Seidersville **Youth Dies** In Battle

Kervin, nineteen year old son of Mrs. Alice Kervin, of Seidersville, was killed in action "somewhere in France", on June 14, according to information embodied in a telegram from the War De-partment, received this morning by his mother. His father was killed some time ago in an accident on Wyandotte Street.

forces on February 25, 1943, and fol-lowing a four months training period at Camp Wheeler, Ga., he was sent to Africa, participating in engage-ments in that theatre of war, Tu-nisia, Casablanca and Sicily. From the latter place he was sent to Eng-land and took part in the invasion of France. He has been overseas since July 1943. He never had a fur-lough. Before being inducted into the armed forces, he was an em-ploye of the Bethlehem Steel Com-pany.

pany. Besides his mother he is survived by two brothers, Charles and Rob-ert, both at home. He was a mem-ber of the Lutheran wing of Jerusalem Church.
