Operations. Sgt. Mulzet flew 11 missions against German targets before the final capitulation of the enemy. These attacks against communica-tions centers, bridges, railroad yards and fuel stores were designed to break down the enemy's strength immediately ahead of forward troops troops.

troops. The sergeant entered the service in August, 1943, and received train-ing at the Army Air Forces school for aviation mechanics at Golds-bero, N.
