Fortunato Boys Meet on German Road

Two American jeeps passing on a busy German road stopped with a great screeching of brakes as two excited infantrymen piled out with the excited cry "Hi, Brother." This was the recent experience of First Lieutenant Frank and Second Lieutenant Raymond Fortunato, sons of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Fortunato, of 1724 Elm Street.

The last time the two brothers had heard from each other was when Raymond was confined to a hospital after having been wounded in action December 13. He had been in the hospital for 72 days and had only recently returned to action as regimental liaison officer when he took the jeep ride which resulted in a meeting with his brother.

The two jeeps were ambling along

in different directions in a most impersonal manner when all at once two sets of eyes met and the resulting scramble for a brief ten-minute reunion. "The time was short," the boys reported to their parents, "but it was sure swell."

Lieut. Frank has been in the army the past three years and has been overseas since July. Lieut. Raymond has been in the service two years and has been overseas since October.
