Loring Lane Dies on German Battlefront

Second Lieutenant Loring Lane, U. S. Army, husband of Mrs. Catherine (Rafetto) Lane, Center and Fairview Streets, Nazareth, was killed in action on December 23, in Germany, according to information received on Wednesday by his wife, through channels of the International Red Cross. An official telegram, received on January 2, listed him as missing in action.

He graduated from Lehigh University in 1940, with a B. S. degree in business administration. Of the 3452 Lehigh men, graduates and undergraduates who joined the armed forces, 103 have made the supreme sacrifice.

A native of Brooklyn, N. Y., his address, according to the university files, was 395 Washington Avenue, and before entering his country's service, was engaged in a sales promotion course with the R. H. Macy Company, New York City.

He trained at Camp Breckenridge, Ky., and Camp Van Dorn, Miss., and was sent overseas about four months ago. Wounded in action some time ago, he was awarded the Purple Heart.

His wife, alumnae secretary of the Moravian College for Women, presently resides with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Herbert Rafetto, at Nazareth.
