## Kirkpatrick Now Reported Nazi Prisoner

Pfc. George F. Kirkpatrick, son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert M. Kirkpatrick, 115 East Broad Street, who had been reported missing in the Netherlands, October 25, is now a prisoner of the German government, according to three letters received by his parents.

The letters dated November 5 and 11 and December 12 were all received this week. They stated he is well and in a hospital in Germany recuperating from a leg wound suffered October 25 when he was hit by a machine gun bullet. The day following he was picked up by a German medical corpsman.

Pfc. Kirkpatrick served with the infantry in France and Belgium before being reported missing. He entered the service in June, 1943, and received basic training at Camp Walters, Tex. He was assigned to an ASTP course at Princeton, N. J., for a period; then sent to Camp Carson, Colo. He went overseas in August, 1944.

Prior to entering the service he was graduated from Liberty High School and Bethlehem Business College and was attending Moravian College for Men at the time of his induction. A brother, Ensign Robert M. Kirkpatrick Jr., is stationed at San Diego, Calif.
