J. G. Meyer, Jr. **Dies On French** Battlefield

The first war casualty from Miller Heights was reported when Mrs. Joseph G. Meyer, Jr., received a telegram from the War Depart-ment informing her of her hus-band's death in France, November 12 12.

12. Pfc. Meyer was attached tor a medical detachment with the 359th Infantry and was overseas since July. He entered the Army in May of 1941, and served at many bases in this country prior to going overseas.
