Area Men Enlist For Army Duty

Sergeant Gerald E. White, in charge of the U. S. Army recruiting station at the South Side Post Office Building, today announced the enlistments of eight residents of Bethlehem and vicinity.

One of the men, Pfc. Edmond P. Enright, 31, son of Mrs. Blanche Enright, 322 Water Street, reenlisted. He will see service in the Air Corps. He had four and one-half years service with the Air Corps during World War 2 and saw action in the European theatre. He was honorably discharged on October 5.

Others who enlisted in the Air Corps are Fernando D. Larenas, 19, son of Mrs. Maria L. Larenas, Mexico City, Mexico; Richard W. Rice, 18, grandson of Mrs. Daisy Rice, Bethlehem R. D. 2, and Gerald V. Nesfeeder, 17, son of Mr. and Mrs. Victor Nesfeeder, Nazareth R. D. 2. The former was an employe of the Bethlehem Steel Company; Rice was a gasoline station attendant and Nesfeeder was a farm hand.
