Sgt. Peter Keblesh Takes Air Crew Course

STROTHER ARMY AIR FIELD, Kan.—Tech. Sgt. Peter Keblesh, son of Mrs. Barbara Keblesh, 903 Fernwood Street, Bethlehem, Pa., has been selected for air crew (pilot, navigator or bombardier) training as an aviation student and is now awaiting orders to report for the pre-flight phase of his cadet training.

Enlisted men of the Army Air Corps now have the opportunity to enter flying as aviation students, keeping their rank and drawing flying time pay. In these two respects they are different from aviation cadets. However, both aviation students and aviation cadets have the same things to gain—commissions and silver wings.

A graduate of Liberty High School in Bethlehem, Tech. Sgt. Keblesh had a year in the United States Coast Artillery before he transferred to the Army Air Corps. He came to Strother Field from the Enid, Okla., Army Air Field to become a flight chief, a position he now fills.
