Donald Lillie at Present With Medical Service at Bethesda, Md.

Donald Lillie, chief pharmacist mate, U. S. Navy, a former resident of this city, was a visitor at the home of Mr. and Mrs. David Prosser, 623 East North Street, over the past weekend. Mr. Lillie was a member of the medical staff of the Bethlehem Steel Company until the outbreak of the present war. He joined the company in 1936 and when he enlisted was employed in the cots accounting department.

Mr. Lillie is at present head of the medical school in the new Navy medical center at Bethesda, Md., where he is specializing in X-ray. He is a veteran Navy man, having served a hitch from 1930 to 1936, during which time he was on the medical staff of the Secretary of War. He travelled as representative of President Roosevelt through Japan and China and was in the Philippines when Quezon was inaugurated as president.

In 1933 he was on the medical staff sent to Cuba with the U. S. Marines during the revolution which saw Sergeant Batista (now president of the republic) overthrow the rule of President Machado.

He is a native of Grand Rapids, Mich., and while here was a member of the Church of the Nativity congregation.
