**Jeter Avenue Soldier  
One of B-24 Bomber  
Group With Top Record**

M-Sgt. Henry O. Albright, son of Mrs. Alma H. Cook, 1005 Jeter Avenue, serves as an airplane crew chief for a B-24 Liberator group based in southern Italy, who on their 300th combat mission struck a Nazi held railroad viaduct at Avisio, Italy, on the important Brenner Pass route.

This enviable record established in over two years of overseas operations, now finds this group one of the indestructible links in the powerful chain of the 15th AAF Bombing Forces.

If the figure 300 doesn't look too impressive to the reader, possibly these figures will be more convincing. On the average, an operational mission was flown every other day. In that time 13,000 tons of bombs were dropped on enemy targets; roughly 15,000,000 gallons of gas were used to transport 6,163 B-24's over 10,000,000 miles.
