Reported "Missing"

Pvt. Earl Frankenfield, 28, son of Abraham Frankenfield, Nazareth Pike, is "missing in action somewhere in Africa," according to word received by his brother, Edward S. Frankenfield, 224 West Goepf Street.

The shocking notice was received in the form of a telegram from a sister, Mrs. Ida Armor, Boston, Mass., who was notified by the War Department. Mrs. Armor stated in her brief message that final particulars are expected to be received shortly.

Pvt. Frankenfield was drafted about a year ago in Wayne, Pa., where he was connected with a fish marketing establishment. The missing soldier left Bethlehem five years ago. During his residence here he was employed for a time by the Bethlehem Steel Company. He attended Neisser School.

Besides his father and brother, he is survived by three sisters, Mrs. Stanley Vincent, Nazareth Pike; Mrs. Hilda Nemetz, Caverton, Pa., and Mrs. Armor, Boston, Mass.
