Frank Nemeth, Overseas Vet, To Head Local Amvets Group

Frank Nemeth, a veteran of the first air raids on the Polesi oil fields and the first air raid on Rome, was elected post commander of Local Post No. 1, American Veterans of World War II, at a meeting held last evening in the Fountain Room of Hotel Bethlehem. F. L. Williams, national organizer of Washington, D. C., presided.

Other officers elected are: Vincent Deuca, vice-commander; John F. Schrott, adjutant; Michael Zumas, finance officer; Walter R. Hoffert, provost marshal; and Edward Weisenberg, public relations officer. Also attending the meeting was Joseph Duhig, post commander of the Allentown post.

The Bethlehem post is the eighth post to be organized in Pennsyl-

vania. To date posts have been organized in 39 states and state departments have been organized in 14 of these states.

Membership in the organization is open to all veterans of World War II, who have seen service since September 16, 1940. This qualifies all nurses and members of the women's branches of the various services.

The national headquarters of the Amvets is located in Dallas, Tex., and the national commander is Elmo Keel, Washington, D. C., who was a master sergeant serving in the China-Burma area.

The next meeting of the group will be held March 8, at 8 p. m., in Hotel Bethlehem. All veterans of World War II are invited to attend.
