboard a troopship. This information was embodied in a telegram from the War Department, received by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Louis Fodor, of 1533 East Seventh Street.

Arrangements have been made to have the body shipped from Charleston, S. C., to this city for burial.

A graduate of Washington Junior High School, and a former employe of the Bethlehem Steel Company, he was inducted into the armed forces on Nov. 16, 1943. Following a training at Camp Blanding, Fla., he was transferred to Fort George G. Meade, thence overseas, leaving this country on May 1 of this year.

Besides his parents, he is survived by a brother, Louis, and a sister, Margaret, both at home. He was a member of St. John Capistrano's parish.
