## Lt. R. P. Fortunato Earns Bronze Star For Service in ETO

The award was made for "meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy from Dec. 3, 1942, to April 6, 1945."

Fortunato worked considerably long hours, under the most adverse conditions: he led numerous patrols without regard for his own safety.
