Local Soldier Loses Life on Italian Front

NOV 27 1944

Pfc. George P. L. Rowe, husband of Viva V. (Kehley) Rowe of 318 Vineyard Street, was killed in action "somewhere in Italy," on Nov. 4, according to a telegram from the War Department, received this morning by his wife.

He enlisted in the combat forces on May 8, 1942, and received his training at army camps in Texas,

Georgia and Missouri, and was sent overseas about five months ago.

A graduate of Liberty High School, he was a member of Grace Lutheran Church, and was affiliated with Harry F. W. Johnson Post No. 379, American Legion. Before his enlistment he was an employe of the

Bethlehem Steel Company.

He is survived by his wife, a daughter Lucille, his mother, Mrs. George Younger of 64 West Raspberry Street, and the following sisters and brothers: Mrs. Earl Laub, Mrs. Norman Trapp, Mrs. Russell Carey, Mrs. Ralph Carey, Pauline, Helen, Martha Younger and William Younger, all of Bethlehem; Pfc.
